**PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:**

This past week's celebration of Catholic Schools Week also marked the beginning of registration for students currently enrolled at Saint Mary Our Mother School for the 2026-2027 academic year. Registration for all new students for our school will begin on Monday, February 9<sup>th</sup>. If you know of families who have children three years of age through the sixth grade this coming September, now is the time to contact the school for further information.

The following are some *"Did You Know"* facts about Saint Mary Our Mother School:

*We offer pre-school for children ages 3 and 4, as well as elementary education and faith Based education through grade six, (these formative years provide the strongest educational foundation for our children), facilitating the importance of life-long learning.*

*We promote the intellectual, personal, social, and spiritual growth of each student.*

*We provide a safe and welcoming, yet challenging and loving faith based environment for children of all faiths. (15 % of our current families who have chosen St. Mary Our Mother School actively practice a faith other than Catholicism).*

*Our current enrollment is 117 students, and enrollment trends indicate increasing enrollment likely for the next decade.*

*A multi-cultural student body, with children from numerous ethnic/racial backgrounds.*

*Such an environment instills acceptance and appreciation for all people, and encourages our children to focus on things we have in common.*

*Character traits of respect, kindness, trustworthiness, fairness, responsibility, and citizenship are taught to every student every day, helping instill these traits and values in each student. Each day begins with prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance; each day concludes with prayer and reflection.*

*Our faculty and staff are dedicated, caring, and effective people, many with multiple New York State certifications while remaining active with their ongoing professional development. Several of our staff have enrolled their children here because they have seen the academic successes St. Mary Our Mother School provides.*

## JANUARY IS POVERTY AWARENESS MONTH

Catholic teaching urges that we continually call on our elected officials to prioritize policies that protect the poor and most vulnerable. In 2025, the US Catholic Bishops addressed components of the One Big Beautiful Bill Act insisting that it will have ongoing and devastating consequences for the poorest people in our country. The federal bill cut funding for SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) which will result in millions going hungry, while cuts to Medicaid could cause 10 million people to lose their health insurance over the next decade according to reports from the Congressional Budget Office. One way we can stand in solidarity with our brothers and sisters in need is by advocating for just national policies. Challenge: Call our Congressman Nick Langworthy (607-377-3130)- ask him to help lift vulnerable families out of poverty by strengthening food assistance and other federal safety net programs and ensure adequate funding for programs that promote the common

### What Is a Mass Intention?

A Mass intention is a specific petition for which the Mass is offered. Mass intentions, also known as Mass cards, can be requested on behalf of another living person—for example, the healing of someone sick or to commemorate a wedding anniversary. However, Mass intentions are most commonly offered in remembrance of a person who has died.

### Offering a Mass Card For the Deceased

It may seem counterintuitive to offer a Mass intention for a person who has died, as their time on earth is finished. However, the practice of offering Mass intentions for the deceased relates to the Catholic belief in purgatory.

As Catholics, we believe souls who die in a state of sin go through a purification process before entering heaven. We offer Masses for our deceased loved ones to aid them in their journeys to heaven. We pray with hope that the graces imparted by the Mass will usher them further towards eternity with God.

It is especially important to pray for the dead, as they can no longer pray for themselves. Pope Francis said that offering the celebration of the Eucharist for the dead “is the best spiritual help that we can give to their souls, particularly to the most abandoned ones.”

## DIOCESE OF ROCHESTER PERMENENT DIACONATE

The deacon is a man of faith, who is called from the community that already recognizes his dedication to service. He makes a lifetime commitment to serving the People of God by proclaiming the Word, assisting and presiding at liturgies, and ministering in the areas of charity and social justice. A deacon gives witness to his availability to the community by addressing present and emerging needs of the Church. The Diocese is inviting interested men of strong and active faith, who can demonstrate a record of service in the communities in which they live, work and worship, who may wish to explore a possible call to ordained ministry as a permanent deacon, to first speak with their pastor for an initial conversation. They may also contact Deacon Edward Giblin, Director of the Office of the Permanent Diaconate, at [edward.giblin@dor.org](mailto:edward.giblin@dor.org), for additional information. A potential candidate must be at least 35 years of age and no older than 62 years of age at the time of ordination after a five (5) year period of formation. He must be in good health, emotionally mature, have stable relationships and must have the wholehearted support of his wife (if married) and family to enter the phase of inquiry. Because the parish is the primary experience of Church for most inquirers, the parish community is asked as well to invite from among its members men who exhibit strong faith and a spirit of service and encourage them to consider a possible vocation to the permanent diaconate. The Diocese anticipates that the next formation class will begin in Fall 2027, with the application process beginning in early 2027.
