

#### IN OUR PARISH

#### Where Does Our Donated Food Go?

In the vestibule of our Church, there is a food cart to collect donations of food for those in need. All food goes to the Horseheads Food Pantry which is located in the Horseheads Presbyterian Church Annex. This pantry began back in 1982 and was originally located in St. Matthew's Episcopal Church in the Village of Horseheads. Several years ago it moved and became housed in its present location. The pantry is supported by seven Christian churches: Breesport Methodist, Community Wesleyan, First United Methodist, Horseheads Presbyterian, Pine Valley Methodist, St. Mary Our Mother Catholic and St. Matthew's Episcopal churches.

The pantry serves the families of the Horseheads School District, Elmira Heights, and the outlying rural areas such as Erin, Breesport and Montour Falls. Its clients are generally able to receive food once a month, but are able to receive more often in emergency or extenuating circumstances. Most of the food given out is food that is donated through voluntary collections at each of the churches, and occasionally by other organizations. Some other food items needed, but not necessarily donated, can be bought from the Food Bank by the pantry with donated funds. It is also through this pantry that we at St. Mary Our Mother obtain access to the families and individuals whom we serve through our Christmas Basket program.

The Horseheads Food Pantry has two co-directors, Kathy McNulty and Janice Kinney, who have been doing this for many years. Monetary donations may be brought or sent to the Horseheads Food Pantry at Horseheads Presbyterian Church, 2943 Westinghouse Road, Horseheads. If you encounter people in need of help, please share this information with them. The pantry is open on Tuesdays and Thursdays from noon to 2:00 p.m. Also, remember, you are welcome to visit the pantry and look around during these hours. We thank our parishioners who have been supporting the pantry with their donations of food and funds.

#### PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

Today I would like to share with you a letter from Bishop Emeritus Matthew H. Clark, which was received just before Labor Day. Due to the early bulletin deadline for last Sunday's bulletin, we were not able to print this until today. With Bishop Clark's blessing, I share with you his letter on his health in its entirety:

My Friends,

I find it difficult to write this letter about a new health concern and I expect that you will find it difficult to read.

So, let me get to the point, I have been diagnosed with early stage Alzheimer's disease. I was stunned when my neurologist told me that. I imagine that anyone would be. Here's what led up to that moment.

About 16 months ago, I noticed changes in my health that concerned me. Some examples: it takes me considerably longer to accomplish the ordinary tasks of life such as changing my clothes, preparing my breakfast, opening plastic sealed packages, sticking to the task at hand, buttoning just about anything. I have to search for words and often lose my train of thought.

Initially, I attributed such things to my neuropathy. That was certainly part of it. But it dawned on me that what I was also dealing with was difficulty in staying focused on what I was doing.

I reported all of this to my primary care physician, who referred me to a neurologist. On my first visit the doctor wanted to know more about the experiences I described above and he had several other questions and exercises to test my cognition. A few examples: "What is today's date? Name as many animals you can in 30 seconds. Draw a cube like the one next to it. Draw a clock with all the numbers and locate 10:20 a.m. on the clock. Memorize three words and be ready to repeat them later in our conversation. Count backward from 100 in intervals of 7."

In July, the doctor took me through the same battery of tests and they showed a diminishment in cognition since the ones I had taken the year before.

In addition to those tests, I had two CT scans of my brain. Both indicated some abnormal brain structures that are hallmarks of Alzheimer's disease.

Alzheimer's is a progressive disease. reverse it or retard it. Some can remain in the early stage for quite some time. The doctors advise plenty of sleep, a healthy diet, exercise and socializing as much as possible. I'll be seeing my neurologist again in 3 months.

Thank you for your attention to this update. Let me conclude on a more personal note.

I have journeyed with you in ministry to the people of our Diocese for 40 years. I have always considered it to be a privilege and an honor.

I am grateful for your love, support and encouragement throughout these years both in good times and difficult ones. As I write this, I remember our brother priests who once served with us and have gone before us in faith to their eternal reward.

#### Message from Bishop Matano

Dear Sisters & Brothers in Christ:

In fidelity to our Catholic faith, we have the right and responsibility to be involved in addressing public policy issues. Our freedom to elect leaders and to engage in political debate comes as a result of the great risks and sacrifices of those who came before us. With appreciation for the efforts of those who have preceded us and worked to preserve religious freedom and our human rights, we need to educate ourselves and make informed decisions about who will lead us. As the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops remind us in the document, Faithful Citizenship: In light of Catholic teaching, the bishops vigorously repeat their call for a renewed politics that focuses on moral principles, the promotion of human life and dignity, and the pursuit of the common good. Political participation in this spirit reflects not only the social teaching of our church but the best traditions of our nation.

I am grateful to our Public Policy Committee for providing guidance for appropriate ways parishes can be politically engaged and thereby nurture positive political engagements among the faithful. In addition to laying the groundwork for political engagement, this year our Diocesan Public Policy Committee draws our attention to three additional urgent issues:

~ The disturbing promotion of legislation in New York State that would wrongfully allow physicians, whose profession is committed to healing, to end the life of a terminally ill patient.

- ~ The troubling problem of addiction in all its forms and the Church's role in supporting those who struggle with opioid, alcohol, gambling or other addictions, and their families.
- ~ The need for state funding to support essential infrastructure improvements in non-public schools.

Our own lives, our communities and the institutions we love are all impacted by the choices made by elected officials and legislative bodies. I encourage you to reflect on your Catholic faith and be educated about candidates and issues so that your informed conscience may guide you to make loving, life-giving choices in the political arena.
