

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

This past Saturday we celebrated an event that we usually celebrate in the parish on a weekend in May. I am referring to the First Communion of twenty of our children. These children have been preparing for this sacrament since the beginning of March, only to have everything upended by the Coronavirus pandemic. Unfortunately, we were not able to offer parishioners an "open invitation" to attend the First Communion liturgy, due to the current restrictions regarding church and public gatherings in the State of New York. We offer our best wishes and congratulations to these children, their parents and families on this special occasion. We have an additional fourteen children anticipating their First Communion, and we are planning to celebrate with these families soon.

When all public Masses were suspended back in March due to the Coronavirus pandemic, it not only affected the children and families in our First Communion program, but also those participating in the RCIA process as well as our students preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation. As I write this, we are in the process of selecting a date to receive our RCIA candidates into full membership in the Catholic Church. In addition, we have received information this past week that the date for our candidates for Confirmation will be confirmed on Saturday, August 29th at All Saints Parish in Corning. In previous years, you would be cordially invited to attend this Confirmation liturgy to offer your support to those being confirmed. However, due to the New York State restrictions that are still in effect regarding all church and public gatherings, we cannot extend such an invitation. Although many who might choose to attend the Confirmation liturgy, I would invite you to continue to pray for both our Confirmation candidates as well as our RCIA candidates as they continue their preparation for full initiation into our church community.

Thank you to all who continue to register and join us for Sunday Mass. You can e-mail or call the parish office by Thursday at 4:00 p.m. We hope to add some music to our Sunday liturgies beginning next week.

IN OUR PARISH

Recorded Masses on Website

If you are unable to attend our re-opened Masses, or are uncomfortable doing so because of the pandemic, please note that the 5:00 p.m. Mass each Saturday is recorded and is available on our website. Click on "Mass Schedule" in the upper right hand corner to access.

GUIDELINES FOR MASS ATTENDANCE

We ask that you register each week for the Mass you will be attending, as we need to limit the size of the congregation to 33% of our church seating capacity, approximately 150 people. Please call the parish office or email smomc@stny.rr.com no later than **Thursday** at **4:00 p.m.** Remember that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass has been suspended until further notice.

To prepare to attend:

Wash your hands before you leave home.

Bring a face covering or mask; masks are required from the time you exit your car in the parking lot until you return to your car. (This also applies to private prayer in church.)

Bring your own hand sanitizer to use before receiving Communion.

Bring your own worship materials, as no hymnals or missalettes are available.

Please do not congregate in the church building or anywhere on the campus.

One restroom is available, but do not congregate around it.

When you arrive:

Please plan to arrive 10-15 minutes before Mass, and check with the person at the registration table.

Ushers will be available to help you.

You can deposit your offering envelope in the receptacle near the doors when you arrive. There will not be a collection at the offertory.

Please sanitize your hands at one of the stations as you enter church.

You will be directed to a seat in church, with seating beginning in the front to the back.

The chapel remains closed at this time.

During Mass:

Generally, there will be little congregational singing, as masks must <u>always</u> be worn throughout Mass.

There will be no acolytes, altar servers or choir, one lector, one Eucharistic Minister, one cantor, when needed.

There is to be no physical contact during the Lord's Prayer or at the Sign of Peace.

When approaching to receive Communion, please follow the directions of the ushers or volunteers present. Remain six feet apart from others, observing the markings on the floor.

As you receive Communion, receive Communion in your hands (there is no safe or hygienic manner to receive Communion on the tongue during the pandemic), walk at least six feet away from the minister before lowering your mask to receive the host, replace your mask, and return to your seat. The Eucharist will only be offered in the form of the Body of Christ.

You are not obliged to receive Communion at Mass if you are uncomfortable doing so. If you are not receiving Communion, simply step out of your seat and back away to allow others to return to their seat with minimal contact.

Going forth:

At the end of Mass, the priest will go immediately to the sacristy, and the ushers will direct you to exit from the church building, beginning with the last pew first.

Private prayer is not available after Mass as to facilitate immediate cleaning and sanitizing of

the pews and restrooms.

Please go directly to your vehicle when you leave church, with no socializing in the Church, side walks, or in the parking lots.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation as we work our way through this phased reopening process. We thank you for your suggestions as we move forward!
