# **A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT**

In today's Gospel we witness the last evening Jesus spends with His disciples before His death. He has already made it clear that His followers will show their love for Him by serving others. To live that kind of love, they will need the active presence of God in their midst. Jesus tells His disciples that He and His Father will come and make their home with them. He also tells them that the Holy Spirit will be among them to teach them and remind them of all that Jesus had taught. Good stewards recognize that God is in their midst and that the Holy Spirit is guiding them. How often do we acknowledge God's presence in our lies? How often do we allow the Holy Spirit to guide us?

#### **PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:**

The Memorial Day weekend has arrived! This weekend is more than just a three or four day holiday that marks the beginning of summer, and all the seasonal opportunities that the beginning of summer has to offer. This weekend is also a time for us to reflect and remember the many women and men who have given the ultimate gift of their life for our freedom, our country and its citizenry. Whenever we visit a cemetery (and I hope you will take the time to visit a cemetery this Memorial Day weekend), we often think of the massive loss of American lives that have been sacrificed for our country. President John F. Kennedy, (whose 108th birthday is Thursday) once said that the value of society is not measured by what it has done, but by how it remembers. If America's sons and daughters are willing to march, fight and die for their country, then the least we can do is to remember. And remember we do, each Memorial Day.

If anything positive resulted from the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks, it has been an increased awareness of patriotism for our country and a deeper appreciation and respect for those who serve our country, risking their lives in protecting us and our way of life. Whether it is the spontaneous recognition in an airport given to troops arriving home from military deployment, or the more organized and public recognition offered by various groups and organizations to honor the military, each of these occasions are particularly touching and heartwarming. One incident I recall focused on a military honoree who was a staff sergeant, who had served one tour of duty in Iraq and two in Afghanistan. As the public address announcer read a statement summarizing the staff sergeant's military career, the spectators in the stadium, one by one, including players, coaches, umpires, broadcasters, media members, came to their feet and broke into thunderous applause. By the time the public address announcer announced his name, everyone was standing and applauding wildly, many with tears of appreciation in their eyes. True to form, the sergeant simply acknowledged this tribute with a grateful wave.

It has been said that heroes are those people who are willing to put their lives on the line for what they believe, be it principles, a family, a country, a world. A person does not have to die to be a hero, but death does seem to be the crown of heroism. Memorial Day does not glorify death, nor does it encourage sacrifice. But it is a call to remember those whom we promise to remember. This Memorial Day, I encourage you to take some time to remember. I hope you will offer a prayer to God to watch over and protect the women and men of today's military who are serving throughout the world. I hope you will ask God to embrace those who have made the ultimate sacrifice with peace and life in the Kingdom; those people we have promised never to forget. And I hope you will offer a prayer of gratitude for those people who serve us on a daily basis along with our military,

Retrouvaille simply means "rediscovery." This program offers the chance to rediscover yourself, your spouse and a loving relationship in your marriage.

Retrouvaille (pronounced retro-vi) is designed to help troubled marriages regain their health. It helps spouses uncover or re-awaken the love, trust and commitment that originally brought them together. Where there are hurts, it can take away the resentment which gets in the way of healing. It can be a helpful supplement to an addiction program though it is not a recovery program in itself. It is Catholic in nature but open to couples of all faiths or backgrounds.

This world-wide program is in 27 countries and has been in Rochester for over 35 years. It has even helped separated or divorced couples who want to try again.

# FEEL GOOD ADVISE FROM SOME WHO HAVE GONE BEFORE US:

*"How wonderful it is that nobody need wait a single moment before starting to improve the world."* Anne Frank spent nearly two years in hiding with her family during World War II where she kept a diary chronicling what happened in the Secret Annex. Her entries offer great quotes and sayings that reveal her rich inner life and show that she never lost her faith in people even in one of modern history's darkest moments.

"If you hear a voice within you say 'you cannot paint," then by all means paint and that voice will be silenced." Dutch artist Vincent Van Gogh painted images with bold colors and textures that contrasted with the dark moods he felt during bouts with mental illness. He didn't let the strong emotions prevent him from creating great works of art, living his belief that people should create even when they don't feel like doing anything.

*"Every strike brings me closer to the next home run."* Babe Ruth remains one of the best known baseball players of all time. He earned a spot in the Baseball Hall of Fame during its inaugural year, in part, because he didn't let disappointment and mistakes hold him back from playing the game.


