

CATHOLIC MINISTRIES APPEAL

ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI

Born in 1181 in Italy, St. Francis of Assisi was renowned for drinking and partying as a youth. During a military expedition/battle between Assisi and Perugia, he was captured and imprisoned for ransom. He spent nearly a year in prison and began receiving visions from God. After his release from prison, St. Francis of Assisi claimed to have heard the voice of Christ, who told him to restore the Christian Church and live a life of poverty. As a result, St. Francis of Assisi abandoned his life of luxury and became a devotee of the Catholic faith.

Today, St. Francis of Assisi, known for his deep love of nature and animals, is the patron saint of the environment and animals. Each October, many animals are blessed on his feast day. ©LPi **UPDATED COVID-19 PROTOCOL**

Due to the Covid-19 cases in our area, we are exercising extra caution to keep our parishioners and staff safe, especially those who are not vaccinated. Until further notice, masks are required whenever you are in a church building, including when attending Mass. This applies to everyone old enough to safely wear a mask, regardless of vaccination status. We are not at this time implementing any additional registration, social distancing, nor extra sanitizing procedures.

One half of the church seating will continue to be "open seating" with all rows open. The other half will be blocked off at every other row, for those more comfortable with social distancing. When you enter a pew row, please move to the furthest open seating area, so that others can fill in the row behind you. Thank you.

CREATING A SAFE ENVIRONMENT (CASE) MANDATORY TRAINING FOR PARISH VOLUNTEERS

In March 2021, the Diocese of Rochester updated its *Volunteer Creating a Safe Environment (CASE) Policy* to include ALL volunteers, not just those who work with children or vulnerable adults. The training is offered in an easy to use online program. Volunteers will be required to sign a Code of Conduct and complete a background check prior to starting your volunteer service.

This mandatory CASE training must be renewed every three years (volunteers over 70 years of age who have previously completed CASE training are only required to complete the background check and Code of Conduct forms).

With the new policy, all ushers, cantors, lectors, Eucharistic ministers, Faith Formation and youth group volunteers are required to be CASE trained.

Since this training is mandatory, if a person does not complete it, unfortunately, he/she can no longer volunteer.

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

You may have heard of the recent news that Pope Francis I has called a worldwide Synod of Bishops to address current issues, concerns, and directions for the future of our church. I would like to use today's column to share with you parts of a letter from Bishop Matano sent to all pastors and pastoral administrators concerning the Synod and how the process will unfold for our diocese. The following are excerpts from the bishop's letter.

Reverend and Fathers, Pastoral Administrators:

As you may be aware, Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has convoked the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, from October 2021 through October 2023. The first phase is the "diocesan synodal phase" which will begin in October 2021 in all dioceses throughout the world under the theme: "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission.'

This first phase is described as "listening to one another and walking forward together, guided by the Holy Spirit (Vademecum, no. 4.1). The Synod then will proceed to a continental phase, and finally conclude with an Assembly of the Synod of Bishops in Rome in October 2023. From its theme, we understand that Jesus Christ is "the absolute protagonist who takes the initiative, sowing the words and signs of the coming of the Kingdom without 'showing partiality' (cf. Acts 10:34)"(Preparatory Document, p. 20).

In response to the request of our Holy Father, I have appointed two Diocesan Representatives, Mr. Bernard Grizard, Director of Pastoral Services, and Dr. Shannon Kilbridge, Associate Director of Pastoral Services, who will foster "a broad consultation process in order to gather the wealth of the experiences of lived synodality" (Preparatory Document, no. 31); Vademecum, no. 1.5). The information gathered will be used for the creation of a ten-page report (as instructed) that is to be submitted to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) in April, 2022.

While this is an initiative for the Church throughout the world, it also comes at the same time as the Catholic Church in the United States has been preparing to begin the Eucharistic Revival, which will take place from July 2022 to December 2024. In this regard, the Catechism of the Catholic Church cites the Second Vatican Council's teaching: "The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church namely Christ himself, our Pasch" (CCC, no. 1324)." Thus, these two initiatives necessarily complement each other, for once we have come to truly know, love and bond with Jesus, we appreciate the call of every baptized person to participate in His life which culminates in Eucharistic Communion. which then embraces the mission:

We are currently accepting registrations for the Sacraments of First Reconciliation/First Eucharist and Confirmation.

If your child is at least 7 years old, in second grade and has completed at least one year of faith formation and will be registering for religious education classes this year, your child will be eligible to prepare and celebrate the Sacraments of First Penance and First Holy Communion.
