LENTEN REGULATIONS

During Lent, the regulations for fast and abstinence are: all Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence, as is Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting;

- All persons who are fourteen years of age or older are bound by the law of abstinence;
- All persons between the ages of 18 and 59, inclusive, are bound by the law of fasting;

Catholics are especially encouraged to perform acts of penance during the season of Lent.

- Abstinence refrain from eating meat at all meals that day;
- **Fasting -** only one full meal, the other two meals small enough that together they do not equal one full meal.

The season of Lent began on Ash Wednesday and continues through to Holy Thursday. Good Friday has its own rule of fast and abstinence.

REGIONAL EVENTS CRS Rice Bowl

Described as the "Pearl of Africa", Uganda has a rich culture and diverse flora and fauna, but has suffered from civil war, poverty, and a devastating AIDS epidemic. The people of Uganda are unique in their openness and hospitality toward refugees, receiving about 180 refugees a day since January 2018 as South Sudanese neighbors flee violence in their country. More than one million refuges are now living in settlements in northwestern Uganda.

Catholic Relief Services, with their partners in Uganda, are building houses for refugee families and helping them learn to farm, giving them a small plot of land and tools so they are able to provide for their families. Most refugees hope to return to South Sudan, but in the meantime, the children go to school and families do all they can to sustain hope for the future. Shelter is necessary for a dignified life - when families are forced to migrate, finding safe shelter becomes uncertain.

So this week let us pray for the people of Uganda and make an offering to our Rice Bowls to assist the work of CRS there. We care for each other so we can be the people God calls us to be.

Lenten Program Bridges to Contemplative Living

The regional Lenten program, Bridges to Contemplative Living, will be held on Mondays - March 18, 25, April 1, 8, and 15 at St. Mary's rectory, Franklin Street, Elmira from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m.

Using readings from Thomas Merton and other spiritual writers, the Bridges to Contemplative Living series invites participants to enter into individual reflection, contemplative dialogue and group prayer as avenues of spiritual growth. Bridges encourages participants to mine the spiritual treasures of their life experiences. The series stresses that our everyday life is our spiritual life and provides insights for integrating contemplation and action and spirituality and religion in our daily life. Thomas Merton was a Catholic Cistercian monk, and the series is an excellent resource for all.

PRAYER, FASTING, ALMSGIVING

When I was first in parish work, I remember the parish priest talking with the schoolchildren about the topic of Lent and prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. He asked them if any of them knew what fasting was. After a very long wait, one student raised his hand and said, "It is what I do when my Mom is mad at me. I run really fast!" The adults in the assembly burst into laughter.

Laughter is good. However, the Lenten devotions of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are very serious practices for us as we prepare to celebrate the Easter mysteries.

As catechumens prepare for the Easter sacraments, we are called by the Church to model what it means to be a Catholic Christian. We are called, especially during this Lenten season, to pray, fast, and give from the wealth we have to those who need our assistance.

This season is not merely a season of obligation to act more intently as God calls us to act; it is a season of opportunity to practice the foundation of our faith more attentively: prayer, fasting, almsgiving.
