### PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

Today we celebrate the solemnity of Christ the King, and begin the final week of the Church's liturgical year. Unlike other feasts which were centered on an event in our Lord's life, the feast of Christ the King celebrates an aspect of Jesus' identity, and thus is categorized as an "idea feast". This feast was originally celebrated each year on the last Sunday in October, but with the first revision of the Roman Missal after the Second Vatican Council, this feast was moved to the final Sunday of the liturgical year. By instituting this feast, Pope Pius XI hoped to renew and strengthen the faith of the people of his time and to a world where the influence of totalitarian forms of government such as communism, Nazism, and fascism were gaining a stronghold in many countries, particularly in Europe. It was Pius XI's hope that this annual celebration would serve as a powerful reminder to all of Jesus' reign in our midst, and would speak powerfully of our belief in God's triumph over evil. Christ our King continues to be the source of grace as each of us brings His living presence into our world.

Thursday of this week we celebrate the American The President's Official feast of **Thanksgiving**. Proclamation calls for all Americans to set aside the fourth Thursday of the month of November as a date to give thanks for the blessings and prosperity that we enjoy. We are aware of the artist's renditions of the early American Thanksgivings and have seen the television specials telling us of Thanksgivings of old. In our Thanksgiving gatherings, we may find ourselves remembering Thanksgivings in the past, recalling fondly those who once sat at the table with us and now sit at God's heavenly table. We may simply look around at our family table and see familiar faces and the familiar stories and simply be grateful that we are a part of it all. Wherever our mindset may be, Thanksgiving offers us a moment to pause and simply be grateful for the people we are.

What are you grateful for this Thanksgiving? The list should be endless! Certainly, we need to be aware and grateful for the many sacrifices made by Americans of the past as well as today. We are familiar with the our ancestors experienced and the early struggles eventual "meeting of the minds" with Native Americans who offered their assistance in building, planting, and harvesting. We also received a dream from them for which we must be grateful. This republic was to recognize the common bond that women and men share; the fact that all are created equal by God. America was to stand for possibilities; you can become whomever you choose as long as you are willing to work for it. The gift of freedom is just that - a gift, and Americans will go to any length to assure the reality of freedom in American life. By celebrating Thanksgiving Day, we are saying thanks for these and so many other blessings of life we enjoy in the United States.

### **Christmas Food Baskets**

In anticipation of the needs of families in our area, our Social Ministry Committee is collecting food for the Christmas food baskets. Only **food** items are needed and the following are staple items that we include in each box: peanut butter, jelly, spaghetti sauce/marinara, spaghetti or other pasta, tuna fish or canned meat, canned or dried soup, canned fruit, canned vegetables, cereal, oatmeal, cake mixes, frosting, cookie and muffin mixes, jello or pudding, pancake mix, rice, dried potatoes, stuffing mix, baby food, baby cereal and baby drinks, and hot chocolate mix.

### **Christmas Basket Gift and Turkey Tags**

Christmas trees are up and turkey and gift tags have been placed on the trees by the coordinators. Both turkey and gift tags have a top and bottom tag. Sign your name and phone number on the bottom tag, detach and place it in the box. Take the top tag home and call the coordinator. Take the turkey tag with you when purchasing the turkey. It will be attached to the turkey and placed in the freezer of the store until the date of pickup. Attach the gift tag to the child's gift before placing it under the tree.

#### FROM THE FINANCE COUNCIL

In addition to donating cash or checks, there are other tax beneficial ways that you can donate to St. Mary Our Mother School or Parish.

If you are over age 70-1/2 and you have an IRA retirement account, you may be eligible for a tax benefit called a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). This provision in the tax law allows you to make a distribution from your IRA directly to St. Mary Our Mother. Using the QCD option, you can transfer up to \$100,000 per year to charity and exclude the entire distribution from your gross income for tax purposes. In addition, the distribution can be counted toward your annual Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) that must be withdrawn from your account anyway. This is a nice tax benefit that allows you to reduce your taxable income, regardless of whether you are otherwise eligible to deduct charitable contributions on your tax return. To use the QCD election you will just need to sign a form provided by your IRA account custodi-

In you have appreciated securities, you may be able to save money on capital gains taxes by donating shares to St. Mary Our Mother. You can transfer a stock, bond, mutual fund or exchange traded fund (ETF) position that has appreciated in value, directly to our investment account. We can sell the position for you and use the proceeds. We do not owe capital gains tax on the sale, since we are a qualified non-profit organization. In addition to avoiding capital gains on selling the position, you may also be able to deduct the value of the security that you donate, as a charitable contribution.

If you hold the appreciated security in a brokerage account, your custodian can provide you with the forms to sign to make the transfer. Please call our parish office for any additional instructions at 607-739-3817.
