

IN OUR PARISH Thinking of Becoming Catholic?

If you (or someone you know) are not Catholic and are curious about the Catholic faith, or if you are a baptized Catholic but have not received the Sacraments of Holy Eucharist and Confirmation, we invite you to come to our RCIA sessions. This set of sessions will help to learn what Catholics believe and prepare you to receive the sacraments of the Catholic faith.

These sessions are held in St. Mary Our Mother School and will begin on Tuesday, September 17th and will meet on every Tuesday in accordance with the Horseheads school calendar. For youth, ages 8 through middle school age, they are from 3:45-5:00 pm. For high schoolers and adults, the session will be held from 7:00-8:30 pm.

Where Does Our Donated Food Go?

In the vestibule of our Church, there is a food cart to collect donations of food for those in need. All food goes to the Horseheads Food Pantry which is located in the Horseheads Presbyterian Church Annex. This pantry began back in 1982 and was originally located in St. Matthew's Episcopal Church in the Village of Horseheads. Several years ago it moved and became housed in its present location. The pantry is supported by seven Christian churches: Breesport Methodist, Community Wesleyan, First United Methodist, Horseheads Presbyterian, Pine Valley Methodist, St. Mary Our Mother Catholic and St. Matthew's Episcopal churches.

The pantry serves the families of the Horseheads school district. Elmira Heights, and the outlying rural areas such as Erin, Breesport and Montour Falls. Its clients are generally able to receive food once a month, but are able to receive more often in emergency or extenuating circumstances. Most of the food given out is food that is donated through voluntary collections at each of the churches, and occasionally by other organizations. Some other food items needed, but not necessarily donated, can be bought from the Food Bank by the pantry with donated funds. It is also through this pantry that we at St. Mary Our Mother obtain access to the families and individuals whom we serve through our Christmas Basket program.

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

Another Labor Day is upon us! For many, this weekend signals the end of summer activities. With schools opening this week, many summer vacations are winding down, and autumn not too far away, it is time to savor the Labor Day weekend. Many families and groups of friends have a Labor Day gathering as a signal that another summer season is coming to an end. With this in mind, we need to stop and appreciate the meaning of this civil holiday.

When America was founded, most of the people were either farmers, men of the sea, or involved in some related fields. As people moved inland, and with people becoming more aware of how enormous America really was, it was natural for people to choose other professions - even that of the discerner. As the railroad developed, mining of the many natural resources of our country became a way of life and help build the country. As technology was refined, labor took on a new face. The more traditional modes of work remained, but the American thirst for innovation became prominent.

Labor became organized; unions found their niche in society; and there was greater emphasis on the dignity of the working person, not just the one who owned the company. Labor Day developed as a way of showcasing the backbreaking labor that made America strong, independent, self-sufficient, and a provider for the world. The early Labor Day parades were made up of the common Joe who went to work, took pride in what he did, was paid a fair wage, and reminded the country of her pride in her citizens. Such parades were not to highlight the politicians or those involved in local government, but to highlight those who went to work day after day.

At times, there is a tendency to forget about these basic qualities of our day-to-day lives. For example, we may go to a store to purchase a certain item, and never stop to think about how that item came to be - who worked to make sure that the store shelves are filled. With the continuing struggling economy, we hear of layoffs, businesses closing, production reductions, and more people out of work. We tend to highlight our laborers when things are not going well and take them for granted when everything runs smoothly.

Our country continues to depend on those who go to work daily. It may be in hospitals, in stores or businesses, in restaurants, in factories, in schools, in research laboratories, on university and college campuses, in cemeteries, on public projects, at secretarial and custodial care activities. Whenever labor happens, American citizens are there making it happen. This weekend is for you! While it has become a national holiday where we rest from our labors, we do so to appreciate those who do labor. Dignity is an important quality that everyone is entitled to - Labor Day is a reminder of that dignity.

God has given each of us certain gifts and talents.

Caring for God's Creation

After the recent introduction in the U.S. Congress of the Energy Innovation and Carbon Dividend Act of 2019, Bishop Frank Dewane (Venice, Fl), Chairman of the U.S. Bishops' Committee on Domestic Justice and Human Development, welcomed the legislation as an important step forward in addressing climate change. He states, "this bipartisan bill is a hopeful sign that, more and more, climate change is beginning to be seen as a crucial moral issue; one that concerns all people. If enacted, this proposal is expected to result in significant reductions in greenhouse gas emissions. At a time when the dangerous effects of climate change are becoming increasingly apparent, the need for legislative solutions like this is more urgent than ever."

EVERY DAY STEWARDSHIP

I love the verse in Sirach where it says, "My child, conduct your affairs with humility, and you will be loved more than a giver of gifts." This is an interesting concept for those of us who think a stewardship way of life is all about the giving of gifts.
