#### **PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:**

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, and begin the final week of the Church's liturgical year. Unlike other feasts which were centered on an event in our Lord's life, the Feast of Christ the King celebrates an aspect of Jesus' identity, and thus is categorized as an "idea feast." This feast was originally celebrated each year on the last Sunday in October, but with the first revision of the Roman missal after the Second Vatican Council, this feast was moved to the final Sunday of the liturgical year. By instituting this feast, Pope Pius XI hoped to renew and strengthen the faith of the people of his time and to a world where the influence of totalitarian forms of government such as Communism, Nazism, and Fascism were gaining a strong hold in many countries particularly in Europe. It was Pius XI's hope that this annual celebration would serve as a powerful reminder to all of Jesus' reign in our midst, and would speak powerfully of our belief in God's triumph over evil. Christ Our King continues to be the source of grace as each of us being His living presence into our world.

Thursday of this week we celebrate the American feast of Thanksgiving. The President's Official Proclamation calls for all Americans to set aside the fourth Thursday of the month of November as a date to give thanks for the blessings and prosperity that we enjoy. We are aware of the artist's renditions of the early American Thanksgivings and have seen the television specials telling us of Thanksgivings of old. In our Thanksgiving gatherings, we may find ourselves remembering Thanksgivings in the past, recalling fondly those who once sat at table with us and now sit at God's heavenly table. We may simply look around at our family table and see familiar faces and the familiar stories and simply be grateful that we are a part of it all. Wherever our mindset may be, Thanksgiving offers us a moment to pause and simply be grateful for the people we are.

What are you grateful for this Thanksgiving? The list should be endless! Certainly, we need to be aware and grateful for the many sacrifices made by Americans of the past as well as today. We are familiar with the early struggles our ancestors experienced and the eventual "meeting of the minds" with Native Americans who offered their assistance in building, planting, and harvesting. We also received a dream from them for which we must be grateful. This republic was to recognize the common bond that women and men share; the fact that all are created equal by God. America was to stand for possibilities; you can become whomever you choose as long as you are willing to work for it. The gift of freedom is just that—a gift, and Americans will go to any length to assure the reality of freedom in American life. By celebrating Thanksgiving Day, we are saying thanks for these and so many other blessings of life we enjoy in the United States.

On behalf of the entire staff of our parish and school, I wish you a blessed and joyous Thanksgiving holiday. I also extend a special invitation to you to begin your **Thanksgiving Day** by joining us for **Mass at 9:00 a.m.**

## MAKE A GIFT TO THE CMA FROM YOUR IRA: A Special Opportunity if you are 70-1/2 or older

You can give any amount (up to \$105,000 per year) from your IRA without having to pay taxes on the amount given as part of your annual income. Gifts of any value less than \$105,000 or less are eligible for this benefit and you can feel good knowing that you are making a difference for the Diocese of Rochester and your parish. This popular gift option is commonly called the **charitable IRA rollover**, but you may also see it referred to as a **qualified charitable distribution (QCD)).** 

Your disbursement must come directly from the administrator of your IRA to the diocese—you should not receive the funds first.

#### **CHRISTMAS CARING PROGRAM 2024**

Over the years, we, at St. Mary Our Mother, have reached out to help the needy of Horseheads and its many surrounding rural areas. We have done this in partnership with the Horseheads Food Pantry, which serves these families by providing food assistance. Parishioners have generously been supporting the pantry year-long by donating grocery items to the vestibule food cart and by donating clean, empty deposit bottles to the parish office. Furthermore, 25% of the Rice Bowl proceeds that are returned by CRS are then given to help with the expenses of our local pantry.

As the Christmas season of giving and caring approaches, we, at St. Mary Our Mother, will be reaching out to the clients of the Food Pantry in **four** special ways:

- 1. Making a monetary donation so the pantry can supply meat and fresh food for the Christmas meal and the holiday week. Envelopes will be provided on the tables in back of the church for this purpose.
- 2. Increasing our donations of canned and dried food to the vestibule food cart so the pantry clients have healthy and adequate food for the Christmas holidays.
- 3. Bringing a Christmas ornament that you offer to a needy family. You would hang the ornament on our Christmas Caring tree located in the back of the church. The ornaments will be taken to the pantry so the families and children can pick an ornament for their tree as a reminder that we care for them.
- 4. Purchasing a new book for a young child (age preschool through elementary school age) for a child whose family visits the pantry. Place the book in the box provided in the vestibule.

The program will kick off this weekend of November 23rd-24th, when donation envelopes will be available in the vestibule and the Christmas Caring tree will be standing proudly in the back of the church awaiting your ornaments. The program will conclude the week of December 8th.

The Social Ministry Committee invites and encourages all parishioners to participate in this, our Christmas Caring Program, in any one or more of the four ways above. So please be involved in spreading joy and showing love and concern for our neighbors in need,





## The Solemnity of Christ the King of the Universe

#### The Liturgical Year Ends

The Solemnity of Christ the King is the final Sunday of the liturgical calendar – the last Sunday of Ordinary Time. The season of Advent begins the following Sunday. In the Catholic Church it is a Solemnity and a Holy Day of Obligation and priests wear white.

The purpose of this feast is to draw our minds and hearts closer to acknowledging the authority and sovereignty of Christ in a society that often forgets or denies His power and kingship. The reign of Christ does not refer to an earthly power but a divine one. There are many references to Christ as King in the Bible. In Revelation (19:16) Jesus is referred to as "King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

In John 18:33, 36-37 the divine authority of Christ is made clear: [Pilate] said to [Jesus], "Are you the King of the Jews?" ... Jesus answered, "My kingdom does not belong to this world." ... So Pilate said to Him, "Then you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say I am a king. For this I was born and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth.
