MASS OF REMEMBRANCE

The annual **Mass of Remembrance** will be celebrated on **All Saints Day, Friday, November 1st**, at **5:30 p.m.** During this liturgy, we will remember all those who have died from our parish since November, 2018, and will remember each of the departed by name. If you have a family member or friend who passed away during the last twelve months whose funeral was not at St. Mary Our Mother and would like their name included, please contact the parish office. All are invited to this liturgy as we pray for our departed loved ones, and offer support to their families and friends.

The Book of Remembrance will be placed next to the Paschal Candle in the narthex beginning the weekend of October 26/27th. You are invited to inscribe the names of your deceased loved ones in this book, which will remain near the Paschal Candle during the month of November.

ALL SOULS REMEMBRANCES

In your current packet of envelopes, there is an All Souls Day envelope, on which you may write the names of your deceased loved ones. The envelopes will be placed on the chapel altar during the month of November. Your intentions will be remembered in all liturgies during the month of November and throughout the year in Masses listed for "Our Faithful Departed".

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

The annual **Catholic Ministries Appeal** is now underway. The theme of this year's appeal is "I am the vine; you are the branches." We ask for your support of this year's appeal which supports the on-going work of ministry throughout the twelve county Diocese of Rochester.

For the past two weeks, we have featured in the column a series of "Frequently Asked Questions" concerning both this annual appeal as well as the diocese's bankruptcy and reorganization efforts. This week, we publish the third and final series of these frequently asked questions, with answers supplied by the CMA office:

9. How is my contribution to the CMA used?

The CMA funds seven specific categories of allocation. The bullet points under each category provide examples of specific ministries, services and programs funded through each allocation.

- 1. Providing diocesan-wide services to our parishes and institutions:
 - Welcoming new Catholics through special education programs (RCIA)
 - Giving support to families, the elderly and the sick through chaplains to nursing homes, hospitals, jails and prisons
 - Tools and resources for Creating a Safe Environment in the parishes and through the diocese
 - ~ Honoring marriage and preparing engaged couples
 - ~ Multicultural/urban/rural ministries
 - Support for Respect Life and Life Issues and Programs to honor life from conception to natural death
 - Spreading the Gospel through communications media
 - Providing parishes with needed services and support such as human resources and pension services, information technology services and support, support of Finance Directors and Finance Councils
 - ~ Building and property management
 - Tribunal services
 - Diocesan archives
 - ~ Pastoral planning
 - Stewardship resources
- 2. Educating our young in the Catholic faith:
 - Providing support and resources for parish faith formation programs for youth
 - Assistance and resources for sacramental preparation
 - ~ Assisting Catholic schools
 - ~ CYO
 - Recognition of youth leaders & ministers through the Hands of Christ Award
 - Young adult ministries, such as "Theology On Tap"
 - Support of campus ministry programs at colleges and universities across the 12 counties of the diocese

EVERY DAY STEWARDSHIP

The US Bishops' pastoral letter, "Stewardship: A Disciple's Response," sees a life of stewardship as the fruit that comes from an authentic life with Jesus. Faith in Jesus is the minimum requirement that begins this journey from discipleship to stewardship living. There are those who believe in Jesus but do not know Him. It becomes very hard to contemplate responding to the call of someone you do not know.

The last sentence of Luke 18:8 should give a reason to pause and reflect. Jesus says to His disciples, "But when the Son of Man comes, will He find faith on Earth?" We can easily respond affirmatively to the question, but if we want to look at the Earth ourselves without being able to see into people's hearts, where is the evidence of the faith that Jesus seeks? When we look at our world, do we see evidence of large amounts of faithful people living in a way that faith would lead them to live?

Our stewardship way of life is evidence of our faith. It is hard to argue that one truly has faith if they do not seek to live as Jesus calls us. An unfortunate cycle is then created when those who not believe do not see any reason to have faith. Our stewardship is not only evidence, but it is our testimony and witness to faith. If Jesus returned today, what would He see? Where is your evidence? Has your witness brought others to Him?
