SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER


"Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, 'Peace be with you.'" This greeting from the resurrected Christ must have been a profound one for the disciples. They were living behind locked doors "for fear of the Jews," which really meant for fear of their own lives. They had seen what happened to Jesus and didn't want to face the same fate. Imagine the paralysis of this fear, keeping them locked inside a prison of their own making.

But even the walls and the locks could not keep Jesus out! He came "although the doors were locked" and brought them a message of peace. And then their fear turned to gladness for they "rejoiced when they saw the Lord."

This transformation from sadness to joy, from fear to peace was not just a gift for these first disciples. It is a gift for all of the followers of the Lord, ourselves included! When we are afraid of what might happen in our lives, where we are trapped or paralyzed by the burdens of our own habitual sins, Jesus wants to step in and offer us peace. This is what we celebrate today on this feast of the mercy of Christ. His love and peace, the gift of His mercy, is meant for all of us, weak, sinful, and scared though we may be.

And we who receive this great gift of mercy from the Lord are also called to be merciful to others. We are called to be peacemakers and to forgive others as we have been forgiven. Our celebration of Divine Mercy need not stop at the doors of our own hearts. We can seek ways to be ministers of God's mercy to others, reaching out with the love of God, bringing comfort and consolation to those who need it most.

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

St. Augustine once said, and as our Children's and Youth Choirs reminded us on Easter, "*We are an Easter people, and 'Alleluia' is our song.*" I would like to thank so many who participated in the liturgies of Holy Week, beginning with the solemn rites of Palm Sunday, the Holy Thursday Liturgy of the Lord's Last Supper, the Solemn Liturgy of Good Friday, the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday, leading up to the festive liturgies of Easter Sunday. My gratitude goes especially to those who served as ushers, lectors, extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist, acolytes, cantors, our Adult, Youth, and Children's Choirs, instrumentalists, sacristans, those who helped decorate our worship space, those who participated in the Holy Thursday Ritual Washing of the Feet, and all who worked quietly behind the scenes. Thank you for your participation in the liturgies of Holy Week and Easter!

A priest presider at these liturgies has a unique vantage point where he is able to observe you and your faces - filled with deep faith, obvious hope, and powerful love - during each of the Holy Week liturgies. Permit me to capsule a few moments:

- ~ *Beginning with the Palm Sunday liturgy, the Blessing of Palms, proclamation of the gospel, and procession into the church to begin Holy Week;*
- ~ *the look of anticipation on the faces of twelve parishioners, both women and men, youth and "seasoned" during the Holy Thursday liturgy as they participated in the ritual Washing of Feet;*
- ~ *the solemn Eucharistic procession through the church to the chapel repository, with many of our children preparing for First Eucharist carrying candles and joining in the procession;*
- ~ *the moving and solemn singing of "Gethsemene" by **Jeannette Berretta** as the altar was stripped;*
- ~ *the entire congregation coming forth on Good Friday to venerate the cross, some with tears in their eyes, with no two people venerating the cross the same way, but all with the same faith and deep reverence of the loving sacrifice Christ made for each of us on the cross;*
- ~ *sitting in a darkened church and listening attentively as the Easter Vigil unfolded with the proclamation of seven Old Testament readings, all serving as a reminder to us of the depth of salvation history;*
- ~ *anticipating the singing of the first Easter "Alleluia"; having fasted from that word the entire Lenten season'*
- ~ *the great anticipation on the part of **Grey Haluska, Olivia Haluska, Blake Tremaine, Taliq Weigle** and **Bryce Thomas** as they were baptized, with their godparents and family looking on; as **Barbara Degnan, Andrew E. Degnan Jr., and Susan Giammichele** professed their faith, were admitted to full communion with the Catholic Church, and along with Grey, Olivia, Blake, and Taliq received the Sacraments of Confirmation and the Eucharist for the first time;*

It never ceases to amaze me when someone I know has bought in some crazy fake news story. Sometimes the story is just so unbelievable: celebrities who gained two hundred pounds in a month, women having babies who were never pregnant, or people actually being seen who are dead! Like Elvis!

The apostle Thomas found the news that Jesus was alive just too far-fetched to believe. But he didn't first hear the news on the Internet or read it standing in the grocery store checkout line. His friends told him. His fellow apostles told him they had actually seen the Lord with their own eyes. Their testimony was not enough. He needed proof.

The resurrection of Jesus gives us not only hope, but also a reason to be His disciples. We have not seen with our own eyes but, like Thomas, we have a community, the Church, that has relayed the truth to us. This same Jesus now calls us to go forth to spread the Gospel. More unbelievable than that, we have, through the gifts we have been given, a chance to change and even save lives. The day may come that you, moved by this news of the risen Lord, will be an agent of His love to the point where someone will tell the tale that you, a follower of Jesus, actually helped to change his or her life.
