#### LENTEN REGULATIONS

During Lent, the regulations for fast and abstinence are: all Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence, as is Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting;

All persons who are fourteen years of age or older are bound by the law of abstinence;

All persons between the ages of 18 and 59, inclusive, are bound by the law of fasting;

Catholics are especially encouraged to perform acts of penance during the season of Lent.

**Abstinence** - refrain from eating meat at all meals that day:

**Fasting** - only one full meal, the other two meals small enough that together they do not equal one full meal.

The season of Lent began on Ash Wednesday and continues through to Holy Thursday. Good Friday has its own rule of fast and abstinence.

#### PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

One of the popular devotions that we pray during the season of Lent is the **Stations of the Cross**. Each Friday during Lent, we gather both as a school community and as a parish community to pray this prayer, where we are invited to reflect on the last hours of Jesus before He was crucified. This past Friday, the sixth grade students from **St. Mary Our Mother School** offered the Living Stations of the Cross, which helped us all center all the more on the sufferings and death of the Lord.

Recently, I saw a reflection written by **Father Peter Cameron**, **O.P.**, which uses the format of the stations to reflect on Resurrection and Mercy of God. You may find these helpful:

**First Station:** *Jesus rises from the Dead.* At your rising the peace, the forgiveness, the display of your wounds are healing and mercy for me.

**Second Station:** *the Disciples find the Empty* **Tomb.** The emptiness inside of me is a crushing sore.
The mercy of your empty tomb frees me and fills me.

Third Station: Jesus appears to Mary of Magdala. To a frantic Mary who wants to carry away your body, you appear in risen mercy to carry her away.

Fourth Station: Jesus walks with the disciples to Emmaus. To the two discouraged disciples, your mercy appears as a sudden accompaniment. Walk with me!

Fifth Station: Jesus reveals himself to the Breaking of the Bread. All that our heart craves abides in the last supper bread breaking. Break through my forgetfulness!

**Sixth Station:** *Jesus appears to the disciples.* You appear in your humanity: eating, consoling, ridding fear. By your mercy, help me to be more human.

**Seventh Station:** *Jesus confers on his disciples the power to forgive sins.* You give, not the ability to live without sinning, but the power to forgive sin - the greatest mercy!

**Eighth Station:** *Jesus confirms Thomas in faith. In your mercy, doubt will not gain the upper hand. Touching the wound in your hand reclaims us.* 

Ninth Station: Jesus appears to his disciples on the shore of Lake Galilee. When we are adrift and dispirited, you come as a surprise, cooking us breakfast, calling us "children."

**Tenth Station:** *Jesus confirms Primary of Peter.* The unity of the Church needs you to provide the Successor of Peter, it's a visible source and foundation.

Eleventh Station: Jesus entrusts his disciples with the Universal Mission. I believe because of Christian witnesses who shared their faith. Make me a missionary of mercy!

#### **Petition for Repeal of Abortion Expansion**

Please support repeal of the new abortion expansion law in New York State (Reproductive Health Act) by signing the petition circulated by the NYS Catholic Conference. Look for the petition on-line at website <a href="https://www.nyscatholic.org">www.nyscatholic.org</a>. We will have petitions in church this weekend, April 6th & 7th, for signing. The petition reads as follows:

To: Governor Andrew Cuomo

We stand in firm opposition to the recently-enacted Reproductive Health Act, which expands abortion in New York State. This law:

- · Legalizes late-term abortions of fully-formed infants in the womb
- · Expands the pool of practitioners who can perform abortions
- · Removes legal protections for babies who survive
- · Decriminalizes acts of violence that intentionally target unborn child

This act endangers the health of women and treats unborn children as disposable objects. It does not represent the direction in which our state should be headed. We call upon you and the NYS Legislature to repeal this law in its entirety.

**Caring for God's Creation** 

After the recent introduction in the U.S. Congress of the Energy Innovation and Carbon Dividend Act of 2019, Bishop Frank Dewane (Venice, Fl.), Chairman of the U.S. Bishops' Committee on Domestic Justice and Human Development, welcomed the legislation as an important step forward in addressing climate change. He states, "this

bipartisan bill is a hopeful sign that, more and more, climate change is beginning to be seen as a crucial moral issue; one that concerns all people. If enacted, this proposal is expected to result in significant reductions in greenhouse gas emissions. At a time when the dangerous effects of climate change are becoming increasingly apparent, the need for legislative solutions like this is more urgent than ever."
