PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

It is hard to believe that Halloween is this Friday, and the next day begins the month of November. November is a month when we are invited to "remember," beginning with All Saints Day, followed by All Souls Day next Sunday. Ordinarily a holyday of obligation, because All Saints Day falls on a Saturday this year, there is no obligation for Catholics to participate at Mass. We will have our annual Mass of Remembrance, next Sunday at the 10:30 a.m. Mass, where we will remember those who have passed since November, 2024. November 11th is Veteran's Day, a time to remember all our veterans who have served our nation so faithfully. The fourth Thursday of November we celebrate Thanksgiving Day, which gives us an opportunity to gather with family and friends to offer thanks for all we have. November invites us to remember the past and live for the future, even as we are living in the most challenging of times.

A popular song that our children often sing on **All Saints Day** is entitled "Sing a Song to the Saints." The song mentions a number of the more popular saints of our faith tradition by name, with a refrain inviting us to "sing a song to the saints." All Saints Day is a time to honor the women and men whose lives were marked with holiness of knowing, loving, and serving God throughout their earthly life. This day reminds us that holiness is a virtue for all of us—not just those who have been formally recognized to be so by the Church, but all who have loved God's call the best they can.

Every year on All Saints Day, I recall the occasions when the Litany of Saints is sung and prayed during the liturgy. At the Easter Vigil, we are invited to sing this litany just before the elect are baptized. For those in Holy Orders, the singing of this litany brings back memories of their ordination. Before the bishop imposes hands on the candidate, he lies prostrate on the floor of the church, while the congregation joins the saints in the Kingdom, praying for the soon-to-be—ordained. This litany calls out for assistance and guidance, reminding us that we are not only a part of the Church here on earth, but a heavenly church as well.

Sunday, November 2nd, we commemorate the **Feast of All Souls.** While not a day when we are obliged to attend Mass—an exception this year as All Souls is on a Sunday—this day invites us to pray for all the faithful departed. It is a day to remember deceased family members and friends. I often think of all the former priests, religious, and family members who sacrificed to build our church, school, and campus, who prayed, built community here, and truly loved the people. Think of the many funerals we have celebrated here. How often have we remembered and called upon our ancestors in faith to help, guide, and be with us in these most challenging times? All Souls Day invites us to remember and pray

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE

DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

October 26, 2025

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Luke 18:9-14

Every now and then readers of these reflections write letters in which they object to something. Years ago, this Gospel of Luke 18 prompted such an email. A man wrote to me: "I find it deeply offensive that you suggest we are still sinners once we are God's sons and daughters." His objection stirred in me a profound awareness of the paradox at the heart of our faith. Are we sinners or beloved children of God?

In this Gospel (Luke 18:9-14), a tax collector appears as one who has missed the mark. His sins have isolated him. His breast-beating is not an act of self-flagellation for pride's sake but a heartfelt admission of his failure and unworthiness. Remarkably, Jesus honors the candid humility of the parable's penitent. Why? Because we are always in need of mercy, always. But even more, perhaps because on the cross, Jesus will fully embrace a similar place of humiliation and rejection. He will enter into the most shameful, offensive place of the sinner so that we might "go home justified."

There is a sacred tension in admitting that we are sinners and yet have profound hope. We are beloved sons and daughters of God, growing precisely through our honest acceptance of failure. When we cry, "Have mercy on us," during Mass or when we repeat the "Jesus Prayer" in quiet moments, or in the confessional, we embrace our imperfections as fertile ground for divine grace. In doing so, we follow Christ's example — finding true exaltation in the humble acknowledgment of our human frailty.

The Catholic take on Halloween is that it has Catholic roots as "All Hallows' Eve," the Vigil of All Saints' Day, and can be celebrated with caution. While modern celebrations are often secular, the Church encourages focusing on the holiday's Christian significance—honoring saints, remembering the faithful departed, and celebrating Christ's victory over death. It is acceptable for Catholics to participate in activities like trick-ortreating and costume parties, as long as they avoid glorifying evil, violence, or pagan rituals and exercise moderation.

Heavenly Father, we pray for all children as they celebrate this Halloween. Keep them safe as they go out trick -or-treating, guiding their steps and protecting them from all harm. We pray in Jesus name, AMEN!
