

PRACTICING CATHOLIC – BENEATH THE

Mini Reflection: People have a lot of opinions about God. But when the world asks, "Who do you say that Jesus is?" We know the answer. Will we speak up?

At first, the Apostles try to dodge the question.

When Jesus confronts them — and make no mistake, it is a confrontation — with the question "Who do you say that I am?" they act like a man whose wife has just asked him if she looks fat in these jeans.

The evasiveness of their answer puts politicians to shame: "Some say John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets."


But Jesus doesn't let them off easy. He repeats himself. He wants an answer. "Who do you say that I am?"

They all know the answer. They all believe the answer. And they all know the answer could get them thrown in prison or killed. Only Peter is brave enough to say it: "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God."

People have a lot of opinions about God. They always have. They have a lot of opinions about Jesus and the Bible, about the Catholic Church and the Pope. Some of these opinions are well-founded, well-researched. Some of them are based in ignorance. Many are born of painful misunderstandings. But they are all just that: opinions.

We know who Jesus is. We know who the Eucharist is. We know what the truth is. Amid the chaos and the violence and the excruciating loudness of this fallen world and all the words it shouts into the void about God and Jesus and right and wrong, we know.

But will we answer?



PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

The month of June has been a month of celebrations. We have witnessed celebrations of graduations, weddings, and anniversaries. Four of the five Sudays this month have seen us celebrate a different feast of the Church calendar. With the way these feasts fall this year, it gives us a special opportunity to think about some of the great elements of our faith and two very important figures in Catholic faith tradition.

All of these feasts are called a "solemnity," which is the highest ranking feast of the Church's liturgical year. The first of these special feasts was the Solemnity of Pentecost, which we celebrated on June 8th, where we celebrated the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit to the early Church. One week later, we celebrated the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, acknowledging the belief that we have a God who reveals Himself to us in three divine persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Last week, we celebrated the Solemnity of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This feast calls us to remember the presence of Christ in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. We believe that Christ is present to us in many ways: through His Word, through the praying community, through His ministers, and in all the sacraments. But Christ is uniquely and completely present in the Sacrament of His Body and Blood.

Because June 29th falls on a Sunday this year, provides us the opportunity o celebrate the fourth special feast, the **Solemnity of Saints Peter & Paul.** These two important saints of the early Church are celebrated together to demonstrate the unity of our apostolic faith, although they were not always in agreement when they lived, as was evidenced in the Act of the Apostles. As we are reminded today, "each in a different way gathered together the one family of Christ." St. Peter was the first to acknowledge Jesus as the Messiah of God and was appointed "the Rock" of the early Church community, and Paul, who was an outstanding preacher of the gospel to many nations. Today's feast reminds us of the very beginnings or our faith, and the firm foundation on which our faith is built.

Friday of this week we will commemorate the 249th anniversary of the ratification of the Declaration of Independence, a day to thank God for our nation that began on July 4, 1776. Our nation has offered a quality of life unparalleled in history to so many people. It has brought freedom unimagined of by earlier generations. We know that, like every nation, we are not perfect and do not always live up to the ideals and principles of our founding fathers. We have yet to fully enshrine in our culture and society a right to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness for all citizens, especially those most vulnerable among us—the sick, the unborn, immigrants, and those who have special challenges of mind and body. In America, we can achieve these goals by working together. We are a nation of believers, dreamers, and builders, capable of much good that makes life better for others.


