#### LENTEN REGULATIONS

During Lent, the regulations for fast and abstinence are: all Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence, as is Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting;

All persons who are fourteen years of age or older are bound by the law of abstinence;

All persons between the ages of 18 and 59, inclusive, are bound by the law of fasting;

Catholics are especially encouraged to perform acts of penance during the season of Lent.

**Abstinence** - refrain from eating meat at all meals that day;

**Fasting** - only one full meal, the other two meals small enough that together they do not equal one full meal.

The season of Lent began on Ash Wednesday and continues through to Holy Thursday. Good Friday has its own rule of fast and abstinence.

#### PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

One of the disciplines we are called to embrace during the season of Lent is that of almsgiving. It is a word that can bring to mind people who might approach you asking for an occasional handout. In our part of the world, these occasions can be rare, after all, we have social service agencies which deal with these matters. So what significance does "almsgiving" hold for us, especially during the Lenten season?

The daily scripture readings in Lent make it clear that we are talking about the works of mercy and justice. References are found in Isaiah 58:1-9a, Leviticus 19:1-2, 11-18, and Matthew 25:31-46. Almsgiving is not just about contributing your loose change to the poor, it is the sharing of our financial and material gifts with others; "paying forward," as you might say, our blessings and recognizing that everything we think we have and own really belongs to God. One bishop in the early Church would remind his people that almsgiving is the responsibility of everyone, no matter how great or small their resources may be. We can all be equal in generosity of the heart for the benefit of our brothers and sisters in need.

As a parish, St. Mary Our Mother is blessed with financial, volunteer, and spiritual resources. A decision was made many years ago to "tithe" our Sunday collections, setting aside a certain amount each week, and to designate those monies for some charitable cause or service. We actually don't take a tenth (a true tithe), but we set aside five percent for charitable causes. For example, four times a year we make a donation in the name of our parish to the Food Bank of the Southern Tier to support the Back Pack program, which helps provide nutritious foods for at-risk children on weekends. These monies also help support our Social Ministry Committee's yearly Christmas basket efforts, where we provide Christmas baskets of food and gifts to approximately 250 families each year. In addition, each week our parishioners are most generous in bringing food to help support the various food pantries in our area. You may remember a few years ago, the Food Bank of the Southern Tier recognized our parish as one of the then top contributors to the Food Bank. These are just a few examples of the various causes that we, as a parish, support. So your contributions to St. Mary Our Mother include not only the ministries of our parish and school, but also reach beyond to help unknown numbers of people who are in need.

In addition, each Lent we offer the Operation Rice Bowls, asking you to participate in helping to feed hungry people throughout the world through Catholic Relief Services. Many families put money in their bowls at meal time as they say grace and pray for the poor of the world. Others put money in their bowls when they find themselves using inappropriate language, or when they are gossiping or saying unkind words about another. These rice bowls are returned at Easter.

#### **Catholic Relief Services**

Next weekend, March 30 & 31st, our parish will join with Catholic parishes across the diocese and country to take up the annual Catholic Relief Services (CRS) collection.

This special national collection helps support the U.S. Catholic community's global social ministry carried out in your name by six U.S. Catholic agencies, including Catholic Relief Services, Catholic Migration and Refugee Services, U.S. Bishops' Justice, Peace and Human Development Ministry, and the Holy Father's Relief Fund. These agencies touch the lives of more than 100 million brothers and sisters all over the world annually.

This annual CRS collection is different from the Lenten Catholic Relief Services Rice Bowl program. The alms we contribute through Rice Bowl provide funding for specific projects while the annual CRS collection provides basic funding for the Catholic agencies. Thank you for your generous spirit.

#### REGIONAL EVENTS CRS Rice Bowl

Sri Lanka continues to recover from a decades-long civil war and the devastating effects of recurrent natural disasters, including the 2004 tsunami. Many families fled to India during the civil war and returning home to Sri Lanka found their farms destroyed. They need support to begin again.

Catholic Relief Services' New Dawn project helps families who have returned to Sri Lanka after living in refugee camps in India by strengthening agriculture livelihoods, training in employable skills, reducing violence, and obtaining civil documents. CRS collaborates with local partners to sponsor the National Peace Program, designed to bring people together from across ethnic and religious divides to ease tensions that were the roots of the civil war.

So, this week let us pray for the people of Sri Lanka and give to our Rice Bowls to support the work of CRS there. We care for each other so we can be the people God calls us to be.

#### **Caring for God's Creation**

After the recent introduction in the U.S. Congress of the Energy Innovation and Carbon Dividend Act of 2019, Bishop Frank Dewane (Venice, Fl.), Chairman of the U.S. Bishops' Committee on Domestic Justice and Human Development, welcomed the legislation as an important step forward in addressing climate change. He states, "this bipartisan bill is a hopeful sign that, more and more, climate change is beginning to be seen as a crucial moral issue; one that concerns all people. If enacted, this proposal is expected to result in significant reductions in greenhouse gas emissions. At a time when the dangerous effects of climate change are becoming increasingly apparent, the need for legislative solutions like this is more urgent than ever
