FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Any good teacher or parent will tell you that once a lesson is really learned it doesn't need to be taught again. When we internalize things we have learned, they become a part of who we are and influence how we perceive and interact with our world. The same is true for the law God has written upon our hearts. Once humanity learns this lesson, we will simply know it to be true and act accordingly. Sometimes, it is hard to get people to learn the lessons they need to learn. They are often distracted, disinterested, conflicted, misdirected, or just too stubborn and unable or unwilling to see what is right before their eyes. Understanding that God is in a loving and committed relationship with those fashioned and formed in God's own image, seems like such a simple lesson to learn. But history and experience has proven that it is not.

We struggle with faith, especially when that faith asks us to learn something very particular about ourselves. We must, like a grain of wheat, fall to the ground and die. Because God's DNA is at the very core of who we are, there are specific pearls of wisdom that must be acquired before we can live a full life. One very powerful lesson is that it is not the task of the world to tell us who we are and what has meaning, but God. For many, death is not an opportunity for greater life but a permanent ending to the life they have known. Jesus knew every dimension to what it means to be fully human because he was! He knows the joys, limitations, sorrows, frustrations, wonders, suffering, opportunities, and joys of the human experience. Jesus can teach us a wealth of knowledge and life's lessons from his example, especially obedience.

When we accept the law God has placed in our hearts and gain wisdom from it, then when we suffer we learn to listen more attentively to the Voice behind that law. We naturally flee to our Creator for inspiration, consolation, hope, direction, and comfort as we navigate through this time of darkness. We will not need to run from it, subdue it, fight it, or be overcome by it because we will know, having internalized this profound lesson before, that God will bring new life. God's law is love and love never fails.

PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

Recently, I came across a copy of the pastoral letter on the Eucharist written by Cardinal Joseph **Tobin** of the Archdiocese of Newark, New Jersey. This pastoral letter, written to the people of the archdiocese voiced the Archbishop's concerns about the pandemic and its effects on the celebration of the Eucharist. Cardinal Tobin writes: "When church historians write about the year of the Lord 2020, I predict they will call particular attention to the 'Great Eucharistic Fast.'" As we are all well aware, with the Covid 19 virus spreading so rapidly, it was necessary to close churches and the Eucharist was not celebrated publicly. Churches throughout our own diocese have reopened, thank God, but we still must take effective measures to make sure that a safe environment is provided for those who come to Mass.

Cardinal Tobin and many other church leaders are concerned about the long-term effects of separation from the Eucharist by so many. "Will some of us prefer virtual worship, if we worship at all?" shares his thoughts about this predicament. He tells the story of who during the first four months of the lockdown, he was not able to visit his mother, who is in her nineties and lives in southwestern Ontario, near the United States - Canadian border. They were able to talk on the telephone and saw each other "virtually" via Zoom calls, but were not able to meet in person. He recalls that when he was finally able to travel during the summer and visit his mother in person at her home, he realized how much he had missed her and how difference it was to sit across the same table and share a cup of tea. Cardinal Tobin acknowledged the truth of the axiom, "Absence makes the heart grow fonder." His love for his mother had always been strong, but it deepened as he had been prevented from being physically close to her. When the day came that they were reunited, it was an occasion of great joy!

He compares this experience to what many Catholics have experienced during this pandemic. "One of the greatest blessings of our faith is our deeply held conviction that our Lord is truly present in the Eucharist." In receiving the Eucharist, we become what we receive. This connection cannot be done "virtually". Hopefully, this day will come soon, when we will all be reunited once again at the table of the Lord with each other for the great Eucharist feast.

On the front page of today's bulletin is the schedule for our Holy Week liturgies. I ask that you call the parish office to register for the liturgies of Holy Week and Easter. Compliance to the Covid-19 restrictions - the wearing of masks, social distancing of at least 6 feet from each other, limited church seating - are still in effect. Please call the parish office to register for the liturgies of Palm Sunday, the Sacred Triduum, and Easter Sunday. All reservations need to be received by **Wednesday**, **March 31st.**

SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

Question: What is spiritual communion, and do you need to be in a state of grace to receive it?

Answer: The practice of making a "spiritual communion" dates back several centuries and St. Thomas Aquinas described it as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Holy Sacrament and a loving embrace as though we had already received Him."

Traditionally, a prayer of spiritual communion has been used by those who are unable to receive sacramental communion because of health, inability to attend Mass, or who cannot receive communion because of grave sin. This practice has been encouraged by many saints and spiritual writers and most recently Pope Francis encouraged the practice when the realities of the COVID-19 pandemic prevented so many Catholics from taking part in the Mass or receiving sacramental communion.

Although the graces offered in spiritual communion are not the same as those offered in the sacramental communion of the Mass, this practice is still a powerful opportunity to express our desire for union with the Lord and to be united with Christ and the Church, even in an imperfect way.
