



#### **PASTOR'S PERSPCTIVE:**

An early bulletin deadline because of the Thanksgiving holiday weekend, finds me writing this column on Friday, November 15th, 13 days before the Thanksgiving holiday. One of the liturgies I look forward to each year is the Mass on Thanksgiving Day. It is a wonderful time for many to come together to offer their personal gratitude to God for the many blessings we enjoy. I hope you and your family enjoy a blessed Thanksgiving!

Advent 2024 has arrived! This season of anticipation arrives with all the natural signs that surround it. The days are darker and shorter, tending to make us quieter and more reflective. We are in the final hours of the Thanksgiving holiday weekend, and it's no secret that Christmas We have seen the advertisements, outdoor lights have been hung, including the lights of our church's outdoor Advent wreath. Christmas preparations are underway, cards need to be prepared, Christmas cooking and gatherings are in their planning stages. In addition, the Advent scriptures have a tone of their own. No longer is our attention focused on an adult Christ, but we hear of prophecy, anticipation as we begin to read the infancy narratives. Advent is the special time of year when we are invited to step back and remember the reason behind why we do what we do during this season. Advent invites us to avoid the commercialism that surrounds a secular holiday season, but to embrace the season's true meaning, "God is with us.".

There are several opportunities during Advent to reflect on that theme of "God is with us". There are opportunities for prayer, the greatest being the celebration of the Eucharist. For your Advent reading and devotions, we have made available publications of "The Word Among Us" as well as "The Little Blue Book." "The Word Among Us, offers a complete guide for the Advent/ Christmas season, including scripture readings, meditations and Mass texts for each day. "The Little Blue Book" provides a brief reflection for each day, including scripture, and historical note, a suggested good work, finally ending each day with the invitation, "Spend some time with the Lord." We also have made available two publications from the Dynamic Catholic Publications. The first book is entitled "The Three Ordinary Voices of God," written by Father Matthew Kelly. The second publication is entitled "33 Days to Eucharistic Glory," with reflections from a number of authors and resources to help us deepen our understanding of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

For the fourth year in lieu of a formal Christmas basket program, our Social Ministry Committee is teaming in a Christmas Giving program with the Horseheads Food Pantry. In addition to our weekly collection of food, you are invited to make a monetary donation to the parish, which will be forwarded to the food pantry for the purchase of meat for the pantry's Christmas outreach efforts. You are also invited to donate a Christmas ornament for the Christmas trees in the narthex, as well as a book for a young child. #### **CHRISTMAS CARING PROGRAM 2024**



In this Christmas season of giving and caring, we, at St. Mary Our Mother, are reaching out to the clients of the Food Pantry in four special ways:

- Making a monetary donation so the pantry can supply meat and fresh food for the Christmas meal and the holiday week. Envelopes will be provided on the tables in back of the church for this purpose.
- Increasing our donations of canned and dried food to the vestibule food cart so the pantry clients have healthy and adequate food for the Christmas holidays.
- Bringing a Christmas ornament that you offer to a needy family. Please hang the ornament on our Christmas Caring tree in the back of the church. The ornaments will be taken to the pantry so the families and children can pick an ornament for their tree as a reminder that we care for them.

This program is now in progress and will run until December 12. Donation envelopes are available in the vestibule along with a box for your book donation to a young child. The Christmas Caring trees are standing proudly in the back of the church awaiting more ornaments. The program will conclude the week of December 12th.

The Social Ministry Committee invites and encourages all parishioners to participate in this, our Christmas Caring Program, in any one or more of the four ways above. Please be involved in spreading joy and showing love and concern for our neighbors in need.

You may share or you may just listen. We encourage you to be sensitive to your own needs. ALL are welcome. We strive to provide a safe, confidential, and open place where our motto remains, "We see healing in the very act of helping."

#### **Remembering Advent**

It always makes me laugh a little, these apocalyptic Gospel readings that come at the beginning of Advent.

What a funny juxtaposition — all of us stringing twinkle lights and wrapping presents, with Jesus thundering on about the end of the world. It's Christmas! Don't be a downer. Pour me some more eggnog and turn up the Nat King Cole.

Well, except it's not Christmas. It's Advent.

There's nothing wrong with the cultural accessories that have developed alongside this religious holiday. There's nothing wrong with the twinkle lights and the eggnog. But here's the thing: when Satan knows we're watching the front gate, he slips in the back door. And something I've found is that one back door he likes to use in my life is Cultural Christmas.

I love Cultural Christmas. I tend to overdo Cultural Christmas. I over schedule, I over decorate, I over gift. All this "over" leads to — you guessed it! — overwhelmed. "The anxieties of daily life," as Jesus describes in today's Gospel, make my heart drowsy. My *spiritual* Christmas joy, time and time again, is diminished — all because I embrace Cultural Christmas and ignore Advent. Satan sneaks in with the twinkle lights and the Christmas carols and he snatches the Present like the nasty little Grinch he is. He photobombs my experience of the religious holidays with the anxieties I so willingly embrace because of the production that is Cultural Christmas.

So, remember to rest this Advent, folks. Rest your heart. Rest your hands. Watch the back door *and* the front. Remember that this is the perfect time to be thinking about the state of your soul and not just the state of your house.

(Even though, yes, I know, the guests are coming any minute.)
