

**LENTEN DISCIPLINES OF FASTING & ABSTINANCE**

Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays of Lent.

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE:

Wednesday of this week is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the season of Lent. This season is a sacred time for all Christians, leading to the celebration of Easter. For those preparing to celebrate the sacraments of Christian initiation at Easter as well as those preparing to be received into full communion in the Church, Lent is a time of prayer and preparation for those sacraments. For those who regularly participate in the life of the Church, the season of Lent offers us an opportunity to embrace the Lenten disciplines of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving, so that we can recommit ourselves to living fully our baptismal promises which we will renew on Easter Sunday. For those who have been away from the Church for whatever reason, Lent is a time to reconsider renewing that relationship once again. Most of us know someone in this latter category, so please offer a word of encouragement and invitation to them. We hear a great deal about the "New Evangelization" that is needed in today's church. The process of Evangelization begins with a word of encouragement and welcome. Wherever you find yourself in your faith journey, please use this Lent as a time of spiritual growth and renewal.

Today's bulletin provides information on Lenten opportunities available to you at St. Mary Our Mother, as well as a Lenten calendar for your use at home.

For the past years, we have offered publications for your spiritual growth through the Lenten season. Two of these you are familiar with. The first is "*The Word Among Us*," which Offers a complete liturgical guide for the Lenten season, including scripture readings, Mass texts, and meditations. The second publication is "*The Little Black Book for Lent*," which offers unique readings, meditations, and reflections for each day of Lent. There is a children's version of this book entitled "*The Little Purple Book for Lent*," which will be distributed to our children in both our school and faith formation programs. These books are available on the table in the vestibule.

A traditional devotion of the Church during the Lenten season is the public praying of the **Stations of the Cross**. We will publicly pray the Stations each Friday with the children from St. Mary Our Mother School at 1:15 p.m. (except February 20th) and again at 5:15 p.m. in the chapel. I invite you and your family to join us. We also have a long standing practice of the sixth grade students from our school taking leadership roles in offering a rendition of the "*Living Stations of the Cross*." The Living Stations will be offered on **Wednesday, April 13** at 1:15 and 5:15 p.m. The Living Stations will replace the Stations on Friday of that week.

CRS, Rice Bowl, and Lent

Catholic Relief Services was started in 1943 by the bishops of the United States to aid refugees and survivors of World War II. Today it has expanded its mission to become the official international agency of the Catholic Church. Today it sends trained, professional workers to over 100 countries across the globe. Their relief and development programs address health, education, agriculture, emergency response services, micro-finance of small businesses, and peacebuilding. Wherever CRS goes, it works to create a world in which people live as one human family.

CRS gets its funds from grants, donations, and fund-raising activities, such as Lenten Rice Bowl. Ninety-three percent of the funds go directly to the projects while only 7% is used by management, administration, and fundraising costs. It holds an A+ rating from CharityWatch. CRS keeps 75% of your Rice Bowl donations to support their overseas programs, but returns 25% to help fight hunger and poverty in our own local area of Chemung County.

CRS Global Fellows are Roman Catholic priests and deacons that are trained to work with and witness to the good works that CRS is doing with the world's most vulnerable people. They journey to villages to work along CRS workers and meet the people in the villages where they serve. CRS has over 75 Global Fellows in the US. Here in the Diocese of Rochester we are fortunate to have two diocesan deacons who are global fellows, both of whom have visited and delivered homilies here in our church in the past few years

CRS Lenten calendars and rice bowls will be available in our church starting Ash Wednesday. In weeks to come, our bulletin will feature articles about the work of CRS overseas in Ghana, Guatemala, and Timor Leste. Visit the crsricebowl.org website for lots more information. **DIOCESE OF ROCHESTER
PERMENENT DIACONATE**

The deacon is a man of faith, who is called from the community that already recognizes his dedication to service. He makes a lifetime commitment to serving the People of God by proclaiming the Word, assisting and presiding at liturgies, and ministering in the areas of charity and social justice. A deacon gives witness to his availability to the community by addressing present and emerging needs of the Church. The Diocese is inviting interested men of strong and active faith, who can demonstrate a record of service in the communities in which they live, work and worship, who may wish to explore a possible call to ordained ministry as a permanent deacon, to first speak with their pastor for an initial conversation. They may also contact Deacon Edward Giblin, Director of the Office of the Permanent Diaconate, at edward.giblin@dor.org for additional information. A potential candidate must be at least 35 years of age and no older than 62 years of age at the time of ordination after a five (5) year period of formation. He must be in good health, emotionally mature, have stable relationships and must have the wholehearted support of his wife (if married) and family to enter the phase of inquiry. Because the parish is the primary experience of Church for most inquirers, the parish community is asked as well to invite from among its members men who exhibit strong faith and a spirit of service and encourage them to consider a possible vocation to the permanent diaconate. The Diocese anticipates that the next formation class will begin in Fall 2027, with the application process beginning in early 2027.

ST. MARY OUR MOTHER SCHOOL:**Presidents' Day Recess – February 16th–20th**


