PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

The **Memorial Day weekend** has arrived! Memorial Day gives us an opportunity to reflect and pray for peace throughout our world. This weekend is much more than just a three day weekend to officially mark the beginning of summer, and all the wonderful opportunities and activities summer has to offer. It is a time for travel, family, and good times. But Memorial Day is also a day to reflect and remember the many women and men who have given the ultimate gift of their life for our freedom, our country, and her citizenry. Whenever we walk the cemeteries (and I hope the opportunity presents itself for you to visit a cemetery over this Memorial Day weekend), we often think of the massive loss of American lives that have been sacrificed for our country. The whole reason for celebrating Memorial Day is to keep their memories alive.

I recently had the opportunity to talk with a member of our military who served two tours of duty in Iraq and Afghanistan. He returned home to a hero's welcome, beginning once his group arrived at a U.S. airport. As the members of the troop were deplaning and entering the airport terminal, the people broke into a spontaneous applause. His family embraced him, his neighbors came over to welcome him home, people on the street would stop and say "thank you", a real affirmation for a job well done. While he was glad to be home, there is a part of him who remains with his fellow soldiers in Iraq and Afghanistan. Because of their common experience, a part of him remains with them. Even though his period of deployment is complete, he frequently thinks of his friends still on active duty. Memorial Day has a striking impression on him because he knows of comrades who have died.

As we commemorate Memorial Day this week, our country invites us to remember those who made the ultimate sacrifice. We celebrate life because of them and honor those who continue to serve our country throughout the world. We also pray for peace, that a time will come when younger generations do not have to sacrifice their lives, a time when we can deal with world problems without resorting to violence and war, when there is a trust that binds us to collaboration. Take a moment this Memorial Day weekend to remember and pray for those who have made the ultimate sacrifice, those who remain in the midst of conflict, and pray for peace.
