SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

People are not property. We cannot exchange them at will or simply use them for our own designs and purposes. What does the word "commitment" mean to you? We can begin to understand its meaning by looking at some synonyms: dedication, devotion, allegiance, loyalty, faithfulness, fidelity, and bond. Commitment is primarily about relationship, and Jesus is all about relationships. How our lives affect others, how we treat our brothers and sisters, how we resolve conflict, and how we view the vows of marriage. Jesus' teachings on obeying the commandments, murder, reconciliation, marriage, divorce, and adultery all stem from the sacredness of commitment. All of this has a God connection.

We can easily see one another as interchangeable and dispensable. We treat so much of our lives this way. What works today may not be what I want tomorrow. We search and search for the right thing only to find our hearts still restless in the end. Is real happiness achievable this side of the grave? Sometimes we expect too much out of others and want our relationships to fill a hole that we must figure out how to fill ourselves. Any seasoned married couple will tell you that their love for one another changes as time passes. Even though the understanding of romance changes as life changes, the dedication, devotion, allegiance, loyalty, faithfulness, and fidelity all remain and even deepen.

Some relationships can be hurtful, and God does not want us to live with abuse or pain. Also, how a relationship develops is sometimes out of our control, and we become the victim of someone else's decision. But we can't be self-focused in our relationships and see them exclusively as self-fulfilling ends. We are companions on life's journey with varying depths of relationships being enjoyed by all who are with us along the way. We have the freedom to choose. God asks us to do so wisely, with right judgment and thinking.

Children's Liturgy of the Word

Children's Liturgy of the Word is provided for all children in grade Pre K-4 through 5th grade, most Sundays at 10:30 a.m. Mass, from mid-September to mid-June. There is no charge for this program and no registration is required.

Children's Liturgy of the Word is ritual centered on the proclamation and breaking open of the Sunday scriptures. The children do what the rest of the community is doing only it is more appropriate to their level of understanding. Because it is a liturgical celebration, all the principles of liturgy (active participation, clear symbols, etc.) apply. We also provide a weekly pamphlet "Explaining God's Word", a take-home resource that includes a reflection on the weekly Gospel, activities to enhance understanding, as well as a Family Page to help you in your efforts to teach your child about our faith.

If your child is hesitant to participate and you wish to accompany them until they are comfortable attending, we invite you to do so. The children rejoin the assembly for the Liturgy celebration of the Eucharist.

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

On Sunday, January 26th, the entire world was shocked to learn of the tragic news of the passing of **Kobe Bryant**, his daughter, **Gianna**, and seven others in a helicopter crash in Calabasas, California. A few days after the accident, I found the following article written on January 29th by Jeanne Leonardi about Kobe Bryant, which I would like to share with you.

GOD'S HALL OF FAME

On January 26th, Kobe Bryant, considered one of the greatest basketball players of all time, died in a helicopter crash, along with his daughter Gianna and seven others. Everyone was saddened to hear of his passing and are curious to know more about who this man really was.

While most of his fans know all about his record breaking stats, not many people know about the role his Catholic faith played in helping him deal with challenging people in his life. He was a husband and a father of four. Bryant was at the top of his game and everything seemed to be going well for him.

Bryant said it was a priest who helped him to make some personal realizations during the darkest moments of his life. Describing his fear of being sent to jail for a crime he didn't commit, he said, "the one thing that really helped me during that time was talking to that priest." Bryant also had connected his Catholic faith to a family commitment to help the poor through the Kobe and Vanessa Bryant Foundation. The focus is on helping homeless young people in need. Asked about his commitment, his answer would have pleased Pope Francis.

"At the end of my career, I don't want to look back and say, well, I had a successful career because I won so many championships and scored so many points. There's something else you have to do with that. It's easy to point the blame at those who are homeless and say, 'well, you made a bad decision. It's your fault.' In life we all make mistakes and to stand back and wash your hands of it...that's not right."

Bryant realized that fame and fortune were nothing compared to the importance of faith and family. He had his priorities right. God came first. He received Communion before he got on that plane last Sunday. Shortly after Kobe won the greatest award of all...his name is now inscribed in God's Hall of Fame.

EVERY DAY STEWARDSHIP

One day, my son was explaining to his mother that he felt she had lied to him. It was nothing very important, but he wanted to take this opportunity to share how important telling the truth is to him. He explained that he simply tells it like it is in all aspects of his life. But an hour later, we caught him in a lie! Again, it was not about a matter of life and death, but it was a lie. When confronted with his own previous words on how important telling the truth was to him, he just smiled. Yes, the guilty often have no words of defense.

Jesus said it best in Matthew 5: "Let your 'yes' mean 'yes' and your 'no' mean 'no." He was warning his disciples about false oaths and then instructing them on the fullness of the Hebrew laws. We may try to do what we say and say what we mean, but it can be all too easy to fall short. We call ourselves disciples yet provide evidence to the contrary by our actions (or lack of them).

Even if we feel that we have lied to no one, we may have lied to ourselves. We portray ourselves as generous, thankful, and loving people, yet fail to answer God's call in a situation because we perceive the cost to be too great. Jesus did not simply mean for his message to be about two words. He also meant that when you say you are a disciple, make sure you are a disciple as well.

Funding for Energy Efficiency and Critical Capital Needs in Catholic Schools

Next to salary and benefits for personnel, the costs for energy and facility maintenance/repair are among the largest portions of school budgets. But unlike public school counterparts, religious and independent schools do not receive state building aid, nor do they have the authority to levy taxes or issue bonds to finance energy efficiency or other important capital projects. Although energy-saving improvements can pay for themselves over time, the upfront costs are often out of reach for cash-strapped schools. Maintaining Catholic Schools is not only good for the students and their families, it saves taxpayers the cost of educating those students.

The Diocese of Rochester with the NYS Catholic Conference urges a \$200 million appropriation in the next state budget for critical projects at religious and independent schools and an energy efficient grant/loan program (\$75 million) to provide seed money for energy efficiency projects. Those schools utilizing the loan fund would repay the grants with the savings they achieve in energy efficiency.

This initiative is consistent with the Diocese of Rochester's action/advocacy to respond to the call of Pope Francis in his encyclical, *Laudata Si: On Care For Our Common Home*, and is consistent with the New York State renewable energy and conservation goals to address climate change.


