

I'm writing this column in the middle of the Presidents' Holiday weekend. Looking at the calendar, it hardly seems possible that today is the fourth and final weekend of February. I also realize that in a mere ten days, the season of Lent will be upon us. Ash Wednesday is one week from this coming Wednesday, March 5th.

A parishioner shared with me the following, and I thought I would pass it on to you. The article is entitled "Top Ten Reasons for Participating at Mass every Sunday."

- 10. Sunday is the Lord's Day (because Jesus rose from the dead on this day), not our day; we remember that the other days of the week hold us lovingly in God's care.
- 9. We keep up our membership in the Church—our friendship with God.
- 8. You will know what times Masses are when your mother asks you to go to Church with her on Mother's Day.
- 7. We will be able to hear some 'good news' (the meaning of the "gospel") every week.

- 3. We are nourished by the full reality of Christ (in the Eucharist, with Christ's Body and Blood), to strengthen us in the virtues of faith, hope, and love-especially love.
- 2. We remember that we are not alone, but have splendid companions to walk with us in this world and a great company of saints praying for us in the next.
- 1. We give thanks and praise to God for ALL God has done for us in Christ, and for ALL God does for us each day and every week.

SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:

This Sunday, Jesus continues His challenging Sermon on the Mount. "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. Give to everyone who asks of you, and from the one who takes what is yours do not demand it back." Words like these are challenging! Many of us have grown up in a culture of independence and retaliation against those who harm us. Today's Gospel reminds us that the way of the world is not necessarily the way of the disciple.


In many spiritual tests, saints describe the first state of the spiritual life as mercenary love of God. That is, we love Him because He "pays" us with graces and good things. Consider for a moment, why do you do the good that you do? Take volunteering, for example, how often do we talk about the good feelings service evokes and how you "get so much more than you give." This is still based on an attitude of return on our investment. Would we volunteer if we knew it was good to do, but we didn't "feel" good afterward? What if the people we helped seemed ungrateful, or if some one at the food pantry stole \$20 out of your purse? It can be difficult to love people when we think we might not get anything back. "For if you love those who love you, what credit is that to you?"

As Christians, we are called to imitate God. We follow a God who loves not as only His closest friends, but who loves betrayers, deniers, and crucifiers. The Christian walk is one of perseverance and sacrifice.

What does your love look like?

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

One of my favorite new singers/songwriters is Noah Kahan. I'm a little biased because, like me, he is originally from Vermont. In a fine song entitled "Stick Season," he sings of his hope to "cancel out the darkness I inherited from dad." This lyric articulates his painful recognition of a dark spiritual "inheritance" from his father, and his hope to be free of it. We all inherit some degree of evil from our earthly forebears. It's easy to feel doomed to repeat their darkness.

But we're not so doomed, thank God. This week's Gospel proclaims this. Whatever good or bad we received from our parents, we have a more definitive and perfect inheritance in God. Jesus commands us, "Be merciful just as your Father is merciful" (Luke 6:36). We have a perfect Father in heaven and are destined to inherit and reflect *that* perfect and merciful love. We have an inheritance of light, not darkness, and thus a whole new possibility of magnanimous love. Like any inheritance, this is a free gift to us.

What are we destined to repeat? Not the darkness of our earthly parents. We are destined to be a reflection of *God's* life. Jesus liberates us from the inevitability of repeating whatever evils and imperfections are in our familial or cultural upbringings. It's time to claim that perfect inheritance.

Contact our US House Representative, Nick Langworthy (Corning office 607-377-3130) and leave this message: I ask you to pass legislation in the Congress that fully funds the WIC program (Women, Infants, Children Supplemental nutrition); expands the Child Tax Credit to cut poverty in families with children; increase funding for global child nutrition programs; help reduce food insecurity on college campuses. Be sure to leave your name and county. This phone call will take a minute or two, but can make a big impact.
