GOSPEL MEDITATION Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

People knew over a year in advance that the Pope was coming for a visit to America and the preparations began. Security, space limitations and requirements, protocols, crowd management, itineraries, invitations, regulations, and so much more was necessary to pull this event off effectively. It's not every day that we get a visit from such a prominent dignitary. Thought, effort, meticulous attention to detail and vision all are necessary to make this thing work. After all, he can't just show up in the ordinary and normal daily routines of life and catch people unprepared! Tickets have to be purchased, buses rented, hotel rooms reserved, and travel arrangements made early because it will be impossible to see him if we wait too long!

We do this kind of preparing not only for prominent religious figures but for political dignitaries, notable sports figures, people of fame, and even actors, if an individual intrigues us, we are going to want to do all we have to do to get a "good seat" in the house. Does Jesus Christ captivate this much of our attention? We are asked to prepare the way of the Lord and to do so not with frantic frenzy but patient enthusiasm. We do not have to stand on a street corner making profound announcements about God's coming or become overly zealous in our embrace of the Good News. Our task is quieter, more interior, captivating, and consuming, We are asked to change. We have to conduct our lives with holy devotion.

Is the cost of that ticket too much for you? Don't you want the "best seat" in the house? You don't want to miss Our Lord's arrival when he comes, do you? After all, if he comes while you are going about your daily routines without you even knowing, he may catch you off guard. Or, he may come in disguise looking like a beggar, a prisoner, migrant, refugee, or someone who is lost. Would you be ready to recognize him then? Preparing for the coming of Christ requires a change of mind, heart, and behavior. It is not adequate to simply do the things we always do. We want our lives to speak of the exciting news of Christ's coming and the joy that the Gospel brings. It has to do with our demeanor, values, priorities, choices, and how we structure daily routines. Of course, it involves sacrifice. All anticipations do! Are you excited, captivated, enthusiastic, and sitting on the edge of your seat eager to celebrate his coming among us at Christmas, and waiting for him to come again? If not, why not?

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

We begin the **second week** of the **Advent season**. This season presents us with an invitation and challenge to take some time out of these extremely busy and hectic December days to slow down and be more aware of God's presence in our lives. Years ago, John the Baptist preached this message and encouraged people to listen to his message as he proclaimed and prepared for Jesus' coming. Even in these days of the pandemic, this is a season of anticipation and joy that comes from knowing that God is in our midst. As this season will be quite different from any we have experienced in some time, I encourage you to use this time to allow God to comfort and relieve any anxiety you may have that prevents you from fully entering into the joy this time of year.

As of this writing this past Monday, the New York State Governor's Office continues to designate our area of Chemung County as an "orange zone" for the covid-19 virus, which significantly limits the number of people who can attend public Masses. When this designation will change is not known. We have received a number of inquiries concerning what our Christmas Mass schedule will be. A possible Christmas Mass schedule is printed elsewhere in this bulletin. However, I need to remind you that if local infection rates do not drop enough for the orange zone restrictions to be lifted by Christmas. we will only be able to offer our Christmas Masses through live-stream, as so few people would be able to attend. While this arrangement is far from being an "ideal scenario", I remind you that we are living in unprecedented times due to the Coronavirus. Please check the parish web-site on a regular basis and the bulletin for the next weeks for ay updates for changes.

Now on to a different topic. Many of you may remember the late **Father Joseph F. Hogan**. Father Hogan served as the pastor of **St. Vincent de Paul Church** in **Corning** from 1964-1983. He also served as the first chaplain at **Notre Dame High School** from 1955-1961. Upon his retirement, Father Hogan came to live at **St. Patrick Church, Elmira,** with the then pastor, **Father Daniel F. Holland** and me. When he was assigned to be the homilist for the weekend Masses during the season of Advent, St. Patrick had four weekend Masses, (all parishes in Chemung County had 4-5 weekend Masses in those days). Father Hogan would include the following poem in his homily. I am not sure of the author, but it is entitled, *Promise, My Christmas Pledge*:

- 1. I promise to make my Christmas a holy day with Christ not a holy day without Him.
- 2. I promise to observe Christmas as the birthday of Christ not a day to give and receive just material gifts.
- 3. I promise to remember that the real symbols of Christmas are the Star, the Stable, and the Crib not Santa and his reindeer.

IN OUR PARISH CONTINUED... Tax Advantaged Donation Strategies

In addition to donating with cash or checks, there are other tax beneficial ways that you can donate to St. Mary Our Mother:

If you are over age 72 and you have an IRA retirement account, you may be eligible for a tax benefit called a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). This provision in the tax law allows you to make a distribution from your IRA directly to St. Mary Our Mother. Using the QCD option, you can transfer up to \$100,000 per year to charity and exclude the entire distribution from your gross income for tax purposes. This is a nice tax benefit that allows you to reduce your taxable income for charitable giving, regardless of whether you are otherwise eligible to deduct charitable contributions on your tax return. To use the QCD election, you will need to sign a form provided by your IRA account custodian. On the form you will elect to make the payment payable directly to "St. Mary Our Mother" and you will enter the address as: 816 West Broad Street, Horseheads, NY 14845.

If you have appreciated securities, you may be able to save money on capital gains taxes by donating shares to St. Mary Our Mother. You can transfer stocks, bonds, mutual funds or exchange traded funds (ETF) positions that have appreciated in value directly to our investment account. We can sell the positions for you and use the proceeds. We do not owe capital gains tax on the sale, since we are a qualified non-profit organization. In addition to avoiding capital gains tax on selling the position, you may also be able to deduct the value of the security that you donate, as a charitable contribution. If you hold the appreciated security in a brokerage account, your custodian can provide you with the forms to sign to make the transfer.

If you have any questions, or need any clarification, please let us know. We will do everything we can to accommodate and make the donation as easy as possible. Thank you for your gifts and for all your contributions to St. Mary Our Mother!
