## FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

We all face obstacles in life. Perhaps it's a lost job, the death of a loved one, a sudden accident that places an unexpected dent in our finances. Sometimes the challenges are of our own making. Perhaps we've developed patterns of sin in our personal lives or our family relationships. We've all felt the jolting shock of, "This is all my fault." How do these things affect our relationship with God? Or, perhaps more poignantly, how do we now view God's relationship to us?

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus' words to us are encouraging ones. "No one can take them out of my hand." Did you catch that? In case you didn't, Jesus reemphasizes the point again a few verses later. "My Father, who has given them to Me, is greater than all, and no one can take them out of the Father's hand." God's grip of providential care and mercy is so strong that nothing can separate us. We might think things take us out of God's hand - life circumstances, tragedy, our lukewarm attitudes towards faith - but Jesus tells us otherwise. Nothing, no one, can take us out of the Father's hand, and we can't take ourselves out! We can't remove ourselves from Him, not entirely. Even when grievous sin hardens us to grace, His love is still sustaining us in existence. And His mercy is always awaiting our repentance.

"My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow Me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish." This Sunday, let us heed the voice of the Good Shepherd. Whatever we feel might take us from God's hand, we can turn back to Him. God is always inviting us to follow Him and to trust in His care and be sustained by His hand. *Liturgical Publications, Inc.*

#### **PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE**

Happy Mother's Day to all mothers in the parish of St. Mary Our Mother! We honor you today and offer our gratitude to God for you and the unconditional love you give to your children and to us. All Sunday Masses this weekend are being offered for all mothers, living and deceased, of all of our people. With the public conversation today about the role of women in the church, in religious circles in general, we should never fail to appreciate the uniquely womanly role of motherhood.

Like many others who have lost their mothers this past year, this will be the first Mother's Day without my mother for my family. We will remember her fondly throughout the day. I would hope that if your mother is living, that you take the opportunity to speak to her, tell her you love her, and spend some quality time with her. If your mother has passed to the Kingdom, I hope you are blessed with fond memories of her. If you are a person whose mother did not meet your needs or expectations, offer a prayer for her today, and pray for the healing of your memories, acceptance of what cannot be changed, and a decision to thank God for your life and the mother who gave you that life.

Each year, Mother's Day falls during the Easter As we experience signs of Easter life, this season. weekend invites us to center on "Mother." One might say that a mother is the premier sign of Easter. She gives birth to human life to gain this title. Not only does she give birth, but she nurtures, encourages, cares and loves her children. Motherhood is not a 9 to 5 job - nor is it concluded when her child walks out of the house. Motherhood is a life-long process - and, I believe, extends beyond the bounds of time and space to eternity. All that we envision in the life of a mother is envisioned in the life of an Easter person.

A survey was given to a number of mothers in which the participants were asked the question: "As a mother, what is most important to you?" The following are some mother's responses:

*The welfare of my children;* 

*Our children's faith;* 

That my children become everything they are capable of being:

- *That each of my children somehow enrich humanity* as a peacemaker, reconciler, healer, and creative problem solver:
- To ask God what I should say and do when my children are in trouble, to listen to God, calm myself down before saying a word;
- My children's failures are not my fault and their successes are not to my credit;
- That girls can do and accomplish anything;
- There can be hundreds of children being picked up from school, yet, when they hear their mother's voice, they know they are safe;
- I thank God for letting me be my children's mom. I am grateful for biological mothers for giving these children to parent, praying they know how much we love them;

  - That I do my best to prepare them for life sharing love and joy, listening well, making peace, modeling the behavior I want to see in them, asking God for help, saying "I'm sorry" and "I love you", - and show it;

  - I know now that a mother always dies too soon;
  - My mother's dementia showed me that I had to be a mother's mother. This long good-bye showed me our relationship is still there. When she actually died it was as painful as if she'd died when she was young. She is very much alive to me right now. Maybe even more alive than she was when she died.

#### **Caring for God's Creation**

After the recent introduction in the U.S. Congress of the **Energy Innovation and Carbon Dividend Act of 2019,** Bishop Frank Dewane, Chairman of the U.S. Bishops Committee on Domestic Justice and Human Development, welcomed the legislation as an important step forward in addressing climate change. He states, "this bipartisan bill is a hopeful sign that, more and more, climate change is beginning to be seen as a crucial moral issue; one that concerns all people. If enacted, this proposal is expected to result in significant reductions in greenhouse gas emissions. At a time when the dangerous effects of climate change are becoming increasingly apparent, the need for legislative solutions like this is more urgent than ever."
