

# THE WITNESSES OF WHAT MAKES NO SENSE:

It never fails to amuse me that the disciples in today's Gospel don't recognize Jesus until He asks them to do something that makes absolutely no logical sense.

He's just some random stranger on the shore — until He gives them an order that, in any other circumstances, would have them rolling their eyes into the backs of their head: Drop the nets again. I know you haven't caught anything all night. I know you're tired. Just do it one more time. Trust Me again, that's when they recognize Him.

The disciples display such poor recognition of Jesus after the resurrection. I'm sure there's a good, theologically sound reason for it, one I am not smart enough to explain. Whatever that reason is, it's very clear that God was carefully orchestrating these moments of realization. He is trying to tell us something about how we recognize the Risen Christ — the One who has conquered sin, the One whose love was stronger than death. The One who never made any sense, and never will, because His kingdom is not of this world, and to understand Him — to recognize Him — you have to detach from the priorities, the expectations, the limitations of this present world.

You have to be willing to do what makes no sense.

Love — again, even when it doesn't make sense. Forgive — again, even when it doesn't make sense. Believe — again, even when it doesn't make sense.

"We are the witnesses of these things," Peter tells the Sanhedrin (Acts 5:32). Peter, who was so full of joy when he recognized Jesus that he leapt into the sea, fully clothed, desperate to be near Him.

It makes no sense, and that's okay. That's kind of our whole thing as Christians. We are the witnesses of the things that make no sense.

### **PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:**

The Easter season is a time of new life and renewed commitment to our Catholic faith. The phrase "Easter Sacraments" reminds us of the promise of the Risen Lord to be with us always, especially in the "breaking of the bread." This weekend, our parish has the special honor of welcoming the extended families and friends of the 16 children who will celebrate their First Holy Communion. At the 5:00 p.m. Mass on Saturday and the 10:30 a.m. Mass on Sunday we invite these young children to the Lord's table for the first time. We extend a warm welcome to all our visitors as well as our regular parishioners to St. Mary Our Mother this weekend.

These First Communion children, their parents and families have been preparing for this day for many months. By their faithful and regular participation at Sunday Mass, our parents have been teaching their children by good example what it means to be fed at the Lord's table when receiving the Body and Blood of Jesus. We congratulate our parents on their on-going efforts of what they promised when their children were baptized; in being the first and best teachers of their children in the ways of the Catholic faith.

It is a wonderful moment in the life of every parish to witness our children coming forth and doing what our Lord has instructed us when receiving the Eucharist. Those of us who receive the Eucharist often can forget who we are receiving or take it for granted and allow it to become routine. Your fine example of participating in Mass and receiving Holy Communion each and every Sunday, regularly and reverently, serves as a "teachable moment" not only for our First Communion children, but for our entire parish family.

Parents and families have helped these children to understand what we believe about the Eucharist. Although the element of bread and wine appear unchanged in the action of the Sacred Liturgy through what we call "transubstantiation," these elements become the very Body and Blood of Christ. As we witness these children receiving communion for the first time, today is a wonderful occasion for our entire parish to renew our commitment to the Risen Christ, and to assert our belief in the real presence of Christ in the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

Please join me in welcoming all who join us for this First Communion weekend. I also want to acknowledge and thank **Lily Barr**, our Faith Formation Coordinator for her dedication, enthusiasm, and wonderful leadership not only for our First Communion but for all our sacramental preparation programs at St. Mary Our Mother. ### TANGIBLE SIGNS OF HOPE

During this Holy Jubilee Year, Pope Francis asks us to be alert to the opportunities to be a *tangible sign of hope* for brothers and sisters who experience hardships of any kind. Pregnant and parenting moms-in-need are in our parishes, our neighborhoods, and in the wider community. As Pope Francis reminds us, our parishes need to be "islands of mercy in the midst of the sea of indifference." 72 million people nationwide rely on Medicaid and the Child Health Insurance Program for health care, this includes many low-income pregnant women, new mothers and their babies/children. Programs like Medicaid help neighbors-in-need access otherwise unaffordable health care—this promotes human dignity and the well-being of our people, especially the children. A healthy population is a national security issue.

Please oppose any proposals that cut or restrict access to Medicaid or the Child Health Insurance Program. Many of our neighbors, especially pregnant women and children, need this health insurance. We are happy that our taxes help our neighbors access health care.
