#### 2nd SUNDAY OF ADVENT

What does it mean to be worthy? There are a few different ways to approach this question. Today's Gospel highlights two: the way of the Pharisees and the way of John the Baptist. Our faith values good works and discipleship. Perhaps, then, we "earn" our worth by adhering to the right doctrines and following the right pious practice. The Pharisees thought they were worthy. Due to their religious pedigree and proper procedures, they were self-satisfied. John the Baptist's words to them are strong. "Do not resume to say to vourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.'" Of course, Jesus (and John) don't omit the responsibility for moral behavior. John gives the Pharisees quite a strong warning in that regard. "Produce good fruit as evidence of your repentance ... every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire.'

It's a question of attitude. Of disposition. It's a matter of the heart. If anyone would be worthy in this scenario, it's John the Baptist. Jesus himself will name him the greatest of prophets and a great man. John, however, recognizes his own lowly place in the grand scheme of things. "The one who is coming after me is mightier than I. I am not worthy to carry his sandals." The Pharisees take pride in being "better" than others. John embraces humility in Christ being "better" than him. We don't self-generate our own worthiness. We receive it as a gift from God.

In a few short weeks, we'll celebrate the birth of Christ. Bishop Ven. Fulton Sheen wrote about the Nativity in his "Life of Christ": "Because [Jesus] was born in a cave, all who wish to see Him must stoop. To stoop is the mark of humility. The proud refuse to stoop and, therefore, they miss divinity." God invites us to prepare our hearts this Advent. When you consider your own life, where are you looking for your worth? This Christmas, are you prepared to stoop? *Litrugical Publications, Inc.*

Only **food** items are needed and the following are staple items that we include in each box: peanut butter, jelly, spaghetti sauce/marinara, spaghetti or other pasta, tuna fish or canned meat, canned or dried soup, canned fruit, canned vegetables, cereal, oatmeal, cake mixes, frosting, cookie and muffin mixes, jello or pudding, pancake mix, rice, dried potatoes, stuffing mix, baby food, baby cereal and baby drinks, and hot chocolate mix.

#### **Christmas Basket Gift and Turkey Tags**

Christmas trees are up and turkey and gift tags have been placed on the trees by the coordinators. Both turkey and gift tags have a top and bottom tag. Sign your name and phone number on the bottom tag, detach and place it in the box. Take the top tag home and call the coordinator. Take the turkey tag with you when purchasing the turkey. #### PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

We begin the **second week** of the **season of Advent**. This season always presents us with an invitation and challenge to take some time out of these extremely busy and hectic December days to slow down and to be more award of the presence of God among us. Years ago, John the Baptist preached this message and encouraged people to listen to his message as he proclaimed and prepared for Jesus' coming. Advent is a season of anticipation and joy that comes from knowing that God is in our midst. This Advent, I encourage you to allow God to comfort you and take away any anxiety you may have that prevents you from fully entering into the joy of this time of year.

Advent is traditionally a time of quiet reflection, prayerful growth, and powerful affirmation. Amidst the hustle and bustle of this time of year, the Church invites you daily to step aside for a while, if only for a few moments. You may find some time to read the Advent scriptures, one of the Advent books provided for you, or just spend some time in the quiet of your own heart. It is in these moments that we can realize how God is present to us, where we can experience the grace that only God can give, a grace that binds us to one another and through the Church to God. See in all the Christmas finery, parties and gathering, the fine clothes and the wrapped deep signs of acceptance, community. companionship and love. If there is one message that needs to be sent through Advent, it is a message that we are loved unconditionally by our God.

As you journey through this Advent season, take a few moments to think what you do and why you do it during this season. It is to show love, to allow those closest to us to know how important they are and to tell others more by gestures than by word this is a special time of year. It is your chance to remind the important people in your life how important they are. Advent will lead to Christmas, and Christmas reminds us of the special relationship we share with God. This relationship helps us understand that throughout the year, the goodness we share with each other serves as a reminder of the present of God in each of our lives.

Many of you may remember the late Father Joseph F. Hogan. Father Hogan served as the pastor of St. Vincent de Paul Church in Corning from 1964-1983. He also served as the first chaplain at Notre Dame High School from 1955-1961. Upon his retirement, Father Hogan came to live at St. Patrick Church, Elmira, with the then pastor, Father Daniel F. Holland and me. When he was assigned to be the homilist for the weekend Masses during the season of Advent, St. Patrick had four weekend Masses, (all parishes in Chemung County had 4-5 weekend Masses in those days). Father Hogan would include the following poem in his homily. I am not sure of the author, but it is entitled, *Promise, My Christmas Pledge*:

- 1. I promise to make my Christmas a holy day with Christ not a holy day without Him.
- 2. I promise to observe Christmas as the birthday of Christ not a day to give and receive just material gifts.

- 3. I promise to remember that the real symbols of Christmas are the Star, the Stable, and the Crib not Santa and his reindeer.

#### **Christmas Basket Dates**

#### From the Finance Council

In addition to donating cash or checks, there are other tax beneficial ways that you can donate to St. Mary Our Mother School or Parish.

If you are over age 70-1/2 and you have an IRA retirement account, you may be eligible for a tax benefit called a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). This provision in the tax law allows you to make a distribution from your IRA directly to St. Mary Our Mother. Using the QCD option, you can transfer up to \$100,000 per year to charity and exclude the entire distribution from your gross income for tax purposes. In addition, the distribution can be counted toward your annual Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) that must be withdrawn from your account anyway. This is a nice tax benefit that allows you to reduce your taxable income, regardless of whether you are otherwise eligible to deduct charitable contributions on your tax return. To use the QCD election you will just need to sign a form provided by your IRA account custodian.

In you have appreciated securities, you may be able to save money on capital gains taxes by donating shares to St. Mary Our Mother. You can transfer a stock, bond, mutual fund or exchange traded fund (ETF) position that has appreciated in value, directly to our investment account. We can sell the position for you and use the proceeds. We do not owe capital gains tax on the sale, since we are a qualified non-profit organization. In addition to avoiding capital gains on selling the position, you may also be able to deduct the value of the security that you donate, as a charitable contribution.

If you hold the appreciated security in a brokerage account, your custodian can provide you with the forms to sign to make the transfer. Please call our parish office for any additional instructions at 607-739-3817.

#### **JESSE TREE**

Advent is a season of preparation before Christmas. The word Advent means "coming" and refers to the coming of Jesus. The season emphasizes a three fold coming, the coming in the flesh at Bethlehem, in grace through word and sacrament, and in glory on the day of judgment.

Many people go to great lengths to prepare for Christmas, yet fail to appreciate the true meaning of Advent. Advent, when properly observed, helps you realize more fully the coming of Christ and its meaning for you.

Advent begins four Sundays before Christmas and lasts until Christmas Eve. The lessons read in church each Sunday of the season picture some of the people and events that are significant in the heritage of Jesus.

The Jesse tree has the same purpose, but it expands it by presenting an appropriate story in picture for each day of the season. The Jesse tree is a small tree decorated with symbols portraying the spiritual heritage of Jesus. It is a kind of family tree that was suggested by Isaiah's prophet: "a shoot shall come out of the stump of Jesse" (Isaiah 11:1).

Our Jesse tree is located in the seasonal shrine. Each day a different symbol of Jesus' heritage will be placed on the tree. We welcome you to step into the shrine and turn over the corresponding scripture for the second week.
