

LENTEN DISCIPLINES OF FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Catholics in good health, ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, the other two meals small enough that together they do not equal one full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays of Lent.

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

The season of Lent is traditionally a time of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Christians from the earliest days of the Church have considered this period as a "Time of Enlightenment," a period of time to practice these three Lenten disciplines. But just what are these disciplines supposed to accomplish in us? To this day, it is common for people to tell us what they are doing for Lent, or what sacrifices people are making during the season of Lent, whether it is abstaining from dining in restaurants (which many of us have been doing since the start of the pandemic) or abstaining from television, candy, alcohol or desserts. You may also hear people mention spending less time with their ipads, smart phones, and the internet. But what is the reasoning behind these sacrifices people make during Lent? What are these penitential practices supposed to accomplish?

The Lenten practices we embrace during this season are meant to change our hearts. We journey through this Lenten season together as a church although each of us has the freedom to choose our own Lenten practices. In changing individual hearts, we can change all hearts. The actions of any of us affect all of us, for good or ill. We involve ourselves in these Lenten practices to help not only ourselves but others in the discipline of Lent. We have an opportunity to grow closer to God and to change hearts. Lent is a season when we can remove anything that keeps us from being the person and the people God wants us to be. Anything that keeps us from growing closer to God and to one another is something we can work on as a part of our Lenten disciplines and penance. The Lenten season is a time when our prayer can help change and transform our lives, in which your acts of penance can build up the community of faith.

The "official" fast days during the season of Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, but your personal fasting need not be restricted just to those two days of Lent. Personal fasting can be done at any time. Once again this year, our parish will be participating in Operation Rice Bowl, with all the monies collected from these rice bowls being forwarded to Catholic Relief Services. This is an excellent practice in offering alms for the sake of others, and remind us of the needs of the hungry throughout the world. On a local level, you may want to include a local charitable organization to be the recipient of your Lenten Almsgiving. For those who have not yet given to the Catholic Ministries Appeal, you may want to make a gift to this annual appeal, and help our parish reach our goal.

CARING FOR GOD'S CREATION AND LENT

Pray: In gratitude, I ask for the grace to look closely to see how my life choices impact creation and the poor and vulnerable. How can I turn away from a throwaway culture and instead live in solidarity with the poor and care for God's creation?

Fast: Take a break from electronic entertainment — TV, computer use, cell phone use. Pay attention to people in front of you and the natural world around you. Try to grow comfortable with quiet and stillness.

Act: Support efforts in New York State to eliminate throwaway plastic grocery bags. Think about other single-use plastic products and choose *reusable* instead.

JOURNEYING THROUGH LENT

Lent is a time of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. As a parish, we have adopted Catholic Relief Service (CRS) Rice Bowl as our Lenten outreach project. We invite you to participate in this through prayer and almsgiving.

Seventy-five percent of the Rice Bowl donations go to funding development projects around the world through CRS. This year, the funds will be focused on projects in Madagascar, El Salvador, and Timor Leste. The remaining twenty-five percent will go to the Horseheads Food Pantry. Go to www.crsricebowl.org to learn more about Rice Bowl and find stories of hope showing the work of CRS in these countries.

Rice Bowls will be available at the parish office and next weekend will be stapled to the bulletin. If you do not get a "Rice Bowl", you can still participate fully by going to the website, leaning more about the program, and placing your donations in any container at home. At the end of our Lenten season, your "alms" can be turned in to the parish office or the church drop box. Even better, you can convert your donations to a check and send to the parish office or post to on-line giving on our parish website. Please make sure to indicate it is for CRS Rice Bowl.
