
#### MISSION STATEMENT

St. Mary Our Mother is a Catholic community committed to the spiritual growth of all people as we share our faith and serve our community.



#### GOSPEL MEDITATION Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

You are at the eye doctor and it's time for the peripheral vision test. You know the one. It's where you put your head up to a contraption and have to click a switch every time you see a squiggly line. If you don't concentrate and maintain optimal focus, you will miss them and skew the outcome of the test. You can easily find yourself with a diagnosis that really isn't accurate! Concentration and focus are key to succeeding with this evaluation. They are also key to developing a healthy, vibrant spiritual life. If we do not bring our full consciousness to the task, concentrate with all our might, be watchful and vigilant, we are not going to see God's loving presence flashing before our eves!

That's why we need Advent. Let's face it. We can easily get distracted, focus on nonessential and superficial things and lose touch with what really matters. Our attentions wander. We daydream and even become a bit overwhelmed and tired, All of the stresses and demands of life consume us and we find ourselves constantly trying to play catch up rather than relishing the moment of the now, "Now" moments are so fleeting. They flash before us like those squiggly lines on a screen. Present moments go as quickly as they come but it is important to discover them and rest in them as often as we can. Though gone in a flash, these now moments of encounter with God teach powerful lessons and offer a grounding in truth that can be found nowhere else. It's the grace of Advent to become watchful and attentive because we are never sure when God will surprise us.

God loves surprises and love thrives on them! God's now moments of surprises come as tender instants of intimate connection where I find profound peace, experience joy, and rest in love. These are Advent times reflective of the now moments when Christ first was born, when God surprises us during every time we care to watch and when the great surprise of Christ's second coming dawns upon us all. But, to discover the grandeur and experience the awe of these now times, we have to be ready. We have to want to be there. We have to believe. And, we have to have the desire to soak in as much as we can in the time we have before us.

#### **GUIDELINES FOR MASS ATTENDANCE**

We ask that you register each week for the Mass you will be attending, as we need to limit the size of the congregation. Please call the parish office or email <a href="mailto:smomc@stny.rr.com">smomc@stny.rr.com</a> no later than **Thursday** at **4:00 p.m.** Also, please remember that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass has been suspended until further notice.

#### To prepare to attend:

Wash your hands before you leave home;

bring a mask; masks are required from the time you exit your car in the parking lot until you return to your car. (This also applies to private prayer in church);

bring your own hand sanitizer to use before receiving Communion;

bring your own worship materials, as no hymnals or missalettes are available;

please do not congregate in the church building or anywhere on the parish grounds;

one restroom is available, but do not congregate around it.

#### When you arrive:

Please plan to arrive 10-15 minutes before Mass, and check with the person at the registration table; ushers will be available to help you;

please deposit your offering envelope in the receptacle near the doors when you arrive as there will not be a collection at the offertory;

please sanitize your hands as you enter church; you will be directed to a seat in church, with seating beginning in the front to the back.

The chapel remains closed at this time.

#### **During Mass:**

Generally, there will be little congregational singing, as masks must <u>always</u> be worn throughout Mass.

There will be no altar servers or choir, one lector, one Eucharistic Minister, one cantor, when needed. There is to be no physical contact during the Lord's Prayer or at the Sign of Peace.

When approaching to receive Communion, please follow the directions of the ushers or volunteers present. Remain six feet apart from others, observing the markings on the floor.

As you receive Communion, receive Communion in your hands (there is no safe or hygienic manner to receive Communion on the tongue during the pandemic), walk at least six feet away from the minister before lowering your mask to receive the host, replace your mask, and return to your seat. The Eucharist will only be offered in the form of the Body of Christ.

You are not obliged to receive Communion at Mass if you are uncomfortable doing so. If you are not receiving Communion, simply step out of your seat and back away to allow others to return to their seat with minimal contact.

#### Going forth:

At the end of Mass, the ushers will direct you to exit from the church building, beginning with the last pew first.

Private prayer is not available after Mass as to facilitate immediate cleaning and sanitizing of the pews and restrooms.

Please go directly to your vehicle when you leave church.

#### **Tax Advantaged Donation Strategies**

In addition to donating with cash or checks, there are other tax beneficial ways that you can donate to St. Mary Our Mother:

If you are over age 72 and you have an IRA retirement account, you may be eligible for a tax benefit called a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). This provision in the tax law allows you to make a distribution from your IRA directly to St. Mary Our Mother. Using the QCD option, you can transfer up to \$100,000 per year to charity and exclude the entire distribution from your gross income for tax purposes. This is a nice tax benefit that allows you to reduce your taxable income for charitable giving, regardless of whether you are otherwise eligible to deduct charitable contributions on your tax return. To use the QCD election, you will need to sign a form provided by your IRA account custodian. On the form you will elect to make the payment payable directly to "St. Mary Our Mother" and you will enter the address as: 816 West Broad Street, Horseheads, NY 14845.

If you have appreciated securities, you may be able to save money on capital gains taxes by donating shares to St. Mary Our Mother. You can transfer stocks, bonds, mutual funds or exchange traded funds (ETF) positions that have appreciated in value directly to our investment account. We can sell the positions for you and use the proceeds. We do not owe capital gains tax on the sale, since we are a qualified non-profit organization. In addition to avoiding capital gains tax on selling the position, you may also be able to deduct the value of the security that you donate, as a charitable contribution. If you hold the appreciated security in a brokerage account, your custodian can provide you with the forms to sign to make the transfer.

#### PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

An early publication deadline for this week's bulletin finds me writing this column on November 16th, nearly two weeks before you will read it. At this time, as per the New York State Governor's Office, our county continues its designation as a "orange zone," for the Covid-19 virus, which has resulted in the suspension of all public Sunday Masses since the end of October. Despite the changes that have been imposed on us since last March due to the coronavirus, I hope you were able to enjoy a Happy Thanksgiving.

Today is the First Sunday of Advent, and the beginning of a new liturgical year. This season of anticipation arrives with all the natural signs that surround it. The days are darker and shorter, tending to make us quieter and more reflective. We are in the final hours of the Thanksgiving holiday weekend, and it is no secret that Christmas is coming. Even in the midst of this worldwide pandemic, we have seen the advertisements, outdoor Christmas lights have been put in place, including the lights of our church's outdoor Advent candles. Christmas preparations are well on the way. In addition, the Advent scriptures have a tone of their own. No longer is our attention focused on an adult Christ, but the scriptures speak of a prophecy, anticipation, and begin to read the infancy narratives. The Advent season is a time when we are invited to step back and remember why we do what we do during this season. Advent is a time when we are invited to avoid the commercialism that surrounds a secular holiday season and embrace the true meaning of "Emmanuel: God is with us."

During more normal times, this weekend would be an opportunity to remind you of the special opportunities that are so much a part of parish life during Advent, but will be missing this year. I am thinking of the Service of Lessons and Carols, which we would have on the first or second Sunday of Advent. It is always a wonderful service, an opportunity which I hope will return next year, or whenever this pandemic ends. Another opportunity that will be missing this year is our annual Christmas basket program, directed by our parish's Social Ministry Committee, where we provide Christmas food baskets and gifts for, in some years, 250 families. Due to a number of logistics associated with the restrictions due to the Coronavirus, we are unable to do this outreach this year. Hopefully, this outreach can resume next year.

While some of the traditional Advents practices in the parish cannot occur this year, we can use this Advent time for prayer and reflection. As we have done in previous years, we have two publications that you are familiar with. The first is "The Word Among Us," which offers a complete guide to the Advent season, including Advent scripture readings, meditations, and Mass prayers for each day. The second publication is entitled, "The Little Blue Book." for the Advent/ Christmas season. These booklets, based on the writings of the late Bishop Ken Untener and published by the Diocese of Saginaw, Michigan, provide a brief reflection for each day of the season, including scripture, an historical note, a suggested good work, and finally ending with the words, "Spend some quiet time with the Lord."
