You are cordially invited to attend today's Rite of Election.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

During Lent, the regulations for fast and abstinence are: **all Fridays of Lent** are days of **abstinence**, as is **Ash Wednesday**. **Ash Wednesday and Good Friday** are days of **fasting**;

All persons who are fourteen years of age or older are bound by the law of abstinence;

All persons between the ages of 18 and 59, inclusive, are bound by the law of fasting;

Catholics are especially encouraged to perform acts of penance during the season of Lent.

Abstinence - refrain from eating meat at all meals that day;

Fasting - only one full meal, the other two meals small enough that together they do not equal one full meal.

The season of Lent began on Ash Wednesday and continues through to Holy Thursday. Good Friday has its own rule of fast and abstinence.

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

Today we welcome Bishop Salvatore Matano as he presides at the **Rite of Election** at 1:00 p.m., for all RCIA catechumen, candidates, sponsors, and their families from our neighboring parishes throughout the Southern Tier and Finger Lakes regions. Following the Rite of Election, a reception will be held in O'Brien Hall and the school gymnasium. You are cordially invited to attend the Rite of Election service as well as today's reception.

Wednesday of this week will be a diocesan **Day of Penance and Mercy**, with all parishes offering the **Sacrament of Penance** individually. Two area priests and I will be available in church that day from 12:00 - 7:00 p.m. In recent years, there seems to be fewer people taking advantage of this sacrament, but I have not noticed an equal drop off in sin.

When people have not availed themselves of this sacrament for a while, they often will say, "*I don't know how to celebrate this sacrament anymore,*" or "*I feel embarrassed that I don't know the procedures of the sacrament,*" or "*I am not sure what I should confess anymore: what really is a sin these days?*" or "*I can't remember the Act of Contrition,*" or "*I don't even know where the reconciliation rooms or confessionals are in our church.*" These are all legitimate concerns that many have.

First of all, the reconciliation rooms at St. Mary Our Mother are located to the west side of the vestibule, adjacent to the Eucharistic Chapel. Both rooms offer the penitent the choice of either kneeling and remaining anonymous, or being seated face to face with the priest.

The Sacrament of Penance begins with the Sign of the Cross, with a greeting and invitation from the priest, reminding the penitent of the mercy of God. Then there is a reference to scripture, usually a verse or two reminding the penitent to be open to the mercy of God. The penitent may also reference a brief scripture text that would be appropriate to their situation.

Having examined their conscience beforehand, the penitent then confesses his or her sins. If necessary, the priest may be helpful in helping the penitent articulate sins, and may offer spiritual counsel. It is important to remember that the priest here is not a judge in this situation, or a social worker or psychiatrist, but a kind of spiritual physician seeking to heal the wounds of sin.

The priest then proposes an act of penance, usually some form of prayer, scripture or spiritual reading, fasting or good works. The penitent accepts it as a means of amending one's life. The rite of the sacrament makes reference to a "firm purpose of amendment of one's life" being necessary on the part of the penitent when receiving the sacrament. The penitent then expresses sorrow for sin by making an "Act of Contrition." Please don't be concerned that you do not remember it, or you may forget it while you are celebrating the sacrament. We have printed versions of a number of prayers in each confessional. Simply saying the words sincerely, "Lord Jesus, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner" is acceptable.

The priest will then say the words of forgiveness and absolution in the name of the Church, extending his hand over the penitent. There are then brief words praising God whose mercy is endless. Then the penitent goes in peace.

Two things are important to remember when celebrating the individual form of the Sacrament of Penance. First, don't worry about the order of the service; the priest is there to guide you through. Your responsibility is to know your sins and truly be sorry for them. Second, and perhaps more important, remember that the mercy and forgiveness of God are waiting for you, even before you decided to celebrate this sacrament. The purpose of this sacrament is an opportunity to encounter Christ and to receive the merciful and loving forgiveness that Christ offers you.

During our Parish Retreat in 2013, **Father Simeon Gallagher, O.F.M., Cap.**, offered a very practical summary for a person approaching the Sacrament of Penance. Father Gallagher's approach included four steps: **Step 1: Name it;** (*name the sin*); **Step 2: Claim it;** (*admit/claim ownership of the sin*); **Step 3: Tame it;** (*open yourself to God's mercy and grace*); **Step 4: Aim it;** (*go forth living a life renewed*).

I hope these insights help as we prepare to celebrate the diocesan **Day of Penance and Mercy** on Wednesday of this week.

Have a great first week of Lent. Take advantage of the opportunity to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance this week. See you in church!

CRS Rice Bowl

Guatemala is slightly smaller than Pennsylvania and has the highest population of all the countries of Central America as well as the youngest - almost half of the population is under age 19. For young families living in the mountains of Guatemala, life can be hard. Most families grow corn and beans but a long-standing drought has caused harvests to shrink. There are few job opportunities, which means putting food on the table is a daily challenge, especially for pregnant women and children.

A Catholic Relief Services-sponsored program provides food for pregnant women and medical check-ups for children during the first two years of life. Young mothers learn how to raise healthy children during the first two years of life. Young mothers learn how to raise healthy children and grow nutritious food in small gardens. Mothers share the lessons learned with other women so that all the children can grow healthy and strong and make the community a better place to raise a family. Nutritious food is necessary for a dignified life; if none is available, families may be forced to migrate.

So this week let us pray for the people of Guatemala and donate to our Rice Bowl to support the work of CRS there. We care for each other so we can be the people God calls us to be.
