LENTEN REGULATIONS

During Lent, the regulations for fast and abstinence are: all Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. Good Friday is a day of fasting;

All persons who are fourteen years of age or older are bound by the law of abstinence;

All persons between the ages of 18 and 59, inclusive, are bound by the law of fasting;

Catholics are especially encouraged to perform acts of penance during the season of Lent.

Abstinence - refrain from eating meat at all meals that day.

Fasting - only one full meal, the other two meals small enough that together they do not equal one full meal.

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and continues through to Holy Thursday. Good Friday has its own rule of fast and abstinence.

Parents or guardians who are new to St. Mary Our Mother School will need: student's birth certificate, baptismal certificate, immunization records and a completed parish commitment form for members of the parish. Children's Liturgy of the Word

Children's Liturgy of the Word is provided for all children in grade pre k-4 through 5th grade, most Sundays at 10:30 a.m. Mass, from mid-September to mid-June. There is no charge for this program and no registration is required.

Children's Liturgy of the Word is ritual centered on the proclamation and breaking open of the Sunday scriptures. The children do what the rest of the community is doing only it is more appropriate to their level of understanding. Because it is a liturgical celebration, all the principles of liturgy (active participation, clear symbols, etc.) apply. We also provide a weekly pamphlet "Explaining God's Word", a take-home resource that includes a reflection on the weekly Gospel, activities to enhance understanding, as well as a Family Page to help you in your efforts to teach your child about our faith.

If your child is hesitant to participate and you wish to accompany him/her until they are comfortable attending, we invite you to do so. The children rejoin the assembly for the Liturgy celebration of the Eucharist.

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

Wednesday of this week is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the season of Lent. This season is a sacred time for all Christians, leading to the celebration of Easter. For those preparing to celebrate the sacraments of Christian Initiation at Easter as well as those preparing to be received into full membership in the Church, it is a time of prayer and preparation for those sacraments. For those who regularly participate in the life of the Church, the season of Lent offers us an opportunity to embrace the Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving, so that we can recommit ourselves to living fully our baptismal promises which we will renew on Easter Sunday. For those who have been away from the Church for whatever reason, Lent is a time to reconsider renewing that relationship once again. If you know of someone in this latter category, please offer a word of encouragement, invitation and welcome to our parish. A great deal has been written recently about the "New Evangelization" that is needed in today's church. Evangelization begins with a word of encouragement and Wherever you find yourself in your faith welcome. journey, please use the season of Lent as a time of spiritual growth and renewal.

The front page of today's bulletin provides information on Lenten opportunities available to you at St. Mary Our Mother, as well as a Lenten calendar for use in your home. As in past years, we hope to provide you with a schedule of regional Lenten activities as well. As I write this, I am still waiting for confirmation of such a schedule.

For the past years, we have offered publications for your use during the Lenten season. The first is "The Word Among Us," which offers a complete liturgical guide for the Lenten season, including scripture readings, Mass texts, and mediations. The second publication is "The Little Black Book for Lent," which offers unique meditations for each day of Lent. There is a children's version of this book entitled "The Little Purple Book for Lent," which will be distributed to our children in both our school and faith formation programs. These books will be available on the table in the vestibule.

A traditional devotion in parishes during the Lenten season is the public praying of the **Stations of the Cross**. We will publicly pray this devotion each Friday at 5:30 p.m. in the chapel. Each Friday that St. Mary Our Mother School is in session, the school children will gather in the chapel at 1:30 p.m. for this devotion. I invite you and your family to join us Fridays during Lent for this devotion. In addition, the sixth grade students from St. Mary Our Mother School will offer a presentation of the "Living Stations of the Cross" in the church on **Friday, March 27th**, at 1:30 and 5:30 p.m.

Have a great week, and a great Lenten season. See you in church - on Ash Wednesday - and often during the season of Lent!

Imagine a world where all of us good stewards give without ceasing and go far beyond the minimum requirements. Our world would be a very different place. So, what is stopping us?

Funding for Energy Efficiency and Critical Capital Needs in Catholic Schools

Next to salary and benefits for personnel, the costs for energy and facility maintenance/repair are among the largest portions of school budgets. But unlike public school counterparts, religious and independent schools do not receive state building aid, nor do they have the authority to levy taxes or issue bonds to finance energy efficiency or other important capital projects. Although energy-saving improvements can pay for themselves over time, the upfront costs are often out of reach for cash-strapped schools. Maintaining Catholic Schools is not only good for the students and their families, it saves taxpayers the cost of educating those students.

The Diocese of Rochester with the NYS Catholic Conference urges a \$200 million appropriation in the next state budget for critical projects at religious and independent schools and an energy efficient grant/loan program (\$75 million) to provide seed money for energy efficiency projects. Those schools utilizing the loan fund would repay the grants with the savings they achieve in energy efficiency.

This initiative is consistent with the Diocese of Rochester's action/advocacy to respond to the call of Pope Francis in his encyclical, *Laudata Si: On Care For Our Common Home*, and is consistent with the New York State renewable energy and conservation goals to address climate change.


