GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE: May 12, 2024 - 7th Sunday of Easter

A few months ago, I had the singular privilege of a private meeting with Pope Francis. We were a small group of pastors, composed largely of non-Catholics. The Holy Father wished to discuss our work for Christian unity. The phrase I remember him saying with the greatest frequency was: *Tutti dentro*. It means, "Everyone in." He clearly wanted us to emphasize that the Church is made for the whole human race, not a select few. At the center of his concern was unity. We are all brothers and sisters, he said multiple times. The Church's primary longing is for everyone to join Her.

This longing is at the heart of this Ascension feast day. We hear the longest recorded prayer of the one whom Pope Francis represents. Jesus' concern is unity, praying to the Father, "that they may be one, even as we are one" (John 17:11). The deep unity of all people in Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit is what Jesus most desires. It is what He ascends to accomplish.

Do we have this same burning desire in our hearts, too? Or do we see Christian unity as an unrealizable dream? Or worse, as something that threatens our own narrow tribal interests? This feast is a wonderful time to consider our attitude toward Christian unity and to commit to doing whatever we can to foster it. It is the Pope's desire because it is that of Jesus — and it should be ours, too. — Father John Muir

Some people have "the rich relation" in their family tree. Aunt Cindy, who is always traveling somewhere new and exciting. Cousin Richard and his lake house. Your sister and brother-in-law who buy a new car every year.

What matters is the spirit we carry within our hearts when we do it. What matters is our destination as we approach that proverbial table. Are we headed for the place of honor, expecting it to be waiting for us? Or are we making our way to the lowest place, simply thankful to be invited to the meal.

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

Happy Mother's Day to all mothers of our parish of St. Mary Our Mother! We salute and honor you, as well as thank God for you today, and for the love you selflessly give. We offer a prayer for all the mothers, living and deceased. With all the public conversation today about the role of women in the church and society, may we never lose sight of and appreciation for the unique womanly role of motherhood.

I hope you have the opportunity today, if your mother is living, to speak with her and tell her of your love. And if your mother has died, I hope you are blessed with fond memories of her and reasons for thanking God for her. There are some people who do not have good memories of growing up--perhaps because their mother was not all that they had hoped, desired, and needed. If you are such a person, pray today for a healing of your memories, and acceptance of what cannot be changed, and a decision to thank God for your life and for the mother who gave it to you. Occasionally, such a person may need the help of another to achieve such healing. It is a wise thing to do to come to peace.

Each year Mother's Day falls during the Easter season. As we are searching for signs of Easter and new life, this weekend invites us to center on "Mother". One might say that a mother is the premier sign of Easter. She gives birth to human life to gain this title. Not only does she give birth, but she nurtures, encourages, cares and loves her children. Her position as Mother is not a 9 to 5 job, nor is it concluded when her child walks out of the house. Motherhood is a life-long commitment and, I believe, even extends beyond the bounds of time and space to eternity. All that we envision in the life of a mother is envisioned in the life of an Easter person.

RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS: The Truth We Cannot See

I only pray out loud when I want my kids to hear what I'm saying. I know what you're thinking — hypocrites in the synagogue and the street corner; go to your room and shut the door — but I think if Jesus had to raise children He would understand where I'm coming from. I pray out loud not because I want my kids to think I'm holy and not because I want them to admire me but because I want them to know how broken I am, and how desperately I rely on the mercy and love of God.

It's also an effective way to send a message. "God, I'm sorry I've been losing my patience today. Please help me. And send your Holy Spirit to make these kids stop fighting."

Vocal prayer, in front of other people, is an incredibly vulnerable action, so it strikes me whenever Jesus chooses to pray out loud in front of His disciples. Surely, mental prayer was something of a perpetual state for Him. I imagine Jesus was ceaselessly conversing with His Father in heaven throughout even the most ordinary days. So, when He chooses to make those communications public, my ears perk up. He wants his kids to hear what He's saying.

In John, chapter 17, we see that He wants us to remember who we are. His disciples are about to see things that will shake the very foundation of their faith. The only way they will make it to the other side is if they remember that truth does not consist only of what we can see with our eyes.

This is the same truth in which we have been consecrated. We belong to this truth in a way the world will never understand or accept. It is the truth we cannot see.

"I gave them your word, and the world hated them, because they do not belong to the world any more than I belong to the world." John 17:14.
