Therefore, we will suspend offering Communion from the cup until further notice. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.

# LENTEN REGULATIONS

During Lent, the regulations for fast and abstinence are: all Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. Good Friday is a day of fasting;

All persons who are fourteen years of age or older are bound by the law of abstinence;

All persons between the ages of 18 and 59, inclusive, are bound by the law of fasting;

Catholics are especially encouraged to perform acts of penance during the season of Lent.

**Abstinence** - refrain from eating meat at all meals that day.

**Fasting** - only one full meal, the other two meals small enough that together they do not equal one full meal.

The season of Lent began on Ash Wednesday and continues through to Holy Thursday. Good Friday has its own rule of fast and abstinence.

It includes a vast collection of religious books on a wide variety of topics such as faith, Scripture, Mary and the saints, Eucharist, forgiveness, family life, the Catholic Church and more. The books, which are arranged by topic, are located in the west end of the vestibule on the book cases across from the reconciliation rooms.

Lent is a special time where we are called to spiritual growth. A book on a religious topic might be a great companion on your Lenten journey. It can act as a springboard for reflection and prayer and might just be what you need to enrich and refresh your faith this Lenten season.

## **PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE**

It has been some time since I have mentioned the Catholic Ministries Appeal. The theme for this year's appeal is, "*I Am the Vine: You are the Branches.*" If you have not already made a pledge to this year's appeal, I encourage you to do so to help us toward our parish's CMA goal. You can make your gift online at <u>www.dor.org/cma</u> or use one of the CMA envelopes available on the table in the vestibule. As of Friday, February 28th, 262 donors have contributed \$74,647.88 (67%) towards our goal of \$112,209, so we are \$37,561.12 short at this time. Please join in bearing good fruit to help support our Church.

Often times the question is asked: *How is my tribution used?* When you give to the Catholic contribution used? When you give to the Catholic Ministries Appeal, you are really giving to the eager children hungry to learn about the faith of their parents and generations of Catholics. You are giving to the dedicated young seminarians learning to serve God and the Church, or the older priest who has served the Church faithfully through the years and needs support in his retirement. Your money goes to help the vital work of Catholic Charities, to families like yours whose faith sees them through the ever-growing stress of life. And you give "locally", as more than one-half of every dollar raised returns to St. Mary Our Mother in the form of services and programming that our parish and our school would have difficulty providing on our own. One additional item needs to be remembered: All funds raised in the CMA are only used for the programs, services, and ministries for which they are designated. No gifts to the CMA are used to satisfy legal fees or costs.

Another question: How much should I give? That is a personal decision you must make. Many people I know, including me, contribute 10% of one's gross income to charity. The breakdown is usually 5% to the support of their parish; the other 5% to the CMA and other charitable organizations and causes. As good Christian stewards, each of us is called to reflect the compassion and generosity of Jesus, who gave His very life for us. We are called to be good stewards of the many blessings God has bestowed on us. That is true discipleship. It means that God asks us to use our blessings well, to assist others, and to share our many gifts so that our blessings and wealth, however large or small, does good for God and returns to God with increase. Generous giving always involves a sacrifice, but only you can decide your level of generosity. But one thing is certain: Our God promises that our generosity will be returned to us in a generous way that will delight us.

Have a great second week of Lent. Continue to use these Lenten days for growth and renewal. See you in church!
