#### THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

We often act out of ignorance. Armed with the best of intentions, we think we are seeing clearly and correctly, but we are not. We don't always understand the full meaning of things and only perceive part of the truth. Hence, our judgments and actions can be impaired by myopic, incomplete or erroneous perceptions. The meaning of life, understanding of human experience, and negotiating life's challenges can all become skewed without proper understanding and vision. The resurrection of Christ is the corrective to our incomplete and limited view of life. Looking at things with the eyes of faith brings a depth of clarity and understanding to how we see God, ourselves, others, and the world.

Even the disciples struggled with their limited understanding and ignorant perceptions. It was only when Jesus opened their minds to understand the Scriptures that their eyes were opened. It was their "aha" moment when everything clicked. We all want the substance of our lives to come together, make sense, and have meaning. This is easier to achieve when things are going positively, and life is good. It is when suffering, disappointment, death, hardship, and injustice enter the picture that things can become unsettled and disoriented. Our faith in the goodness and love of God is tested. We tend to shift our focus on these difficult and challenging moments and do not see them within the greater picture of how God intends life to unfold. We can gain, from the passion and resurrection of Christ, the clear vision we need in order to move away from ignorance to enlightenment.

We need our "aha" moment when everything comes together and clicks. It can come in a fleeting instant when we feel totally connected with God, where we find ourselves, others and all of creation. It is a moment when all is right and good, regardless of how difficult our journey. Our "aha" moment assures us that God is here, right with us, in us and around us bringing us a gift and blessing we can receive nowhere else: peace. In those brief sacramental encounters when we are lifted up out of ourselves and centered, we can hear God say, "peace be with you," and we feel secure. It's all okay. The resurrected Christ has the power to bring this gift to us. ©LPi

#### PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

One of the monthly themes that was brought to my attention last month was that the month of March was **Women's History Awareness Month.** That theme caused me to remember the women from the United States whom the church has declared saints. Do you know who was the first to be canonized a saint, or the first American born saint? There are eight women who are canonized saints, who were citizens of the United States, or who worked in our country. These are listed as they appear on the calendar:

January 4 — **Elizabeth Ann Bayley Seton** (1774-1821): A wife, mother of five, founder of the Sisters of Charity in the United States, who laid the foundation for the Catholic school system, opened orphanages, and cared for the poor. She is the first U.S. born saint.

January 23 — Marianne Cope (1838-1918): A Sister of St. Francis of Syracuse, New York, who helped found St. Joseph Hospital, and for 35 years cared for the lepers on Molokai Island.

March 3 — **Katherine Drexel (1858-1955):** Philadelphia heiress who founded the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament dedicated to the education of Black and Native American children, and established Xavier University in New Orleans; a powerful advocate for justice for the poor and oppressed.

July 14 — **Kateri Tekakwitha** (1656-1680): Native American who was orphaned at age 4, disabled by small pox, baptized at 20. She was mocked and persecuted for her disabilities and her Christian faith among her own people. She lived an exemplary life of prayer and holiness with perseverance and charity.

October 3 — **Theodora Guerin (1798-1856):** She came from France at the request of the Bishop of Vincennes, Indiana, and founded the Sisters of Providence of St. Mary of the Woods. She established schools, orphanages, and even a pharmacy. She repeatedly resisted the Bishop's attempts to control the rules and ministry of her order, eventually locking her in her room and excommunicating her. All was resolved when Rome asked for and received the bishop's resignation.

October 6 — Marie Rose Durocher (1811-1849): She came to this country from Canada and founded the American branch of the Sisters of the Holy Name of Jesus and Mary, and was an educator of poor and orphaned children, especially girls.

November 13 — Frances Xavier Cabrini (1850-1917): She came to America to minister to Italian immigrants, and founded 67 schools and other charities in New York, Chicago, and South America. She was the first citizen of this country to be canonized.

#### **Pastor's Perspective (continued)**

November 18 — Rose Philippine Duchesne (1769-1852): She was born in France, and upon arriving in New Orleans, founded the U.S. chapter of the Religious of the Sacred Heart, founding schools and orphanages along the Mississippi River for Native American Children.

All of these women's lives speak eloquently of how one's faith can bring vitality to our diverse nation.

Another person who came to mind during Women's History Awareness month was **Kim Ng.** Kim is currently the general manager of the Miami Marlins, and the highest-ranking female major league baseball executive. She is the first woman to serve as general manager of a team in the Big Four Leagues in North America, and the first person of Asian descent to serve as general manager of a major league baseball team. In her career path, she served as assistant general manager of the Dodgers from 2002-2011, and later became an executive vice-president for the league. As a result of her hard work, steadfastness, dedication, and with God's grace, like many of the women saints mentioned earlier, has helped her to realize her dream.

#### A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

An underlying lesson from all three readings this weekend is that the Risen Christ has wiped away our sins, not only for individuals, but throughout the world and its history. The terrible power of sin has now been reversed and our coming to perfection through the love of God is part of the Easter experience. As stewards of God's love we are called to participate in Christ's redemptive activity. The steward questions for us are many: How do we resist injustice at home or in the workplace? How do we confront violence in our language and attitudes? How do we bring Christ to others?

#### ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

When circumstances prevent one from attending Mass and receiving Holy Communion, such as watching live stream Masses, it is possible to make an *Act of Spiritual Communion*, which is a source of grace.

Spiritual Communion is "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament and lovingly embrace Him" when one cannot receive Him in sacramental Communion (St. Thomas Aquinas).

The most common reason for making an Act of Spiritual Communion is when a person cannot attend Mass.

Acts of Spiritual Communion increase our desire to receive sacramental Communion and help us avoid the sins that would make us unable to receive Holy Communion worthily.

#### **Prayer for Spiritual Communion**

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.

I love you above all things and I desire to receive You in my soul.

Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You.

Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.
