## LENTEN REGULATIONS

During Lent, the regulations for fast and abstinence are: **all Fridays of Lent** are days of abstinence, as is **Ash Wednesday**. **Ash Wednesday and Good Friday** are days of fasting;

All persons who are fourteen years of age or older are bound by the law of abstinence;

All persons between the ages of 18 and 59, inclusive, are bound by the law of fasting;

Catholics are especially encouraged to perform acts of penance during the season of Lent.

**Abstinence** - refrain from eating meat at all meals that day;

**Fasting** - only one full meal, the other two meals small enough that together they do not equal one full meal.

The season of Lent began on Ash Wednesday and continues through to Holy Thursday. Good Friday has its own rule of fast and abstinence.

## PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

Today, we arrive at the **Fourth Sunday of Lent**, oftentimes referred to as **Laetare Sunday** or Rejoice Sunday. Lent 2019 is at its midpoint, which makes this a good time to give ourselves a little mid-Lenten checkup. Here are some thoughts we might like to ponder:

*How faithful have I been to the Lenten program of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving?*

*Have I taken the time, or made the time, to watch and pray this Lent?*

*Have I taken advantage of the many opportunities for spiritual growth this Lent: daily Mass; reading of scripture; clearing my schedule to participate in some Lenten activities; being a part of a small Christian community discussion group; joining in public praying of the Stations of the Cross each Friday in our chapel?*

*How has the season of Lent helped me to grow in greater awareness of God's special love for me?*

On Ash Wednesday, I mentioned that Lent is not only a time of "giving up", but a season of "giving" as well. In that spirit, a common practice for many during the Lenten season is to practice the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. The Corporal Works of Mercy include:

*Feeding the hungry;  
giving drink to the thirsty;  
clothing the naked;  
visiting the imprisoned;  
sheltering the homeless;  
visiting the sick;  
burying the dead.*

The Spiritual Works of Mercy include:

*Admonishing sinners;  
instructing the ignorant;  
counseling the doubtful;  
comforting the sorrowful;  
bearing wrongs patiently;  
forgiving injuries;  
praying for the living and the dead.*

As you read these Works of Mercy, let the grace and power of God's spirit touch your mind and heart and help you be creative in ways of practicing some of these works of mercy during this season of Lent.

Have a great week! Continue to be renewed in the Spirit of this Lenten season. See you in church!

### Catholic Relief Services

This weekend we are taking up a second collection to help support the work of six U.S. Catholic agencies who carry out the Church's global social ministry on our behalf, caring for refugees and victims of famine, war and natural disasters. This collection is called the Catholic Relief Services collection and offers us another way to help Jesus in disguise around the world.

## REGIONAL EVENTS

### CRS Rice Bowl: Sierra Leone

After a 10-year civil war in the 1990s, Catholic Relief Services projects in Sierra Leone are helping to rebuild the country with a focus on peacebuilding. Rates of child and maternal mortality are high, levels of education are low, and, despite rich natural resources and abundant land, more than 60% of Sierra Leoneans live on less than \$1.25 a day. The Ebola outbreak in 2014 caused thousands of deaths. CRS was one of the organizations on the frontlines working to control the spread. In the past, no one thought girls should receive and education.

Now, things have changed in Sierra Leone and families know the importance of education, especially for girls. CRS-sponsored schools help girls learn how to make a difference in their community and country. And, through the nutritious lunch each student receives, they can focus on their studies and not on their hunger. A good education doesn't just benefit the student. It benefits the family, the community and the common good – allowing individuals to flourish without needing to leave home.

We care for each other so we can be the people God calls us to be. So this week let us pray for the people of Sierra Leone and make an offering to our Rice Bowl to assist the work of CRS there.

### Petition for Repeal of Abortion Expansion

Please support repeal of the new abortion expansion law in New York State (Reproductive Health Act) by signing the petition circulated by the NYS Catholic Conference. Look for the petition on-line at website [www.nyscatholic.org](http://www.nyscatholic.org). We will have petitions in church next weekend for signing. The petition reads as follows:

To: Governor Andrew Cuomo

We stand in firm opposition to the recently-enacted Reproductive Health Act, which expands abortion in New York State. This law:

- Legalizes late-term abortions of fully-formed infants in the womb
- Expands the pool of practitioners who can perform abortions
- Removes legal protections for babies who survive abortion
- Decriminalizes acts of violence that intentionally target unborn child

This act endangers the health of women and treats unborn children as disposable objects. It does not represent the direction in which our state should be headed. We call upon you and the NYS Legislature to repeal this law in its entirety.

### Caring for God's Creation

After the recent introduction in the U.S. Congress of the Energy Innovation and Carbon Dividend Act of 2019, Bishop Frank Dewane (Venice, Fl.), Chairman of the U.S. Bishops' Committee on Domestic Justice and Human Development, welcomed the legislation as an important step forward in addressing climate change. He states, "this

bipartisan bill is a hopeful sign that, more and more, climate change is beginning to be seen as a crucial moral issue; one that concerns all people. If enacted, this proposal is expected to result in significant reductions in greenhouse gas emissions. At a time when the dangerous effects of climate change are becoming increasingly apparent, the need for legislative solutions like this is more urgent than ever.


