PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

As I write this article due for our bulletin deadline on Monday, November 2nd, we have not received word from the New York State Governor's Office when the designation for Chemung County as an Orange Zone for the COVID-19 virus will be lifted. As I mentioned in last week's bulletin, this designation severely limits the number of people who can gather in one space to 25 people. As a result of this designation, all weekend Sunday Masses were suspended in both the Elmira parish and our parish for the past two weekends. Our daily Mass at 6:45 a.m., Monday through Thursday will continue, limited to 25 people. I wish I had a more definitive answer for you concerning when weekend Sunday Masses will resume in our county. Please continue to check the parish website for any updates on this. We will continue to offer a recorded Mass each week to help you stay connected with us. This Mass is parish available our website on www.StMaryOurMother.com.
