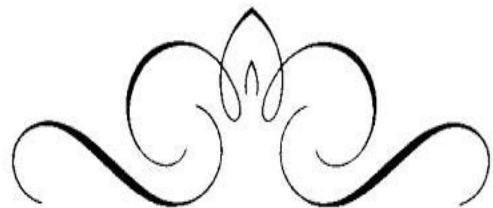
MASS OF THANKSGIVING

The Most Reverend Salvatore R. Matano, Bishop of Rochester, cordially invites the priests, deacons, religious and lay faithful of the Diocese of Rochester to the Diocesan Mass of Thanksgiving for His Holiness, Pope Leo XIV, Monday, May 19, 2025, at 7:00 p.m., at Sacred Heart Cathedral, Rochester.

This Mass is a privileged opportunity for us to unite as a diocesan family, to thank God for our newly elected Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, the 266th successor to Saint Peter and the 267th Vicar of Christ on earth and, at the same time, to express our devotion to and prayerful support of His Holiness as he begins his pontificate.

PRACTICING MERCY LIKE POPE FRANCIS:

The Pope was known for his great love of the poor and suffering. In fact, one of the last things he did was visit a prison on Holy Thursday. He emphasized that every individual deserves respect and love. Because he felt so strongly about mercy, his papal motto was **Miserando atque eligendo** which translates to: “He looked upon him with mercy and chose him.” Here is one of his quotes about God’s mercy: “Jesus’ attitude is striking: we do not hear the words of scorn, we do not hear words of condemnation, but only words of love, of mercy, which are an invitation to conversation. “Neither do I condemn you; go, and do not sin again.” Ah! Brothers and Sisters, God’s face is the face of a merciful father who is always patient. Have you thought about God’s patience, The patience He has with each one of us? That is His mercy. He always has patience, patience with us, He understands us, He waits for us, He does not tire of forgiving us if we are able to return to Him with a contrite heart. “Great is God’s mercy”, say the Psalm. “Pope Francis will be remembered for his constancy in letting us know how much we are loved by God. How can your family be more merciful in your day to day interactions with one another and the world, sharing that immeasurable love? Pope Francis was said to have learned a prayer from his grandmother: **Jesus, make my heart more like yours.** May that be our prayer, as well.



PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

This past week we observed the Week of Prayer for vocations, which began last Sunday. As Catholics, we believe that through our Baptism God has a plan for our lives. God calls some to marriage, some to the ordained ministry as priests and deacons, and others to consecrated religious life as sisters or brothers, and others to live as generous single people. Fully living our own vocation—and teaching young people how to discern God's call—is a serious duty and responsibility, but also a joyful one.

The word "vocation" means "call." As Catholics, we believe God calls individuals to fulfill certain roles in the Church, both for their own holiness, and the good of the entire Church as the people of God. After the decision to follow Christ and seriously pursue holiness, our vocation is the most important decision in life.

Marriage: Most people are called to marriage—to wholeheartedly love their spouses and joyfully welcome children. The purpose of marriage is for each spouse to bring out the best in their partners, help each other to one day reach heaven, and to teach their children to do the same. Like any vocation, marriage must be the discerned, not assumed.

Consecrated Religious Life: Both women and men can join religious communities such as the Franciscans, Dominicans, Benedictines, the Sisters and Brothers of Mercy, the Sisters of St. Joseph, the school Sisters of Notre Dame, etc. The life, ministry and work of religious orders varies greatly—some are primarily devoted to prayer; others work actively in schools, hospitals, orphanages, social services, pastoral ministry, prison and jail ministry, etc. Common to all religious communities are the vows of poverty, chastity and obedience. The Sisters of Charity founded by St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta adds one more vow; that of service to the poor.

Priesthood and Diaconate: Priests bring Jesus to people and people to Jesus through preaching and the sacraments. Priests are active as they counsel people, teach classes, celebrate the liturgy and sacraments, prepare homilies, administer parishes and much more. Some surveys show that priests are the happiest people in the world! Deacons also share in the sacrament of Holy Orders.

Dedicated Single Life: Some people serve God as single people, without marrying or making special promises or vows. Single people "contribute greatly to the good of the human family." (CCC2231) "*Some live their situation in the Spirit of the Beatitudes, serving God and neighbor in exemplary fashion.*" (CCC 1658). There are many single people who serve the Church with incredible generosity.

FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER:

“I give you a new commandment: love one another.” With these words, Jesus sums up the law and the prophets in one concise phrase. Love one another. After 2,000 years, you’d think we’d have it figured out by now! But all too often we fail in this commandment. Perhaps we mistake “love” for mere “common decency.” Perhaps we’ve been betrayed, or our own visions of love have been tarnished or misrepresented in our lives. Blessedly, Jesus doesn’t leave us without a guide.

“As I have loved you, so you also should love one another.” Jesus himself modeled what this love should look like. So what are some of the characteristics of the love of Christ? Humility, for one. St. Paul writes that Jesus “emptied Himself.” In becoming man, Jesus puts aside the full splendor of the godhead. Not only does He become human, but He takes on many of the mundane privations of human life. He spent most of His life in relative poverty—especially by our standards—as a common laborer. When He began gaining popularity as a preacher, He still traveled on foot and spent nights in other people’s homes or outdoors.

Jesus’ love is generous. He was always available to the crowds and to being interrupted by people in need. He invested time in His disciples and patiently taught them about the kingdom of God. The love of Jesus is also courageous. He encountered many people deemed less worthy of human respect, due to being public sinners or having a physical or mental disability. Jesus was brave in breaking these social boundaries to show care and concern to the outcast. These traits are possible for us to imitate! Indeed, we are hardly identifiable as Christians without them. “This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.”

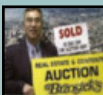
