#### PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

At every Sunday liturgy, we see numbers of families attending church together. A variety of families compose the parish "family" of St. Mary Our Mother: mothers and fathers with sons and daughters; single parents with their children, grandparents and their children, and combinations of others. It is a wonderful sight to see people of all ages gathering together to worship as one. It is a vivid reminder that we are living for today but with a vision for tomorrow. The heart and core of the Christian life is the family.

Today, we celebrate the **Feast of the Holy Family** of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. These three are central figures of this Christmas season. When reading the scriptural passages about the Nativity, you will find that God was very much a part of each person's life. God sent Gabriel to Mary and she said "Yes"; then God sent Gabriel to Joseph to fill him in on God's plan, and Joseph said "Yes". Then God told Joseph to move from Bethlehem to Egypt, and along with Mary, they gathered the child and were on their way. Jesus was conceived; Jesus was born; Jesus was saved. His early life was surrounded by this Holy Family.

There is not a great amount written in the scriptures about the early years of Jesus. We presume that He was raised like any other Jewish boy of His day. He adopted Joseph's profession as a carpenter. He went to the synagogue and observed the Jewish rituals. The adult Jesus reflects a balanced person, a religious individual, and someone with a strong moral character. Presumably, this was due to the effect that His parents had on Him. Family was the core of His life. This Feast of the Holy Family found between Christmas and New Year's Day is our attempt as Catholics to emphasize the family as all families continue to celebrate these wonderful Christmas holidays.

One of the enriching moments of our liturgy at St. Mary Our Mother is to see the many ways our children participate during Mass. Recently, I was presiding at one of our First Friday school Masses, and a certain song was sung with which our children are very familiar. They sung at the top of their lungs, and it was a wonderful experience to hear them join their hearts and voices together. The Christmas Eve Family Mass was another special celebration where our children took an active role in the liturgy as singers and instrumentalists. The recent school Christmas program, where every single student in our school has a role, is yet another example. witness the same kind of childlike enthusiasm in our Faith Formation and Sacramental Preparation programs. Their innocence, their enthusiasm, and their willingness to be involved helps to raise our spirits and helps us live in praise of God.

Holy Family Sunday invites us to celebrate the varieties of people who are part of our lives and enrich these days of Christmas season. It also calls us to appreciate and encourage the next generation to continue to participate and to see the church as belonging to them. It also reminds us that these little people are an important part of our Sunday celebrations. Sometimes they are noisy; sometimes they are fidgety; sometimes they distract us - but, they are children, and we need to accept

## **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS**Children's Liturgy of the Word

Children's Liturgy of the Word is provided for all children in grades pre-k through 5th grade most Sundays at 10:30 a.m. Mass, from mid-September to mid-June.

There is no charge for this program and no registration is required. Children's Liturgy of the Word is ritual centered on the proclamation and breaking open of the Sunday scriptures. The children do what the rest of the community is doing only it is more appropriate to their level of understanding. Because it is a liturgical celebration, all the principles of liturgy (active participation, clear symbols, etc.) apply.

We also provide a weekly pamphlet, "Explaining God's Word," a take home resource that includes a reflection on the weekly Gospel, activities to enhance understanding, as well as a family page to help you in your efforts in teaching your child.

If your child is hesitant to participate and you wish to accompany them until they are comfortable attending, we invite you to do so. The children rejoin the assembly for the Liturgy Celebration of the Eucharist.

We invite adults to consider volunteering in this ministry. It is a minimal commitment and training is provided. We are also looking for some committed students, 6th grade and up, to join our team as assistants for the adult liturgists. Teens help lead the children into the school and assure they are all returned to their parents after the program as well as help meet the needs of the children while in the care of adults liturgists. #### **EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP**

I use GPS wherever I go, and it serves me well most of the time. However, sometimes it leads me to a place that does not exist. Then there are those times when I am about to turn, and the man inside my phone shouts out, "GPS signal lost!" or "Rerouting!" The problem is, when the area is unfamiliar to me, I have no choice but to listen. I could try to get where I am going by simple intuition or by pulling over to look at a paper map, but I don't trust my sense of direction. And I haven't bought a paper map in close to a decade!

Many people move through life without any direction. They find themselves constantly rerouting and wondering when they will ever get to a satisfying final destination. What they need is a compass and a companion for the journey. Yet they have no idea how to get either.

Prayer can serve as a compass, and it connects us to a companion for the journey. Stewardship living is impossible without prayer. If we count on our own will and believe we can become fruitful without daily contact with the Divine, we can find ourselves looking for directions more than moving toward a destination. God, through prayer, will help us see all we have as a gift. God, through prayer, will lead us away from materialism and selfishness and toward freedom and generosity. Even when we fall to sin, the path back is clearer. God's GPS signal is never really lost. — *Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS*
