

#### LIVE THE LITURGY

#### Inspiration for the week

Think for a moment about the most special person in your life. Why do you love them? Many people will answer that question noting character traits they admire about the person, pointing to an indescribable compatibility that exists and describing a deep sense of connection and intimacy or even a sense of rightness about the relationship. In relationships that are authentic and true, rarely are the personal benefits gained from the relationship noted as motivating factors for its pursuit. Today is Catechetical Sunday, a day when we acknowledge and affirm the many dedicated people who serve as teachers and catechists in the various faith formation programs in our parish. This year's theme for Catechetical Sunday by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) is "I received from the Lord what I handed on to you." Today is a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the role each of us plays in handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel.

In past years, under more "normal" circumstances, and before the COVID-19 pandemic, I would offer a listing of all those teachers and catechists in our various faith formation and sacramental preparation programs. Like so many other changes we have witnessed these past six months, I have asked Mrs. Matterazzo to give an update regarding our faith formation programs here in the parish.

Dear Friends,

In 2020-21 the face of Faith Formation will look very different than ever before. Due to the strict CDC regulations, we are going completely remote for this year.

For our children in K-7th grade, we will offer two programs, Home Study and Google Classroom remote learning. The Home Study is facilitated by the parents; Google Classroom is facilitated through recorded Catechist video lessons. Each program will include regular check-in Zoom sessions or when possible, small group sessions.

Preparation for Confirmation will also be remote learning. Year One will use Google classroom recorded lessons; Year Two will use the Matthew Kelly "Decision Point" online program. This preparation includes a retreat, community service, and scheduled small group sessions.

First Holy Eucharist and First Penance are at-home programs facilitated by the parents, supported by the Faith Formation team. As Church, we believe parents are the first and most important teachers of the faith. We provide appropriate Catholic teaching materials and an afternoon retreat to assist parents in this most important task.

Our goal in creating these "COVID-19" programs is to provide enough information to keep our families connected and growing in faith, while keeping in mind the challenges families are facing this year with academic requirements and personal adjustments.

Please join me in thanking: Father Chris and the parish staff for their support in the work we do.

#### **GUIDELINES FOR MASS ATTENDANCE**

We ask that you register each week for the Mass you will be attending, as we need to limit the size of the congregation to 33% of our church seating capacity, approximately 150 people. Please call the parish office or email smomc@stny.rr.com no later than **Thursday** at Remember that the obligation to attend 4:00 p.m. Sunday Mass has been suspended until further notice.

#### To prepare to attend:

Wash your hands before you leave home.

Bring a face covering or mask; masks are required from the time you exit your car in the parking lot until you return to your car. (This also applies to private prayer in church.)

Bring your own hand sanitizer to use before receiving Communion.

Bring your own worship materials, as no hymnals or missalettes are available.

Please do not congregate in the church building or anywhere on the parish grounds.

One restroom is available, but do not congregate around it.

#### When you arrive:

Please plan to arrive 10-15 minutes before Mass, and check with the person at the registration table.

Ushers will be available to help you.

You can deposit your offering envelope in the receptacle near the doors when you arrive. There will not be a collection at the offertory.

Please sanitize your hands at one of the stations as you enter church.

You will be directed to a seat in church, with seating beginning in the front to the back.

The chapel remains closed at this time.

#### **During Mass:**

Generally, there will be little congregational singing. as masks must always be worn throughout Mass.

There will be no acolytes, altar servers or choir, one lector, one Eucharistic Minister, one cantor, when needed.

There is to be no physical contact during the Lord's Prayer or at the Sign of Peace.

When approaching to receive Communion, please follow the directions of the ushers or volunteers present. Remain six feet apart from others, observing the markings on the floor.

As you receive Communion, receive Communion in your hands (there is no safe or hygienic manner to receive Communion on the tongue during the pandemic), walk at least six feet away from the minister before lowering your mask to receive the host, replace your mask, and return to your seat. The Eucharist will only be offered in the form of the Body of Christ.

You are not obliged to receive Communion at Mass if you are uncomfortable doing so. If you are not receiving Communion, simply step out of your seat and back away to allow others to return to their seat with minimal contact.

#### Going forth:

At the end of Mass, the priest will go immediately to the sacristy, and the ushers will direct you to exit from the church building, beginning with the last pew first.

Private prayer is not available after Mass as to facilitate immediate cleaning and sanitizing of

the pews and restrooms. Please go directly to your vehicle when you leave church, with no socializing in the Church, side

walks, or in the parking lots.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation as we work our way through this phased reopening process. We thank you for your suggestions as we move forward!
