16th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Active and contemplative. At work and at rest. These are dynamics we all face in our lives, and if we're honest, we might not always balance perfectly! In this Sunday's Gospel, our daily tensions play out in two sisters. Mary "sat beside the Lord at His feet listening to Him speak." Martha, on the other hand, is "burdened with much serving." This, as it turns out, is not necessarily "the better part."

All of us reading this have some sort of labor we engage in. We have different trades or careers. We have responsibilities as family members, some of which may take up most of our time. In the time of Scripture, showing hospitality to guests was one of the most important values in society. Our work is important. Jesus Himself spent decades as a carpenter. So what's the problem with Martha? Martha is burdened, anxious, and worried. Not only that, but she resents her sister's choice. "Tell her to help me," she demands of Jesus.

How easy it is to get very busy doing good things. We need to provide for our families and plan for retirement. We need to make sure children are clothed, fed, and educated. Our committees, ministries, and sports schedules need to stay on track. However, without a balance of work with rest, without contemplation in the midst of our action, we will miss the point. While many parts are required for our life in the world to function, the better part is our relationship with God. This week, make time in your busy schedule to sit at Jesus' feet. Maybe this is 20 minutes with Scripture, participating in a daily Mass, or a quiet walk alone in the park. Receive what Christ wants to speak to you.

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

This past week, our parish completed the annual twoweek Summer Intensive Faith Formation program. It was a highly successful and rewarding experience for all involved. The program involved and engaged our youth with a desire to experience God's love for them and to learn more about the Christian centered values and traits we are called to embrace. The theme of this year's summer program was The Paschal Mystery in July: Palm Sunday to Pentecost. In addition to their curriculum studies, each day focused on one important event in Jesus' final days on earth beginning with Palm Sunday, through the events of Holy Week and Easter, the Ascension and concluding with Pentecost. The program concluded this past Friday with a liturgy which involved the active participation of all involved in the summer program. We hope that the experience of this year's program will benefit both our children as well as the catechists and aides who participated in this program to embrace and integrate all they learned into their lives.

As with any parish ministry, program or activity like this summer program just "doesn't happen'! A quality and worthwhile program involves months of planning and preparation. The many facets of our Faith Formation efforts in the parish, which includes sacramental preparation for First Penance, First Eucharist, and the two year program for Confirmation preparation, are ably planned and coordinated by our Faith Formation Coordinator, **Barbara Matterazzo**. If we find ourselves anxious and harried by life's routines, could it be a sign that something in our spiritual life needs some serious attention?

Discover the Catholic Church

Are you interested in learning more about the Catholic faith and becoming Catholic? Have you been baptized in another Christian tradition and now want to join the Catholic Church? Were you baptized Catholic but did not follow up with celebrating the other sacraments, but now wish to enter into full membership in the Church? If so, our RCIA program is for you.

What is RCIA?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process of learning what the Catholic Church believes and teaches, of growing in one's faith and relationship with God, and of discerning what it means to be a member of the Catholic faith community.

Who typically attends RCIA?

- Those who have never been baptized are interested in the Catholic faith.
- Baptized Christians who are interested in learning about the Catholic faith and joining the Catholic Church.
- Those who were baptized Catholic but not fully catechized and not having received Holy Communion and Confirmation.
- Non-Catholics married to Catholics and wanting to more fully understand the Catholic faith.

What are the expectations of the program?

- Weekly participation in a group or individually depending on your prior faith formation.
- Weekly participation at Sunday Mass and reflecting on the Sunday scriptures.
- Spending time with God in prayer and being open to the call of God in your life.

When are RCIA sessions held?

Our RCIA groups for the fall are now forming. Sessions will begin on Tuesday, September 17th and go until the end of April. Classes for adults (ages fourteen and up) will meet on Tuesday evenings from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. and classes for youth (ages 8 to 13) will meet on Tuesday afternoons from 3:45 to 5:00 p.m.

REGIONAL EVENTS CONTINUED... Caring for God's Creation

After the recent introduction in the U.S. Congress of the Energy Innovation and Carbon Dividend Act of 2019, Bishop Frank Dewane (Venice, Fl), Chairman of the U.S. Bishops' Committee on Domestic Justice and Human Development, welcomed the legislation as an important step forward in addressing climate change. He states, "this bipartisan bill is a hopeful sign that, more and more, climate change is beginning to be seen as a crucial moral issue; one that concerns all people. If enacted, this proposal is expected to result in significant reductions in greenhouse gas emissions. At a time when the dangerous effects of climate change are becoming increasingly apparent, the need for legislative solutions like this is more urgent than ever."

The Confirmation preparation process is a two-year program as determined by the Diocese of Rochester.
