THE 36TH ANNUAL Advent Service of Lessons & Carols will be held at the First United Methodist Church on Sunday, December 7th at 5:00 p.m. The church address is 1034 West Broad Street. Once again our choirs and guests from other area churches will be joining together to present a wonderful experience of scripture readings, carols and songs. This service is guaranteed to put your heart and soul into the right place for Christmas. Mark your calendars and plan to spend time reveling in the joy of the Advent/Christmas season.

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

We have arrived at the **Second Sunday of Advent.**Each year, Advent presents us with an invitation and challenge to take some time during these extremely busy and hectic December days to slow down and to be more aware of God's presence among us. Years ago, **St. John the Baptist** preached this message and encouraged people to listen to his message as he proclaimed to people of his time for the coming of Jesus. Advent is a season of anticipation, joy, and hope that comes from the knowledge that God is in our midst. During these days, I would encourage you to allow God to comfort you and to help relieve any anxiety that you might be experiencing that prevents you from fully entering into the joy of the season.

Many of you may remember the late **Father Joseph F. Hogan.** Father Hogan served as the pastor of St. Vincent De Paul Church in Corning from 1964-1983. Father Hogan also served as the first chaplain at Notre Dame High School from 1955-1961. Upon his retirement, Father Hogan came to live at St. Patrick Church, **Elmira**, with the then pastor, **Father Daniel F. Holland** and me. When he was assigned to be the homilist for the weekend Masses during the season of Advent, St. Patrick had four weekend Masses, (all parishes in Chemung County had 4-5 Masses in those days—how times have changed!) Father Hogan would include the following poem in his homily. I am not sure of the author, but it is entitled:

I Promise: My Christmas Pledge:

- 1. I promise to make my Christmas a holy day with Christ—not a holyday without Him.
- 2. I promise to observe Christmas as the birthday of Christ—not a day to give and receive just material gifts.
- 3. I promise to remember that the real symbols of Christmas are the Star, the Stable, and the Crib—not Santa and his reindeer.
- 4. I promise to teach my children that "Santa Claus" is the nickname for Saint Nicholas, who gave to the poor, in honor of Christ.
- I promise to help one poor family—in honor of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, the poor and homeless family of Bethlehem.
- 6. I promise to send Christmas cards remindful of Jesus, the infant Savior—not decorated only with candy canes, gold, ribbons, and wreaths.
- 7. I promise to make room in my home for Christ—with a Christmas Crib—to remind me that He was born in a stable.
- 8. I promise during this season, in a special way, to honor Mary, His mother—who kept the first Christmas vigil beside the manger.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Dec. 7, 2025 Second Sunday of Advent Matthew 3:1-12

This week we hear that John the Baptist is out in the wilderness eating "locusts and wild honey" (Mark 1:6). It's not just a strange historical detail. It's a symbolic expression of a healthy spiritual diet. The path to Christ includes both the hard and the beautiful, the gritty and the sweet. We have to learn to gulp the locusts and savor the honey.

I remember working with a young couple preparing for marriage. They were sincere, but raw — barely beginning to discover faith. Part of me wanted to rush them ahead, to fill in all the gaps, to bombard them with scripture and church documents. I swallowed that instinct. It was like eating locusts. But I also recall them light up as they spoke about each other, about their first child, then their second. And they wanted to be close to God. Something innocent and beautiful was unfolding. That was the honey. I knew God was asking me to savor it.

This Advent, maybe we're each being invited to accept both locusts and honey. Maybe it's time to stop avoiding the difficult parts of faith — prayer that feels dry, the call to repentance, the patience with the trouble-some. It's time to eat some locusts.

But we also need to notice the small gifts God gives us: a peaceful moment, a good conversation, the joy of serving someone else, new life, good intentions of our friends.

That's the honey. Savor it!

John didn't avoid either. He took it all in. And so can we. What are your locusts? Your honey? If we let God feed us with both, we'll be ready — really ready — for the coming of Christ.

CHRISTMAS CARING PROGRAM:

As the Christmas season of giving and caring approaches, the Social Ministry committee invites you to participate in our Christmas Caring Program. As in the past years, we will be doing this in partnership with the Horseheads Food Pantry, which supplies food assistance to needy families in Chemung County. This year, as well as in past years, our school children and their families will be assisting us with food collection.

We invite you to participate in this local outreach in one or more of the following ways:

Making a monetary donation so the pantry can supply meat and fresh food for the Christmas meal and the holiday week. Envelopes will be provided for this purpose on the tables near the doors of the church. The special envelopes can then be placed in the regular collection baskets or brought to the parish office.

Increasing our donations of canned and dried food to the vestibule food cart so the pantry clients have healthy and adequate food for the Christmas holidays.

Bringing a Christmas ornament that you offer to a needy family. You would hang the ornament on our Christmas Caring tree in the back of the church. The ornaments will be taken each week to the pantry so the families and children can choose an ornament as a reminder of our care for them.

Purchasing a book for a child (toddler through grade 5). Books should be placed in the bookbag by the wall near the trees or in the bag in the vestibule of the church.

This program will kicked off on November 22-23 donations envelopes are available in the vestibule, and the Christmas Caring tree is standing proudly in the back of the church awaiting your ornaments. The program will conclude the weekend of December 13-14.

In this time when so many families are facing financial insecurity, please join us in spreading joy and showing love and concern for our neighbors in need. We thank you for your consideration.
