
GOSPEL:

REFLECT

FIRST READING

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

We have reached the month of August in this most unusual and memorable year, as we continue to deal with the pandemic of the Coronavirus and Covid 19. This weekend will mark the fifth weekend, and one month's time since we re-opened our church for public worship. We continue to record the Saturday afternoon Mass and post it on the website for our stay at home parishioners. The Mass attendance these past four weeks has been in the 170-190 range. I would remind you once again that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass has been suspended until further notice. Therefore, if you are sick, not feeling well, or feel uncomfortable with being in a group of people, please stay at home.

As we begin this month of August, I also realize that in a little over five weeks our schools are "scheduled" to open. **Mrs. Jean Yorio**, our school principal, the faculty, maintenance staff, as well as our "school reopening task force" have been busily preparing for the start of school, implementing many of the protocols and guidelines that have been set forth due to the coronavirus pandemic. We are still awaiting information from the State of New York for further information as to the nature of our school openings.

With the increased time that parents, children, and families have had since our schools were closed down in March, I thought that the following would be wise and "timely" advice for parents.

TEN COMMANDMENTS FOR PARENTS

- 1. I will always love and respect my children for who they are and not for who I want them to be.
- 2. I will not burden my children with emotions and problems that they are not equipped to deal with, remembering that I am the parent and they are the children.
- 3. I will, when discipline is necessary, let my children know that I disapprove of what they have done, not who they are.

- 5. I will make time for my children and cherish our moments together, realizing how important and how fleeting, they are.
- 6. I will create a loving home environment and show my children that they are loved, whenever and however I can.
- 7. *I will be sure to give my children space to grow, to dream, to succeed, and even to fail.*
- 8. I will encourage my children to experience the world and all its possibilities, guiding them in its ways and taking pains to leave them careful, but not fearful.
- 9. I will take care of myself physically and emotionally so that I can be there for my children when they need me.
- 10. I will try to be the kind of person I want my children to grow up to be - loving, fair-minded, moral, giving and hopeful.

IN OUR PARISH

Recorded Masses on Website

If you are unable to attend our re-opened Masses, or are uncomfortable doing so because of the pandemic, please note that the 5:00 p.m. Mass each Saturday is recorded and is available on our website. Click on "Mass Schedule" in the upper right hand corner to access.

GUIDELINES FOR MASS ATTENDANCE

We ask that you register each week for the Mass you will be attending, as we need to limit the size of the congregation to 33% of our church seating capacity, approximately 150 people. Please call the parish office or email <u>smomc@stny.rr.com</u> no later than **Thursday** at **4:00 p.m.** Remember that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass has been suspended until further notice.

To prepare to attend:

Wash your hands before you leave home.

Bring a face covering or mask; masks are required from the time you exit your car in the parking lot until you return to your car. (This also applies to private prayer in church.)

Bring your own hand sanitizer to use before receiving Communion.

Bring your own worship materials, as no hymnals or missalettes are available.

Please do not congregate in the church building or anywhere on the campus.

One restroom is available, but do not congregate around it.

When you arrive:

Please plan to arrive 10-15 minutes before Mass, and check with the person at the registration table.

Ushers will be available to help you.

You can deposit your offering envelope in the receptacle near the doors when you arrive. There will not be a collection at the offertory.

Please sanitize your hands at one of the stations as you enter church.

You will be directed to a seat in church, with seating beginning in the front to the back.

The chapel remains closed at this time.

During Mass:

Generally, there will be little congregational singing, as masks must **<u>always</u>** be worn throughout Mass.

There will be no acolytes, altar servers or choir, one lector, one Eucharistic Minister, one cantor, when needed.

There is to be no physical contact during the Lord's Prayer or at the Sign of Peace.

When approaching to receive Communion, please follow the directions of the ushers or volunteers present. Remain six feet apart from others, observing the markings on the floor.

As you receive Communion, receive Communion in your hands (there is no safe or hygienic manner to receive Communion on the tongue during the pandemic), walk at least six feet away from the minister before lowering your mask to receive the host, replace your mask, and return to your seat. The Eucharist will only be offered in the form of the Body of Christ.

You are not obliged to receive Communion at Mass if you are uncomfortable doing so. If you are not receiving Communion, simply step out of your seat and back away to allow others to return to their seat with minimal contact.

Going forth:

At the end of Mass, the priest will go immediately to the sacristy, and the ushers will direct you to exit from the church building, beginning with the last pew first.

Private prayer is not available after Mass as to

facilitate immediate cleaning and sanitizing of the pews and restrooms.

Please go directly to your vehicle when you leave church, with no socializing in the Church, side walks, or in the parking lots.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation as we work our way through this phased reopening process. We thank you for your suggestions as we move forward!
