## THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

"Jesus himself drew near and walked with them, but their eyes were prevented from recognizing Him." Can you imagine this scene? Jesus comes up next to these two disciples, walks with them, talks with them, even goes so far as to explain the Scriptures about Him to them, and they still fail to notice who He is. Understandably, they were sad, "looking downcast" because of Christ's death. Maybe their eyes glumly watched their feet as they trod along instead of taking in the sights around them. But at some point they must have looked at their companion's face. Why didn't they recognize Jesus until "He took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them"?

In everything else during their encounter, Jesus had appeared to be just another man. But when He broke the bread, in fact celebrating the Eucharist, they realized who He was. And then, He "vanished from their sight." Could it be that the risen Lord wanted to teach His followers about the new way in which He was present?

He may have vanished from sight, but He did not leave them. He was there, as we Catholics profess, through His real presence in the Eucharist. We are not so different from the disciples on the road to Emmaus. We may at times become downcast, wishing that Jesus was with us in a more obvious, traditional way. But in fact, the risen Lord comes to join us every time we go to Mass, remaining with us through His presence in the Eucharist. We only need the eyes of faith to believe that it's true. This is not the same as physical sight, to be sure. But He is there. As Jesus Himself said in last Sunday's Gospel, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed". (John 20:29)

## PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

For the past few weeks, thirty-two of our children and their families have been preparing for their First Communion, which will take place at our Sunday Masses next weekend. I think you would agree how important it is that parents, as well as other adults, be the best possible role models for our children. For this reason, it might be a good time to review what we believe about the Eucharist and be reminded about church etiquette, especially how we should conduct ourselves whenever we receive the Eucharist.

It is important we remember that the Lord is present in every Eucharist in four ways. First, God is present in the living Word of God proclaimed in the midst of the assembly. Second, the Lord is present in the Eucharistic assembly itself, as Christ identifies with each one of us. Third, the Lord is present in the one who presides, who acts in the name of Christ. Fourth, our Lord is present in the real presence of the Eucharistic bread and wine consecrated by the power of the Holy Spirit at each celebration. With Christ truly present at each celebration these four ways, it helps us to celebrate what we believe in the real presence of Christ.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has set the guidelines for the manner in which Catholics are to receive the Eucharist in this country. We receive the Body and Blood of Christ standing; there is no kneeling. As each person approaches the Minister of Communion, they offer a slight bow of the head (or another form of reverence, such as making the Sign of the Cross) just as the person ahead of you moves away; there is to be no profound bow or genuflection.

The choice of receiving Communion in the hand or on the tongue is one's personal preference. If you choose to receive the Eucharist in the hand, please raise your hands high enough and open for the Minister of Communion to easily place the host in your hand. **St. Cyril of Jerusalem** described it in this manner: *"When you approach, do not stretch out your arms or part of your fingers. Make your left hand a throne for your right, which is about to receive your king. Cup your hand to receive the Body and Blood of Christ and respond 'Amen'."* Please consume the host immediately. Those receiving the Eucharist should not carry the host to the cup minister and then dunk the host. If you choose to receive on the tongue, please open your mouth wide enough and stick out your tongue far enough for the minister to easily place the host on your tongue.

Receiving from the cup is a fuller sign of communion with Christ who said, "take and eat; take a drink." If you choose to receive the Blood of Christ from the cup, again bow slightly before taking the cup, take a sip and hand the cup back to the minister, who will wipe the edge of the cup and turn it for the next communicant. It is important to remember here that while receiving from the cup is a fuller sign of the sacrament, the Church still teaches that a person receives the fullness of the sacrament when receiving the Eucharist under just one form. You return to your seat and continue singing your prayer with the communion hymn, and then make a thanksgiving for God's many blessings.

## PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE CONTINUED...

The dialogue between the communion minister and the communicant is brief and full of meaning. When the minister says, "the Body of Christ," or "the Blood of Christ," we are being invited into communion with Jesus Christ and the Paschal Mystery of His life, death and resurrection. That includes communion with the church as the Body of Christ. Our "Amen" therefore is a profession of faith in all that is contained in the Sacrament of the Eucharist and our willing commitment to live in that communion. **St. Augustine** said, *"If you want to understand what is meant by the 'Body of Christ,' one must attend to the words of the apostle: 'you are the Body of Christ and His members (1 Corinthians 12:27). So then if you are the body of Christ and His members, it is the mystery of yourselves that you receive. It is to what you are that you assent. You hear 'the Body of Christ' and you answer 'Amen.' Be a member of Christ's body and make your 'Amen' true."*

Have a great week, and enjoy this first week of the month of May. Please include in your prayers this week our children, along with their parents and families, who will receive First Eucharist next weekend.
