




A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT: The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ:

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

This is the season for graduations! Many of the colleges and universities have already held their commencement exercises in late April, May, and early in the month of June. This past Wednesday, we held the Sixth Grade Celebration for Saint Mary Our Mother School in church, and last Friday, the 2025 graduating class from Notre Dame High School held their commencement exercises. The senior class from Horseheads High School will hold their graduation ceremonies on Wednesday, June 25th. The graduating classes from Elmira High School, Thomas A. Edison, Odessa-Montour, and the Corning/Painted Post Schools, will be holding their commencement exercises as well. We offer all graduates, whether they be from colleges, universities, high school, middle, and elementary schools, our congratulations and best wishes! As members of our parish community, we are proud of you and grateful for the love and support your parents, families, and church community have given you.

This is also the time of year when those who serve in leadership positions of the Church are celebrating anniversaries of their service to the People of God. In the May issue of the *Catholic Courier*, many priests and deacons were listed. Among them were a number of these jubilarians with connections to our local community. Among them are Father Walter L. Wainwright, retired pastor of the former Blessed Sacrament Parish in Elmira. Father Wainwright is celebrating his sixteeth year of ordination to the priesthood. Father Wainwright served as pastor of the combined parishes of St. Anthony/St. Patrick/Ss. Peter & Paul, from 2000-2009. Father continues to live in Elmira and occasionally assists at the Most Holy Name of Jesus parish in Elmira. His classmate, Father Daniel F. Holland is also celebrating sixty years as a priest. Father Holland served as pastor of St. Patrick in Elmira from 1979 to 1992, during which time the interior of the church was extensively renovated. I had the pleasure of serving with Father Holland from 1982 to 1987. Father Holland resides at the St. Ann Community in Rocester, and continues to offer pastoral assistance at St. Ann. The other priest marking sixty years of ordained service is **Father John T. Reif**, pastor emeritus of St. Rita parish in Webster. Fathers Wainwright, Holland, and Reif were ordained by Bishop James E. Kearney on June 5, 1965, at Sacred Heart Cathedral in Rochester. Father William F. Laird, who served here at St. Mary Our Mother with Father O'Brien from 1981-1983, is celebrating his fiftieth anniversary. Father Laird was ordained by Bishop Joseph L. Hogan on May 2, 1975, at the Church of the Blessed Sacrament in Rochester. Father Laird has served as the Officialis of the Diocesan Tribunal, and is currently the pastor of St. Matthew parish in Livonia, and St. Mary parish in Honeoye. Other priests celebrating fifty years of ordained service include Father Stephen R. Kraus, Father August Deasio, and Father Theodore J. Auble.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

The Most Holy Body and Blood of ChristLuke 9:11-17

A Catholic friend of mine occasionally says, "The Eucharist is not a noun. It's a verb." In so saying, he is making the point that the Eucharist isn't simply Jesus' bodily presence given to us in holy Communion. It also manifests the dynamic pattern by which Christ actively loves and saves us. He teaches us to cooperate with that pattern. This Eucharist actually embodies four verbs: Jesus takes, blesses, breaks, and gives. Let's consider each one.

He takes: Do we acknowledge that we are totally in God's hands? Do we receive everything in our lives as a gift, and act responsibly with it?

He blesses: Do we actively reflect that Jesus makes us holy in our baptism? Do we embrace our bodies and souls as temples of God, worthy of love, peace, and joy?

He breaks: Do we run from failure and disappointment, from getting old or being ignored? Are we too worried about getting hurt or sick? Do we embrace our sufferings with confidence?

He gives: Are we willing to make our lives a gift for others? Are we confident that we will always have enough love to give to others, that God will always provide enough for us? Do we rejoice in giving away what we have to others, expecting nothing in return? This is the dynamic life the Eucharist empowers us to live.
