

LIFE IN THE HOLY SPIRIT

GOSPEL MEDITATION Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

We are all familiar with the refrain, "You have put on Christ. In him you have been baptized. Alleluia, alleluia!" In Baptism, we "put on" Christ. In putting on Christ, we put on all that Christ is and represents: hope, faith, and love. We are no longer bound to the sins and failures of the flesh, that part of us that resists God and relies exclusively on human means. It also means that we are not in debt to our past, complete with its sins, failures, regrets, fears, and unfulfilled dreams. There is always hope. In putting on Christ, we put on God's vision for the world, for all of His children and for us. We have been given a road map to guide our paths and a blueprint to follow for our life's journey.

There is no need for regret, and we are not tethered to our past. Is there anything in your past that you regret? Any decision or memory that continues to haunt you? We have all made mistakes, and we have this uncanny ability to continue beating ourselves up over things we can no longer do anything about, except learn from them. To put on Christ means that I can now bring God's unconditional love to my hurtful memories and sinful choices. With each new moment and every new choice, I can start clean and live in freedom.

Imagine adults when the disciples were preaching and baptizing. They came to baptism not really knowing who they were, with pasts that were broken, seeking to live the joy of the Gospel they heard spoken to them and wanting the love they saw witnessed in the lives of those who believed. What tremendous celebrations their baptisms must have been! They could now have the support of a community, full participation in the sacraments of the church, focus for their disordered lives, consolation, healing, and an understanding of what life is really all about.

Our lives are meant to be celebrations of the Spirit we have received in Baptism. How does that joy get expressed in and through you? When we truly understand that we have put on Christ, our burdens can become much lighter. It is odd that so many Christians look like they are carrying the weight of the world on their shoulders. Wouldn't it be wonderful if those weights could be lifted and joy experienced!

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

Welcome back! Thank you for your participation this Independence Day weekend in the celebration of the Eucharist. Your presence here today is a wonderful blessing after so many weeks apart. As we resume our public worship at St. Mary Our Mother, there will be many aspects of our liturgy that will not seem "normal" for any of us. We outline here what you can expect and the guidelines we ask you to observe when on campus for the protection of yourself, the others you encounter, and our parish staff. Feel free to be in touch with any questions, in advance.

We ask that you register each week for the Mass you will be attending, as we need to limit the size of the congregation to 33% of our church seating capacity, approximately 150 people. You may email the parish at smomc@stny.rr.com or call the parish office at 739-3817 no later than Thursday of each week by 4:00 p.m. If you are sick or in the "at risk category", please remember that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass has been suspended until further notice.

We ask that you observe the following instructions:

Welcome Back Instructions

To Prepare To Attend:

Wash your hands before you leave home. Bring a face covering or mask; masks are required from the time you exit your car in the parking lot until you return to your car. (This also applies for private prayer in church.) Bring your own hand sanitizer to use before receiving Communion. Please do not congregate in the church building or anywhere on the campus.

When You Arrive:

Please see an usher for assistance. You can deposit your offering envelope in the receptacle near the doors when you arrive. There will not be a collection at the offertory. Please sanitize your hands at one of the stations as you enter church. You will be directed to a seat in church, with seating beginning in the front to the back.

During Mass:

Generally, there will be little congregational singing, as masks must <u>always</u> be worn throughout Mass. There is to be no physical contact during the Lord's Prayer or at the Sign of Peace. When approaching to receive Communion, please follow the directions of the ushers or volunteers present. Remain six feet apart from others, observing the markings on the floor.

As you receive Communion, receive Communion in your hands (there is no safe or hygienic manner to receive Communion on the tongue during the pandemic), walk at least six feet away from the minister before lowering your mask to receive the host, replace your mask over your face, and return to your seat. The Eucharist will only be offered in the form of the Body of Christ.

Enjoy this Independence Day weekend. It is so good to finally say "see you in church!"
