FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

"I give you a new commandment: love one another." With these words, Jesus sums up the law and the prophets in one concise phrase. Love one another. After 2,000 years, you'd think we'd have it figured out by now! But all too often we fail in this commandment. Perhaps we mistake "love" for mere "common decency." Perhaps we've been betrayed, or our own visions of love have been tarnished or misrepresented in our lives. Blessedly, Jesus doesn't leave us without a guide.

"As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." Jesus Himself modeled what this love should look like. So what are some of the characteristics of the love of Christ? Humility, for one. St. Paul writes that Jesus "emptied Himself." In becoming man, Jesus puts aside the full splendor of the Godhead. Not only does He become human, but He takes on many of the mundane privations of human life. He spent most of His life in relative poverty - especially by our standards - as a common laborer. When He began gaining popularity as a preacher, He still traveled on foot and spent nights in other people's homes or outdoors.

Jesus' love is generous. He was always available to the crowds and to being interrupted by people in need. He invested time in His disciples and patiently taught them about the kingdom of God. The love of Jesus is also courageous. He encountered many people deemed less worthy of human respect, due to being public sinners or having a physical or mental disability. Jesus was brave in breaking these social boundaries to show care and concern to the outcast. These traits are possible for us to imitate! Indeed, we are hardly identifiable as Christians without them. "This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

In the next couple of weeks, we will welcome a number of children into our Church community through the Sacrament of Baptism. It is always a special time whenever we can welcome new members into our faith community. From time to time it is advantageous to review certain guidelines and expectations that the Church has in regards to its sacramental life. Today I would like to share information about the Sacrament of Baptism, particularly those who serve in the role of godparent.

A **godparent**, in partnership with the parents, helps the child grow and mature in the Christian faith, giving witness by their own lives and practice of what it means to be Catholic. The godparent position is not an honorary one, but a practical and serious responsibility, extending through the time the baptized person becomes an adult. In the Rite of Baptism, the parents of the child to be baptized are reminded: *"It will be your duty to bring this child up in the practice of the faith, to keep God's commandments as Christ taught us, by loving God and our neighbor. Do you clearly understand what you are undertaking?"* Once they have said, "Yes," the godparents are asked, *"Are you ready and willing to help the parents of this child in their duty as Christian parents?"* As they answer in the affirmative, the godparents accept the responsibility of helping to raise the child in the knowledge of God and in the practice of the faith.

The qualifications for serving as a godparent for Baptism or Confirmation are set by the Church. To fulfill the role of a godparent or sponsor, the person must be: a fully initiated Catholic, that is, the aspiring sponsor has been baptized and confirmed, and received the Eucharist; at least sixteen years of age (unless there is an extraordinary reason for someone younger); and living a life in harmony with the Catholic faith and its expectations. A baptized person of another Christian denomination or tradition may serve as a Christian witness to the baptism with a Catholic sponsor.

It is up to the parents and pastor to insure that these qualifications are met. Here is where some potential problems may arise. Often parents themselves are not actively participating in the practice of their faith. While they have faith in their hearts and truly want their child to be baptized, they are not always expressing and deepening their own faith life through the participation at Sunday Mass and in the sacraments of the Church. While we never sit in judgement of another, and try our best to be a welcoming community, these are some of the challenges we face. This is one reason we require a **Baptism Preparation Class** before baptism. This class can be taken even prior to the birth of the child. Second, we often find that potential godparents have not been confirmed, are not practicing the faith themselves, and some are not even baptized. We are required to ask that potential godparents or sponsors provide documentation stating the person's qualifications for being a godparent. Third, some parents wish to have multiple godparents for their child's baptism. The Church requires only one, preferably two (a godfather and a godmother).

Strengthened by the other sacraments of the Church, and nourished often by the sacrament of the Eucharist, we continue to grow in the very life of Christ himself.
