OBSERVENCE OF VETERANS DAY IN OUR CEMETERY:

Tomorrow will be the observance of Veterans' Day. in our cemetery. We have many veterans from all branches — from the Spanish-American War, World War One and Two, Korean and Vietnam wars. On Veteran's Day, please keep them in your prayers



PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

We are in the midst of the Veteran's Day holiday weekend. Many of our schools and businesses will be closed on Monday in observance of Veteran's Day. Veteran's Day is a holiday dedicated to American veterans of all wars. In 1918, on the 11th day of the 11th. month, an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities, was declared between the Allied Nations and Germany in World War I, then known as "the Great War." Commemorated in many countries as Armistice Day the following year, November 11th. became a federal holiday in 1938. In the aftermath of World War II and the Korean War, Armistice Day became known as Veterans Day. Unlike Memorial Day, Veterans Day pays tribute to all American veterans— living and dead—but especially gives thanks to living veterans who served their country honorably during war to peacetime. Next year will be the 100th anniversary of this holiday.

A little history about this holiday. The Treaty of Versailles, which marked the official end of World War I was signed on June 29, 1919. However, the armistice date of November 11, 1918 remained in the minds of the public. Later that year, **President Woodrow Wilson** proclaimed November 11th. as the first commemoration of Armistice Day. It is interesting to note the process that brought about a change in name for this holiday.

American effort during World War II saw the greatest mobilization of the members of the United States Military—U.S. Army, Navy, Marines, and Air Force—in our nation's history. Sixteen million of troops served in World War II; another 5.7 million more served in the Korean War. In 1954, after lobbying efforts by veteran's service organizations, Congress amended the 1938 act that had made Armistice Day a holiday, striking the word "Armistice" in favor of "Veterans." **President Dwight D. Eisenhower** signed legislation on June 1, 1954. Since then, November 11th became a day to honor all American veterans. This date continues to carry historical and patriotic significance for many Americans.

As has been the case of all veterans of our country through the years, today's military men and women who serve and protect us come from all walks of life. They are parents, children, grandparents, friends, neighbors, and coworkers, and are an important part of their communities.

Veterans Day provides each of us with an opportunity to honor and thank all veterans who have served our country so faithfully, many of whom paid the ultimate sacrifice of their lives for the freedoms we enjoy as people of this great nation. We will be offering a special prayer of recognition and blessing for them at this weekend's liturgies. If you see a military person or veteran this weekend, approach them, and offer them your personal words of gratitude.

GIVING FROM ABUNDANCE

If you're like me, and you're far, far below the "having buildings named after you" tax bracket, you might just think that today's Gospel has nothing to do with you.

You might kick back and relax, thinking of all the poor, rich suckers sitting in the pews, shifting uncomfortably as Jesus praises the meager gift of the widow and disdains those who only give from abundance, those whose charity results in admiration and praise and all manner of temporal reward.

"In this economy, every gift I give is from my poverty," you might think to yourself with a chuckle.

But you — and let me be clear, I'm talking mostly to myself here — would be wrong. Because we all have an abundance of something, even if it isn't money.

What I've come to realize about myself is that I find plenty of ways to give only from my abundance. For instance, if I answer any request with the words, "Sure, I can, but..." chances are high that I'm about to work out a way to give, but only in a way that doesn't really impact me.

I'm willing to help. I just don't want to feel it.

But here's the thing about Jesus: He cares what's in our hearts as well as what's in our hands. A good deed, an act of charity? That's great! But what's the story behind it? Because a world full of moral actions and selfish hearts doesn't do anyone any good.

When we give from our poverty — our poverty of money, our poverty of time, our poverty of patience — we are giving the gift of the widow.

Have you ever made the mistake of telling your spouse that you're out of something — only to see them respond with The Look? Then you realize it: of course, he or she knows you're out of butter. They knew it before a butter shortage was even a blip on your radar.
