GOSPEL MEDITATION: The Exaltation of the Holy Cross John 3:13-17

One of my favorite movies is the 1991 comedy "What About Bob?" Bill Murray plays a troubled, paranoid hypochondriac named Bob Wiley who innocently but annoyingly hounds Dr. Leo Marvin, played by Richard Dreyfuss. Bob is paralyzed by his fear of, well, everything, and is convinced the psychologist can heal him. But Dr. Marvin's failed attempts to heal Bob end up driving the doctor to attempt to murder Bob. He fails. The surprise is that, having faced death head on, Bob is suddenly healed. He attributes his healing to Dr. Marvin for break-through "death therapy." In facing the cause of his deepest illness and dysfunction, Bob is healed. Underneath this light-hearted comedy is a dead-serious resonance with this week's feast: the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Christ is lifted up on the cross to force us to face the truth of sin and death. In that reckoning we find healing. Like Moses' snake on a pole, the cross says: this is what is causing your sickness – rebellion, disobedience, sin. Look at it! Don't run from it. Now seeing it exposed, we see life. We see our physician mercifully healing us. In this sense, we are all like Bob Wiley. The "death therapy" of the cross is our only hope for healing.

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

With the beginning of school earlier this month, the more relaxed days of summer have come to an end, with many families returning to a more routine and structured way to our daily living. One characteristic of this more routine way of living for many our families could mean more family dinners around the dinner table and less eating "on the run." While it may not be possible for the entire family to gather each evening, making it a priority at least one night can prove beneficial.

The following is entitled "When Back to School means "Back to Family Dinner Table", which offers much "food for thought!"

Everyone should know certain nights are family dinner.

Whether frozen pizza or prime rib, set the table nicely and sit down. Maybe light a dinner candle or pull out the cloth napkins now and then. (what are you saving them for?) Select a special dessert once in a while.

Parents and children often hit dinner hour fatigued.

Make an effort to relax. Start off with a smile and laughter, even when you'd rather hit the couch.

If you haven't already, begin the family custom of praying before meals in a spontaneous way. What was I most grateful for today? Where did I see a situation today that calls for prayer? Let everyone take a brief turn. It may lead to a great conversation after the "amen."

Resist scolding or criticizing a child at dinner. Never demand to know why the math paper wasn't turned in, or why the child did not get out of bed on time. Save it for a private discussion later. Allow the dinner table to be a place of welcome and support.

Share the ups and downs of your day. Listen respectfully to their exploits and complaints.

As you review the day's events, don't forget God. Just as you are interested in what your children are reading in literature class or library hour, express an interest in what's being taught in religion class or in weekly faith formation.

Set the rule that everyone remains seated until all are finished. Then the meal is complete.

But the work is not done. Divide the duties of setting the table, clearing, washing, even cooking so that every one has a role to play and the work goes quickly.

Bring back the custom of an "after dinner" prayer, brief and blessed.
