LENTEN REGULATIONS

During Lent, the regulations for fast and abstinence are: all Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence, as is Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting;

All persons who are fourteen years of age or older are bound by the law of abstinence;

All persons between the ages of 18 and 59, inclusive, are bound by the law of fasting;

Catholics are especially encouraged to perform acts of penance during the season of Lent.

Abstinence - refrain from eating meat at all meals that day:

Fasting - only one full meal, the other two meals small enough that together they do not equal one full meal.

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and continues through to Holy Thursday. Good Friday has its own rule of fast and abstinence.

The non-refundable registration fee is \$150 per family. Both before and after school care are available. PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

Wednesday of this week is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the season of Lent. This season is a sacred time for all Christians, leading to the celebration of Easter. For those preparing to celebrate the sacraments of Christian Initiation at Easter as well as those preparing to be received into full membership in the Church, it is a time of prayer and preparation for those sacraments. For those who regularly participate in the life of the church, the season of Lent offers us an opportunity to embrace the Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving, so that we can recommit ourselves to living fully our baptismal promises which we will renew on Easter Sunday. For those who have been away from the Church for whatever reason. Lent is a time to re-consider establishing that relationship once again. If you know someone in this latter category, please offer them a word of encouragement, invitation and welcome to our parish. We hear a great deal about the "New-Evangelization" that is needed in today's church. Any evangelization starts with a word of welcome and encouragement. Wherever you find yourself on your journey of faith, please use Lent as a time of spiritual growth and renewal.

The front page of this bulletin provides information on opportunities available to you on a parish level for the Lenten season. A Lenten calendar for your use at home is included in this bulletin. There are also copies of the regional Lenten schedule of activities.

For the last few years, we have offered a number of publications for your use during the Lenten season. Two of these you are familiar with. The first is "The Word Among Us," which is a complete liturgical guide for the Lenten season including scripture readings, Mass texts, and meditations. The second publication is "The Little Book for Lent," which offers unique meditations for each day of Lent. There is also a children's version of the book which we will be distributing to our children in both our school and faith formation programs. Another booklet available to you contains the wisdom of Pope Francis I, entitled "With Your Whole Heart." Each day offers a quotation and meditation from Pope Francis, as well as a recommended scripture reading, usually taken from the Mass of that day. These should provide ample spiritual reading for you during this Lenten season.

One of the traditional Lenten devotions found in parishes during the Lenten season is the public praying of the **Stations of the Cross**. We will publicly pray this devotion each Friday at 5:30 p.m. in the chapel. Each Friday that St. Mary Our Mother School is in session, our school children will gather in the chapel at 1:30 p.m. for this devotion. I invite you and your family to join us Fridays during Lent for this traditional devotion. In addition, the sixth grade students from St. Mary Our Mother School will offer their the "Living Stations of the Cross" in the church on Friday, April 5th, at 1:30 and 5:30 p.m.

Have a great week and a great Lenten season. See you in church - on Ash Wednesday, and often during the season of Lent!

EVERY DAY STEWARDSHIP

I was traveling recently and watched as a wife led her blind husband onto the plane by her arm. She lovingly helped him into his seat and made sure he was comfortable. She placed their bags above in the bin and then sat next to him. They were ready for the flight. As I sat in my seat just a few rows away, I wondered what he would do if she ever left his side.

Sometimes those we love in our life can be blind, and we need to be their eyes. They aren't physically blind, but they are unable to see the truth about their life, situation, or needs. We need to lend them our sight and insight, or they will remain in their world of darkness.

Jesus asked His disciples, "Can a blind person guide a blind person?" If we aren't actively working to be sure that we can see clearly, what will we be able to offer someone we care about when they come to us with their blindness? Can you lead someone to Christ if you aren't living a life with Him yourself? Can you share with another truth if you aren't concerned with knowing the truth yourself?

Life is not always easy. Without faith, hope, and love, the road can be too hard to travel. We are not created to be alone. Instead, we are created to be traveling companions. However, the blind cannot lead the blind. May the Light of Christ dispel your darkness and give you sight so that when the call comes, you might lend an arm to lead the blind.


