

HANDS OF CHRIST AWARD 2025:

The Hands of Christ is a recognition program to assist parishes in affirming their high school seniors who have been the "Hands of Christ" in their church, home, school, and greater community. You are invited to nominate a high school senior of the class of 2025 for the Hands of Christ recognition.

A nominated high school senior must meet the following criteria:

*consistently demonstrates a Christian attitude by word and example;

*has been actively involved in their parish as well as their school community;

*has been a positive role model for peers and younger children;

*is a participating member of St. Mary Our Mother parish and attends Mass regularly;

*is currently a high school senior.

To nominate a senior, please stop at the parish office for a registration form, complete the registration form including the nominee's name, address, telephone number, and high school along with the examples of the above mentioned criteria. All forms will be reviewed by Father Linsler for approval as pastor. All nominations are due in the parish office by December 1, 2024.

Please pray for all those seeking election to public office. As we prepare to vote on Nov. 5th, our U.S. Catholic Bishops ask us to pray and reflect: What is the connection between our faith which offers a vision of hope where justice and mercy abound and the desire to change the world for the better? What kind of leaders does our society need? For what should they stand and how should they lead?

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

I would like to thank everyone who has taken a few moments to participate in the **Diocesan Wide Census**. Thank you for those who took the time last Sunday to complete a census card. A good number of people have told me that they completed the form on-line. For those who have not yet filled out a census form, I would encourage you to do so as soon as you can, so that our records can be updated with the most accurate and correct information as possible. Census cards are available in church and through the parish office, or you can complete the card on line by visiting the diocesan website, dor.org, and follow the census link.

As you are aware, we are in the midst of the annual Catholic Ministries Appeal. The 2024-2025 theme for the year's appeal is "Extending Christ's Mission." As of Monday of this past week, 79 donors from St. Mary Our Mother have pledged \$22,032.00 toward our parish goal of \$96,000.00 I sincerely thank those who have given to the Catholic Ministries Appeal and ask those who have not yet given to prayerfully consider making a financial gift to this appeal.

One of the most frequently asked questions concerning the **Catholic Ministries Appeal** is how the monies collected from the appeal are allocated. The following is a list of the appeal allocations.

9% - Serving people in need through Catholic Charities:

The CMA provides a subsidy to Catholic Charities to support its regional offices/agencies throughout 12 counties serving the poor, elderly, infirm, and the most vulnerable in our communities.

32% - Providing diocesan-wide services to our parishes and institutions:

The CMA provides funding and resources to assist parishes, pastors, staff, Pastoral Councils, Finance Councils, ministers and chaplains in serving the faithful through Liturgical, Urban, Rural, and Multicultural programs and ministries; Hospital and Jail Chaplaincy, Finance, Human Resources, Facilities Management, Information Technology, Tribunal, Archives, Communication, Stewardship, and Pastoral Planning Services.

7% - Supporting Seminarians, Deacons, and Pastoral Leaders:

Your donations to the CMA support the education and professional development of our seminarians, deacons, and pastoral leaders.

5% - Educating our young in the Catholic faith:

The CMA helps prepare our youth for fulfilling and faith-centered lives through parish Religious education programs, Catholic schools, Campus ministry, sacramental preparation, young adult and youth ministry programs.

Pastor's perspective continued:

33% - Funding Operations and Support Services

The CMA helps to fund operation of diocesan offices/ ministries in the Pastoral Center, including maintenance and capital improvements.

9% - Funding the Ministries of our Pope and Bishop:

The CMA gives Catholics the opportunity to extend their reach beyond their parish boundaries to support Vatican ministries, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, New York State Catholic Conference, the work in the efforts of Bishop Matano, and the lay advisory councils that guide diocesan-wide decisions.

5% - Supporting the Catholic Ministries Appeal Campaign:

It costs five cents to raise one dollar for the CMA, well below the nonprofit industry average. A portion of funds raised through the CMA is used to develop and execute fundraising efforts associated with the Appeal, including professional expertise, staffing, gift and date processing, promotional materials and postage.

All monies raised in the CMA are only used for the programs, services and ministries outlined above. No gifts to the CMA are used to satisfy settlement costs associated with abuse.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS: GIV-ING: Giving as God does:

Ask yourself this question — what would you pray for if you really believed God could and would do anything for you? In my experience, we all have something. We all have that miracle we're afraid to request, afraid we will be disappointed.

Do we doubt God's readiness to give because we ourselves have such an imperfect understanding of charity and love? Maybe if we had better faith in God we would be more ready to give of ourselves — and maybe if we were more ready to give of ourselves, we would understand more clearly the ways of God.

Because we're not really afraid that God can't do something. We know He can do anything. What we're afraid of is that He will do what He always does: give us what we need, not what we want.

Have you ever had a friend in need and you just wanted to give them something — a meal, a phone call, a text? Not because you knew it would help, but simply because you wanted to reach out. And have they ever said to you: It wasn't so much what you gave, but the fact that you did. You gave them what they needed even if it wasn't what they specifically asked for.

When we give in this manner, we are giving as God does. Sometimes we are afraid to ask because we don't want to be disappointed. But remember, the blind man on the road got what he asked for, but he would have gotten what he needed even if his answer had been the opposite. God's generosity is always reckless, and it's always perfect.
