

#### Journeying Through Lent with CRS Rice Bowl

Our 2021 Lenten journey will embrace the Catholic Relief Service (CRS) Rice Bowl initiative. This is a Lenten faith-in-action program that integrates fasting, prayer, and almsgiving. It is an outreach that will serve people in need, globally as well as locally. Seventy-five percent of the donations received go to funding development projects around the world through CRS. This year, the funds will be focused on projects in Madagascar, El Salvador, and Timor Leste. The remaining twenty-five percent will go to the Horseheads Food Pantry

#### What is so special about this Rice Bowl project?

- First it unites the parish in one almsgiving Lenten project with all of us working together to make am impact on poverty.
- Secondly, this project reaches out globally as well as locally. Because Rice Bowl is an international organization, the pooled donations from parishes all over the world go to funding development projects in the needy countries. These include water and sanitation, maternal and child health, micro-finance, education, literacy, and job training. These projects help to promote human dignity, foster self-reliance, further hope, and build peace.

This is a parish-wide project. Our school students and

religious education youth will be participating along with our other families. Look for more information in the bulletin and on our website as to how you can participate this Lent.

## **Public Policy Advocacy Weekend:** Funding for Nourish New York Initiative

Nourish New York is a New York State initiative that provides funding to Food Banks to purchase New York State produced farm products. This accomplishes two goals: it offers market support to farmers, the fishing community, and food processors who have been impacted by the economic effects of the pandemic, while getting high-quality food to individuals and families across the state through the regional food banks to local parish and community food pantries. The initiative provided \$35 million in funding from May 1 to December 31, 2020. Four thousand one hundred fifty-two farms have provided over 17 million pounds of high-quality New York produced food to New Yorkers in need.
