PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

For the past forty years, there has been an annual campaign seeking financial support for the many ministries and outreach services of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Rochester, known as the **Catholic Ministries Appeal**. It supports the on-going work of the ministry in all parishes of our diocese.

The theme of this year's appeal is *Christ, Our Light*. By now, you should have received materials for the Catholic Ministries Appeal inviting your support of this year's appeal. Our parish goal this year is the same as last year's goal - \$112,209.

It is important to remember that the work of the Church continues even in these most challenging days as we continue to deal with the effects of the Coronavirus. Despite these uncertain days, the needs of the Church continue. This appeal supports ministries offered beyond individual parishes, such as chaplaincies at colleges and universities, hospitals, prisons, vocations, the many services offered by Catholic Charities, especially to the poor, the immigrant, and those who have mental challenges. This appeal funds support services that parishes throughout the diocese rely on every day, such as faith formation and Catholic School, technology support and diocesan internet, financial services, parish support ministries and pastoral planning.

During the Covid-19 pandemic, here are a few ministries directly funded by the Catholic Ministries Appeal:

~ *Live streamed Sunday Masses celebrated by Bishop Matano;*

~ *Zoom licenses to every parish/church in the diocese giving them the ability to live stream Masses and parish activities;*

~ *Information Technology (IT) support, infrastructure, and training to create remote work environments and enabling pastors and staff to provide live-stream opportunities to continue ministries and engage parishioners;*

~ *IT Help Desk enhanced services, such as cloud-based phone system and screening; sharing technology to support nearly 3,000 employees working remotely; providing accessibility and timely response to staff needs;*

~ *IT support of Catholic Schools virtual instruction platforms;*

~ *Stewardship and Communications support to help parishes set up online giving programs and promote outreach to parishioners.*

I encourage you to view the Catholic Ministries Appeal video that is available at the Diocesan website, dor.org. If you did not receive information on the Catholic Ministries Appeal through the mail, envelopes are available in the church vestibule. We also hope to have members of our parish's Pastoral Council available one weekend in the future to answer any questions you may have concerning this appeal. I want to thank you for your anticipated generosity to this year's CMA.

CEMETERY CLEAN UP

Please remove all spring and summer decorations and flowers from the cemetery by Sunday, November 1st. Holiday decorations are allowed from November 15th through March 1st; spring and summer decorations are allowed from March 15th through November 1st. Any items you do not wish to be discarded should be removed by November 1st.

DIOCESAN BANKRUPTCY

Recently, Bishop Matano issued an update addressing the bankruptcy proceedings of the Diocese of Rochester. This letter is available on our parish website, StMaryOurMother.com.

GUIDELINES FOR MASS ATTENDANCE

We ask that you register each week for the Mass you will be attending, as we need to limit the size of the congregation to 33% of our church seating capacity, approximately 150 people. Please call the parish office or email smomc@stny.rr.com no later than **Thursday at 4:00 p.m.** Remember that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass has been suspended until further notice.

To prepare to attend:

- Wash your hands before you leave home.
- Bring a face covering or mask; masks are required from the time you exit your car in the parking lot until you return to your car. (This also applies to private prayer in church.)
- Bring your own hand sanitizer to use before receiving Communion.
- Bring your own worship materials, as no hymnals or missalettes are available.
- Please do not congregate in the church building or anywhere on the parish grounds.
- One restroom is available, but do not congregate around it.

When you arrive:

- Please plan to arrive 10-15 minutes before Mass, and check with the person at the registration table.
- Ushers will be available to help you.
- You can deposit your offering envelope in the receptacle near the doors when you arrive. There will not be a collection at the offertory.
- Please sanitize your hands at one of the stations as you enter church.
- You will be directed to a seat in church, with seating beginning in the front to the back.
- The chapel remains closed at this time.

During Mass:

- Generally, there will be little congregational singing, as masks must **always** be worn throughout Mass.
- There will be no acolytes, altar servers or choir, one lector, one Eucharistic Minister, one cantor, when needed.
- There is to be no physical contact during the Lord's Prayer or at the Sign of Peace.
- When approaching to receive Communion, please follow the directions of the ushers or volunteers present. Remain six feet apart from others, observing the markings on the floor.
- As you receive Communion, receive Communion in your hands (there is no safe or hygienic manner to receive Communion on the tongue during the pandemic), walk at least six feet away from the minister before lowering your mask to receive the host, replace your mask, and return to your seat. The Eucharist will only be offered in the form of the Body of Christ.
- You are not obliged to receive Communion at Mass if you are uncomfortable doing so. If you are not receiving Communion, simply step out of your seat and back away to allow others to return to their seat with minimal contact.

Going forth:

- At the end of Mass, the priest will go immediately to the sacristy, and the ushers will direct you to exit from the church building, beginning with the last pew first.
- Private prayer is not available after Mass as to facilitate immediate cleaning and sanitizing of the pews and restrooms.
- Please go directly to your vehicle when you leave church, with no socializing in the Church, side walks, or in the parking lots.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation as we work our way through this phased reopening process. We thank you for your suggestions as we move forward!
